

Spokane is the 3<sup>rd</sup> largest DMA in the Pacific Northwest, and also ranks as the:

- 66<sup>th</sup> largest DMA in the nation
- 85<sup>th</sup> largest CBSA, with an adult population of over 425,600





**How to read:** There are 899,400 adults 18+ in the Spokane DMA. Of that total, 353,300 (39%) have read any newspaper in the past week.

In Spokane & Kootenai Counties, there are 498,500 adults 18+, of which nearly 204,400 (41%) have read a newspaper in the past week.
