Pending is the United States' Motion to detain. Mr. Yuill is a Canadian citizen and a resident of British Columbia, Canada. He maintains close contact with his mother and monthly contact with his brothers. No one from his family was present at the bail hearing. Defendant does not have a criminal history. It is alleged and argued that since defendant has lost 38 kilograms of cocaine, it will present problems if he is to return to the location alleged to be a site of the alleged unlawful conduct. In addition, Defendant maintains that his former employer can assist with a bond. However, the United States alleges that the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) are investigating that individual relevant to the pending charges.

At this time, the undersigned is unable to conclude there is a sufficiently structured release plan to reasonably assure that Defendant would appear for court dates or to reasonably assure he ORDER GRANTING THE UNITED STATES' MOTION FOR DETENTION - 1

will be supervisable. Typically, if a Defendant is a citizen from outside the United States, there is strong family support present at the bail hearing with reasonable assurances the family can assist with supervision and with facilitating an individual's return for court dates. In addition, any funds proffered to support a bond may not be tainted by allegations that the moneys are fruits of unlawful activity.

The United States' Motion to detain (Ct. Rec. 4) is GRANTED without prejudice to revisiting should circumstances so dictate.
