At the November 16, 2009, hearing on Defendant's uncontested Motion for Furlough, the United States was represented by Assistant U.S. Attorney Aine Ahmed; the Defendant was present with Assistant Federal Defender Kimberly Deater.

Defendant has a lengthy and significant criminal history, including 75 failures to appear. While the United States does not oppose the furlough request, the U.S. Probation Office does not recommend furlough. Defendant's Motion (**Ct. Rec. 143**) is **GRANTED in part** as follows:

Defendant may be released to two sworn law enforcement officers, prepaid and off-duty, at **10:00 a.m. Thanksgiving Day morning, November 26, 2009**, who shall accompany Defendant to his mother's home in Spokane (address to be supplied to Pretrial Services at least two days prior to release) for Thanksgiving dinner and return Defendant to Spokane County Jail no later than **3:00 p.m. on the same day**. The law enforcement officers shall remain in the

1 home throughout the time that Defendant is present. There shall be
2 no alcohol in the home and no unlawful controlled substances,
3 firearms or ammunition.

4 Defendant shall not commit any offense in violation of federal,
5 state or local law. Defendant shall sign and complete form A.O.
6 199C before being released and shall remain at the address furnished
7 during his furlough.
