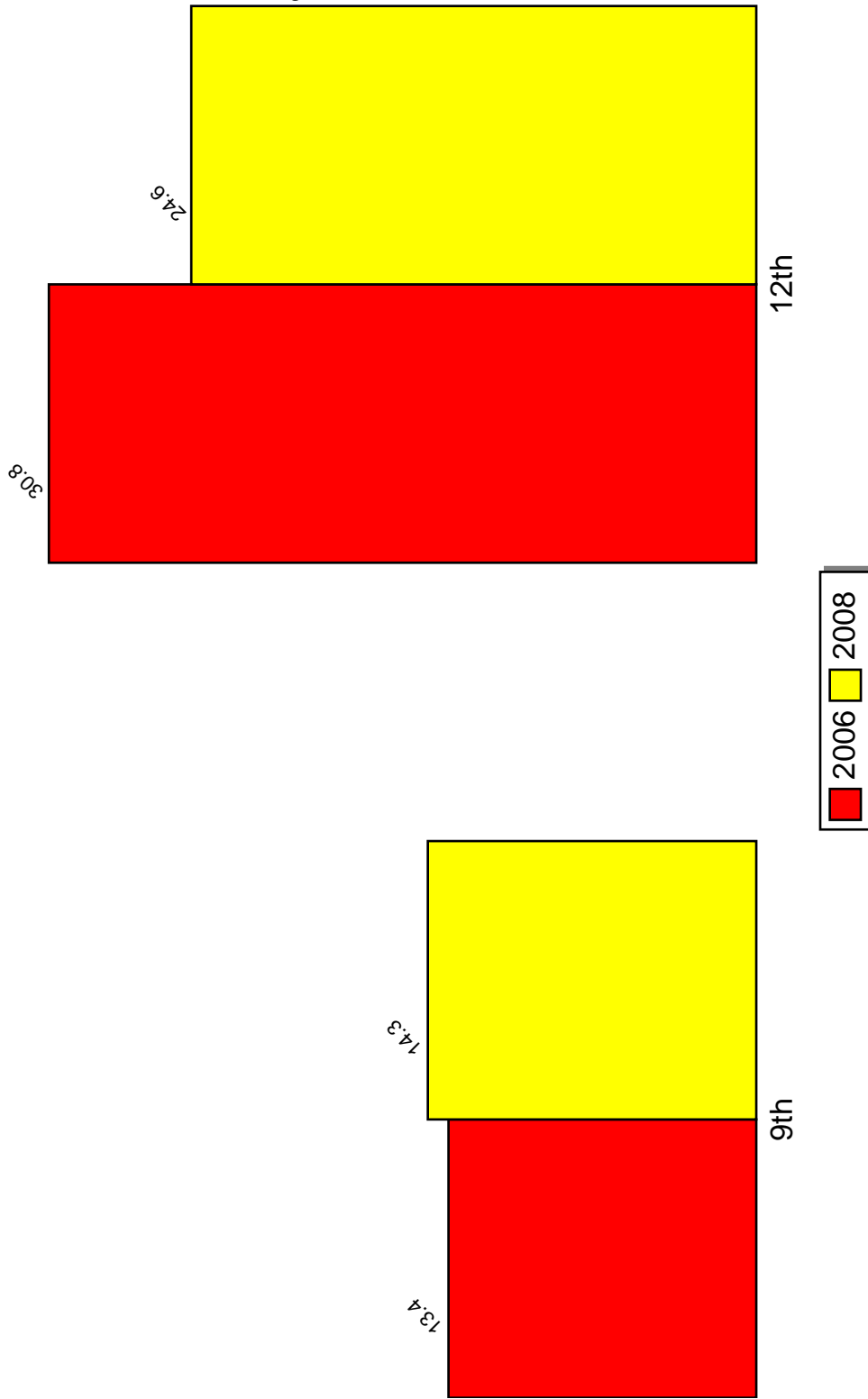

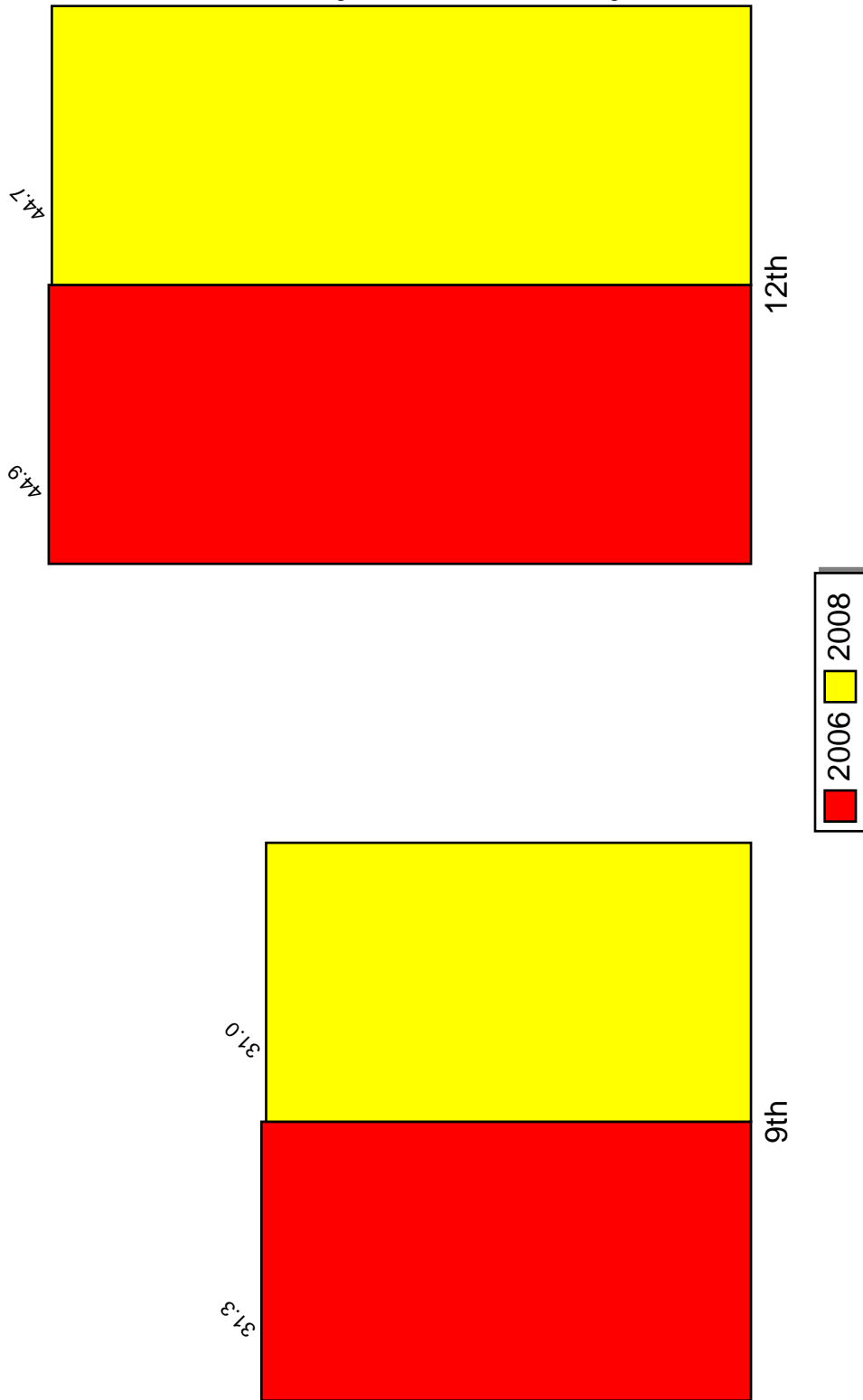
Figure 1: Lifetime Use of Smokeless Tobacco



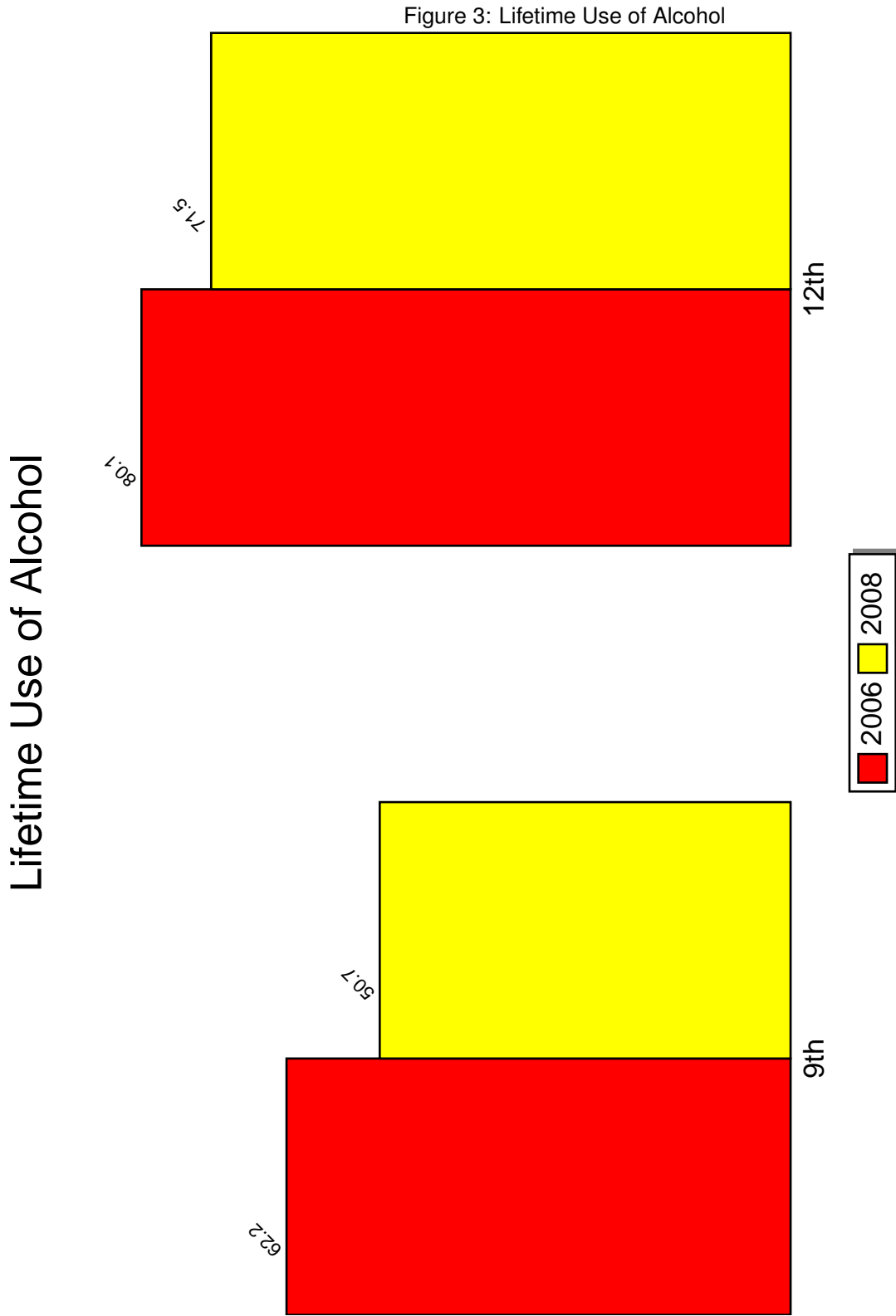

Figure 2: Lifetime Use of Cigarettes

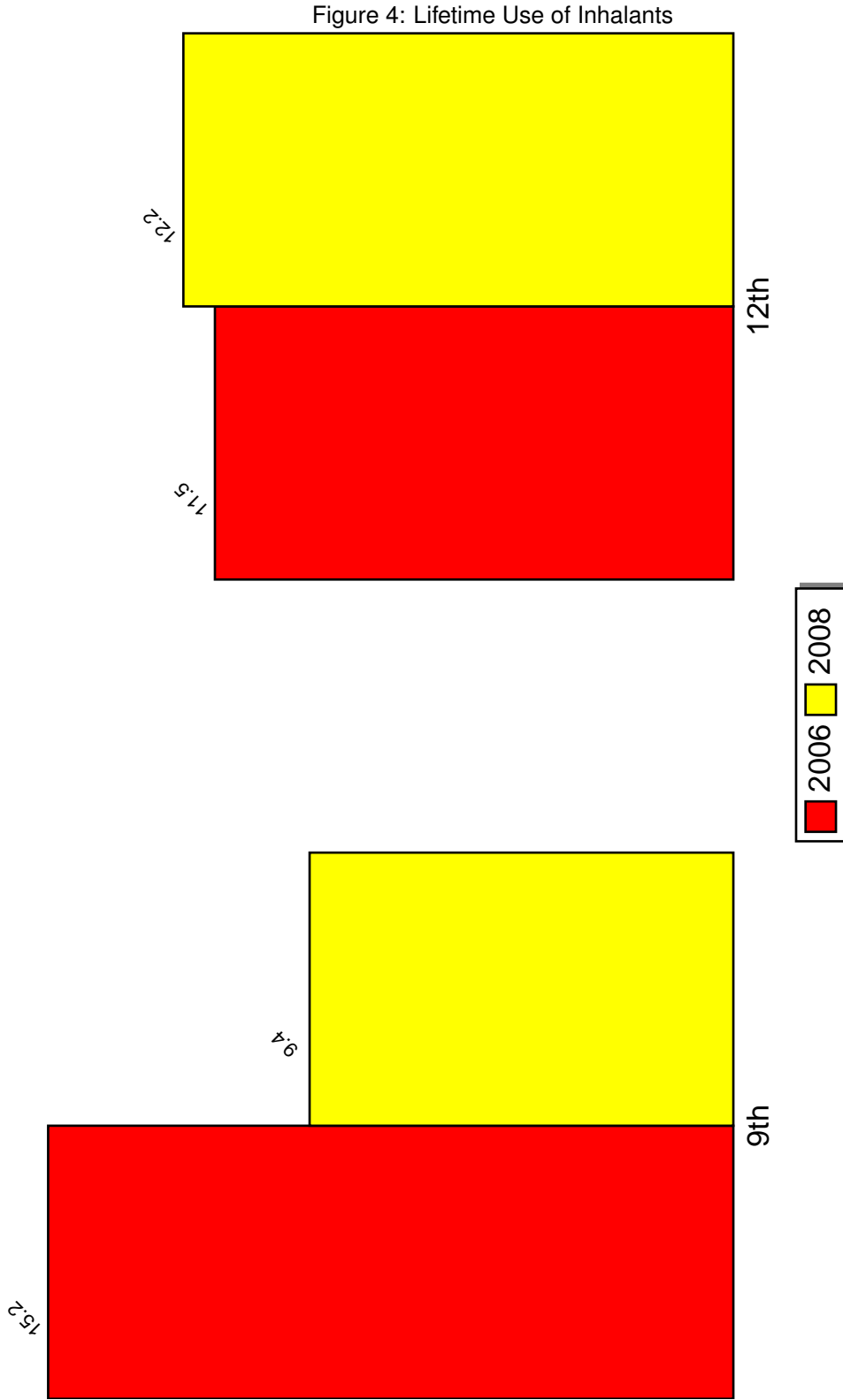

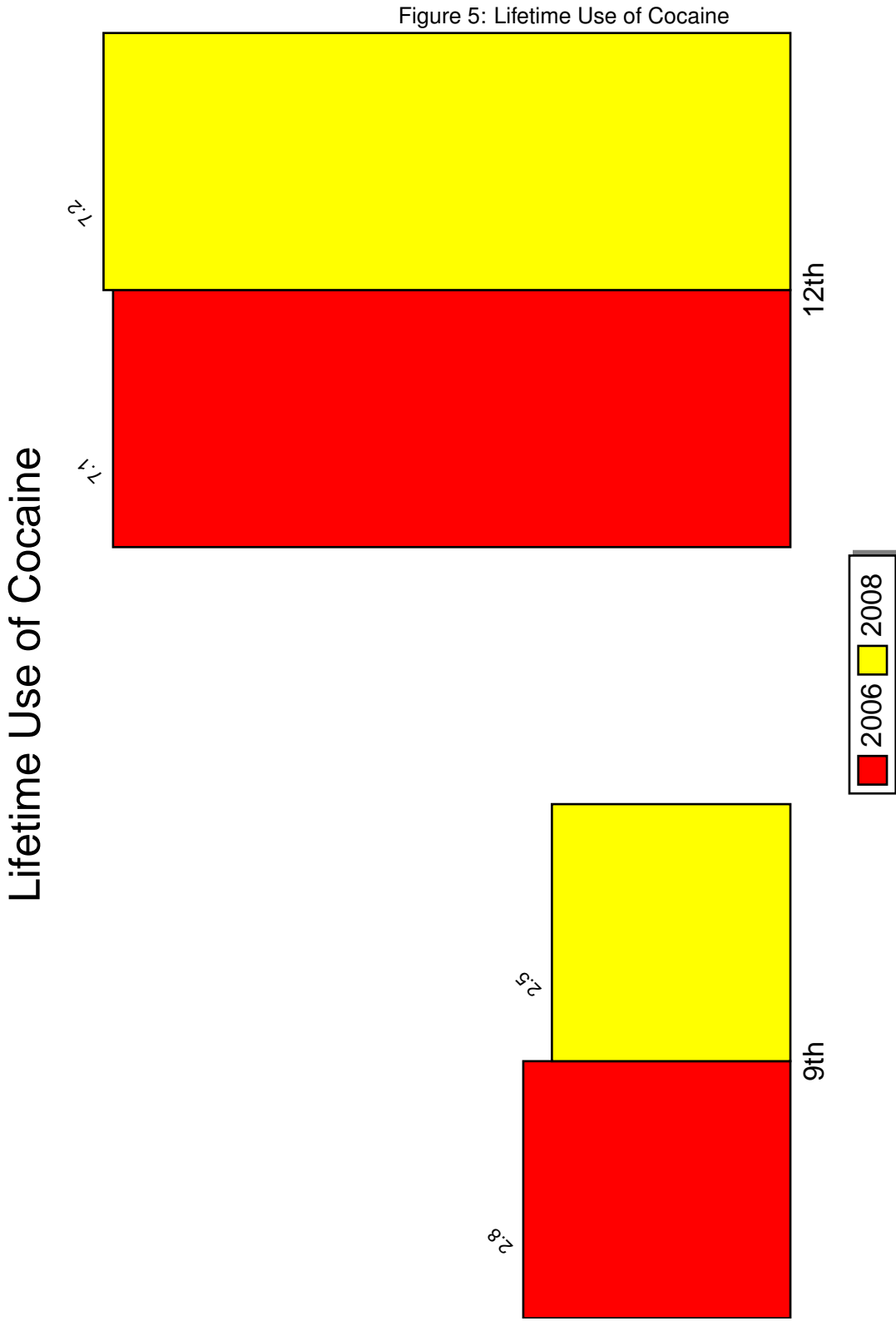

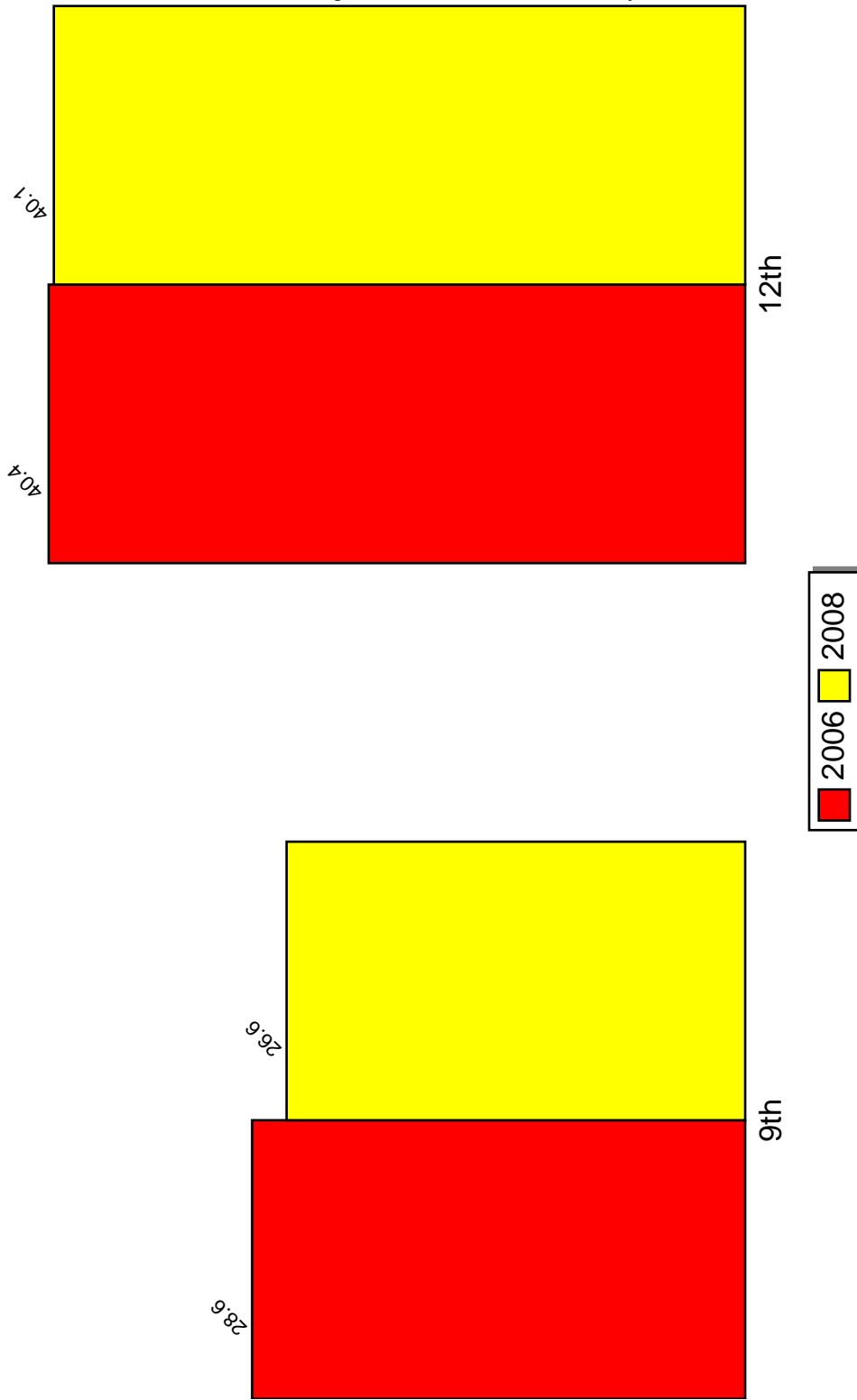

Figure 6: Lifetime Use of Marijuana

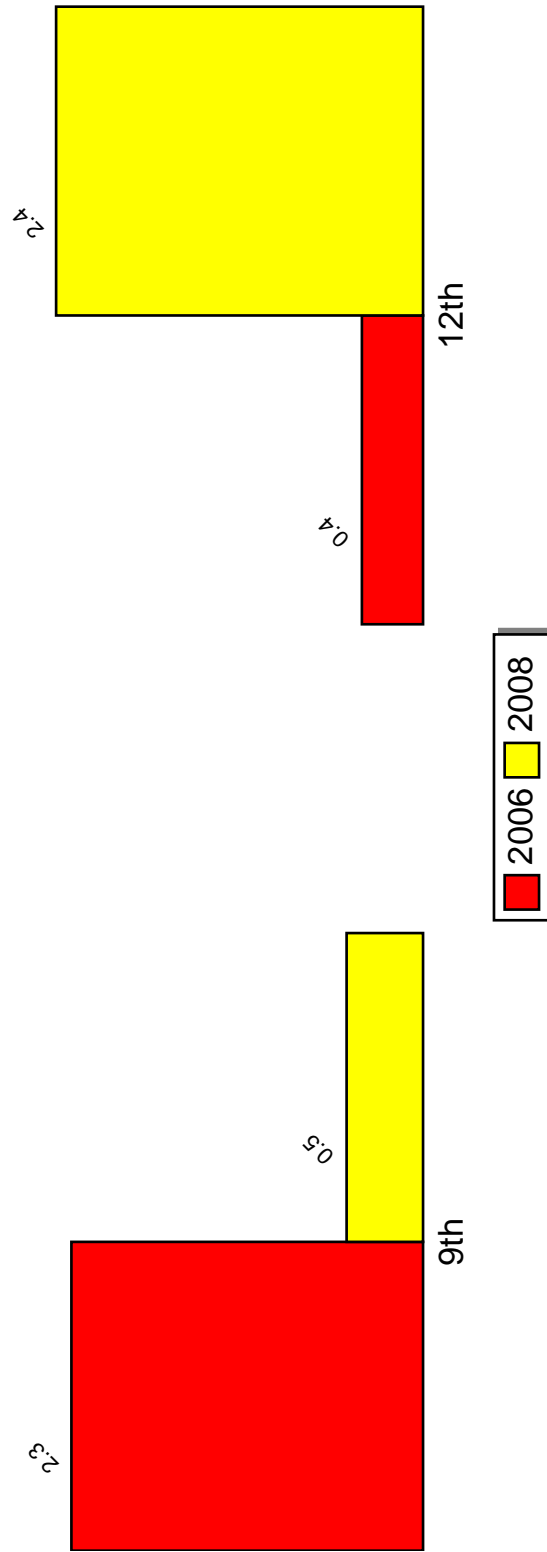

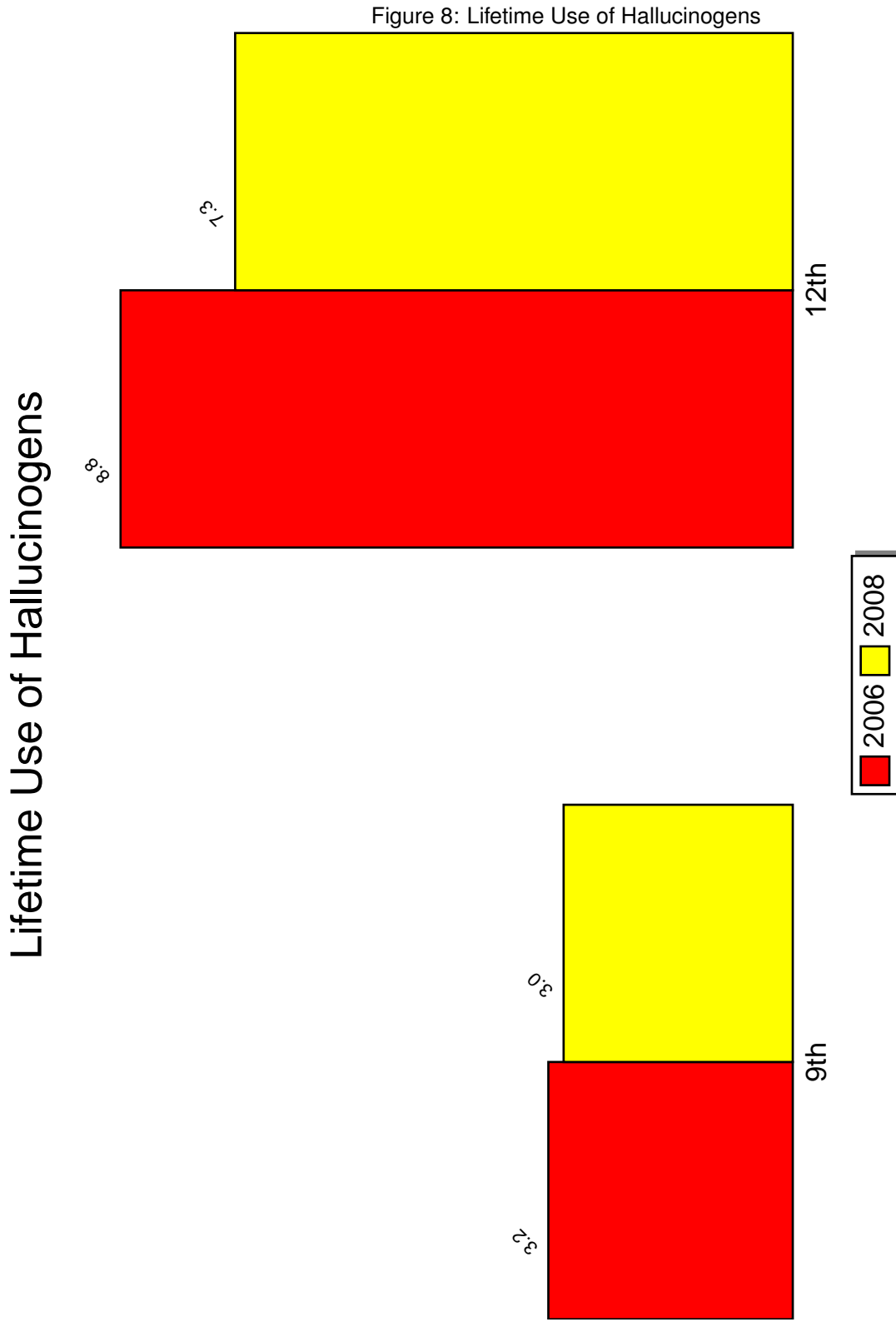

Figure 7: Lifetime Use of Heroin



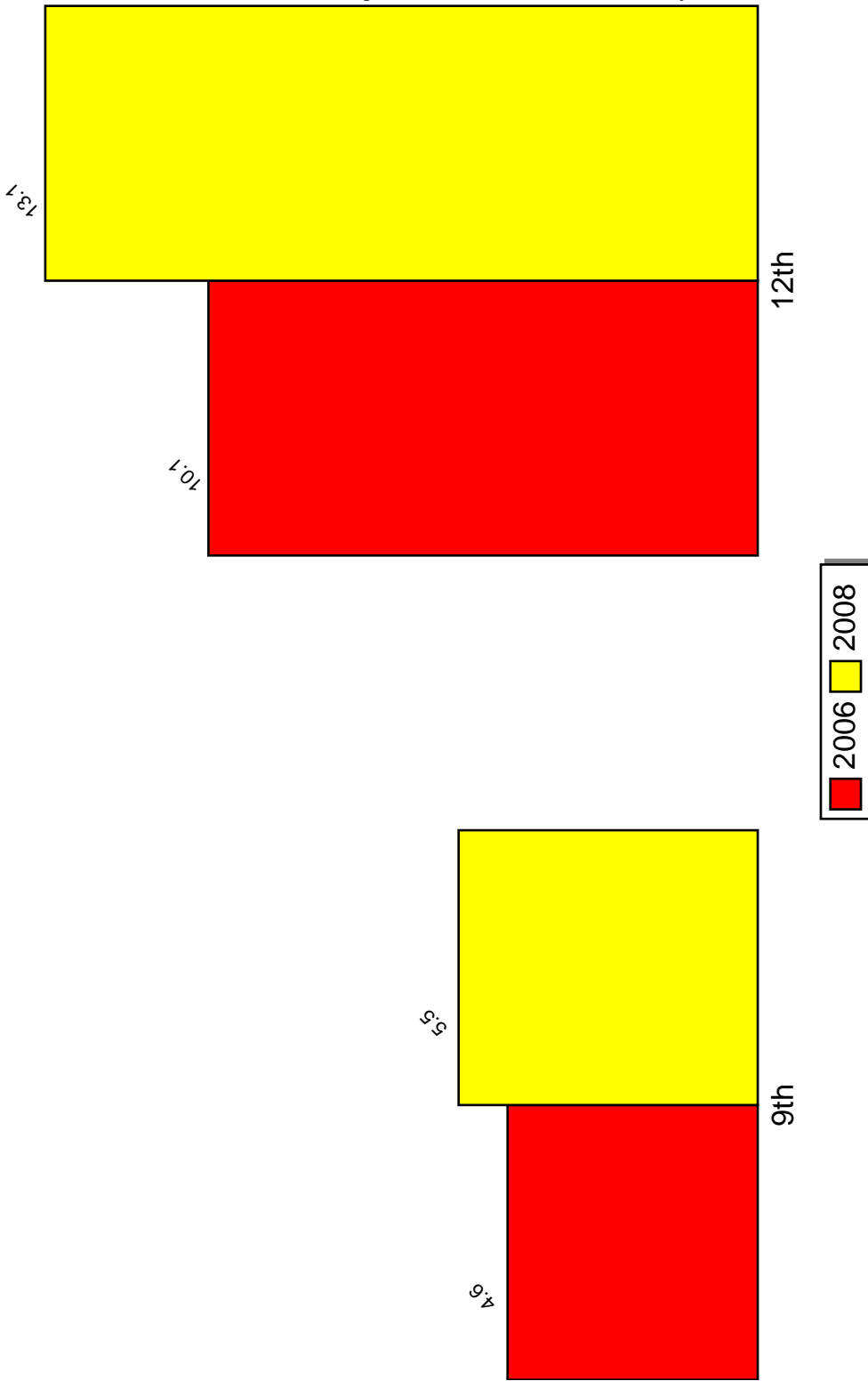

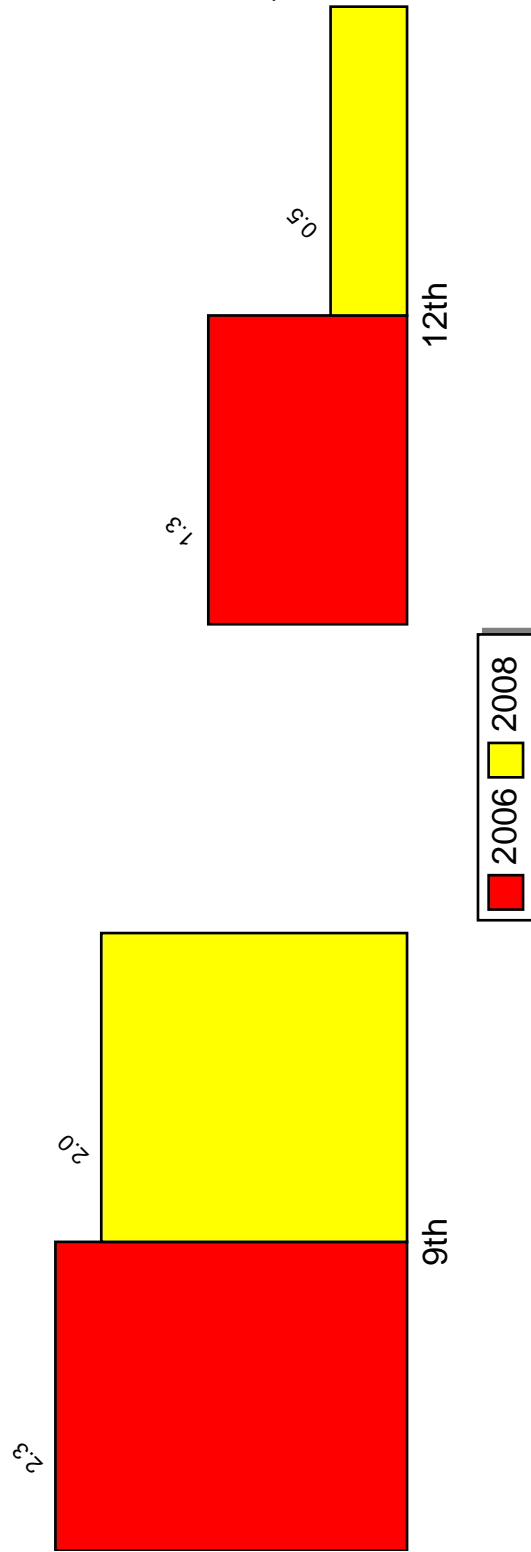
Figure 9: Lifetime Use of Ecstasy

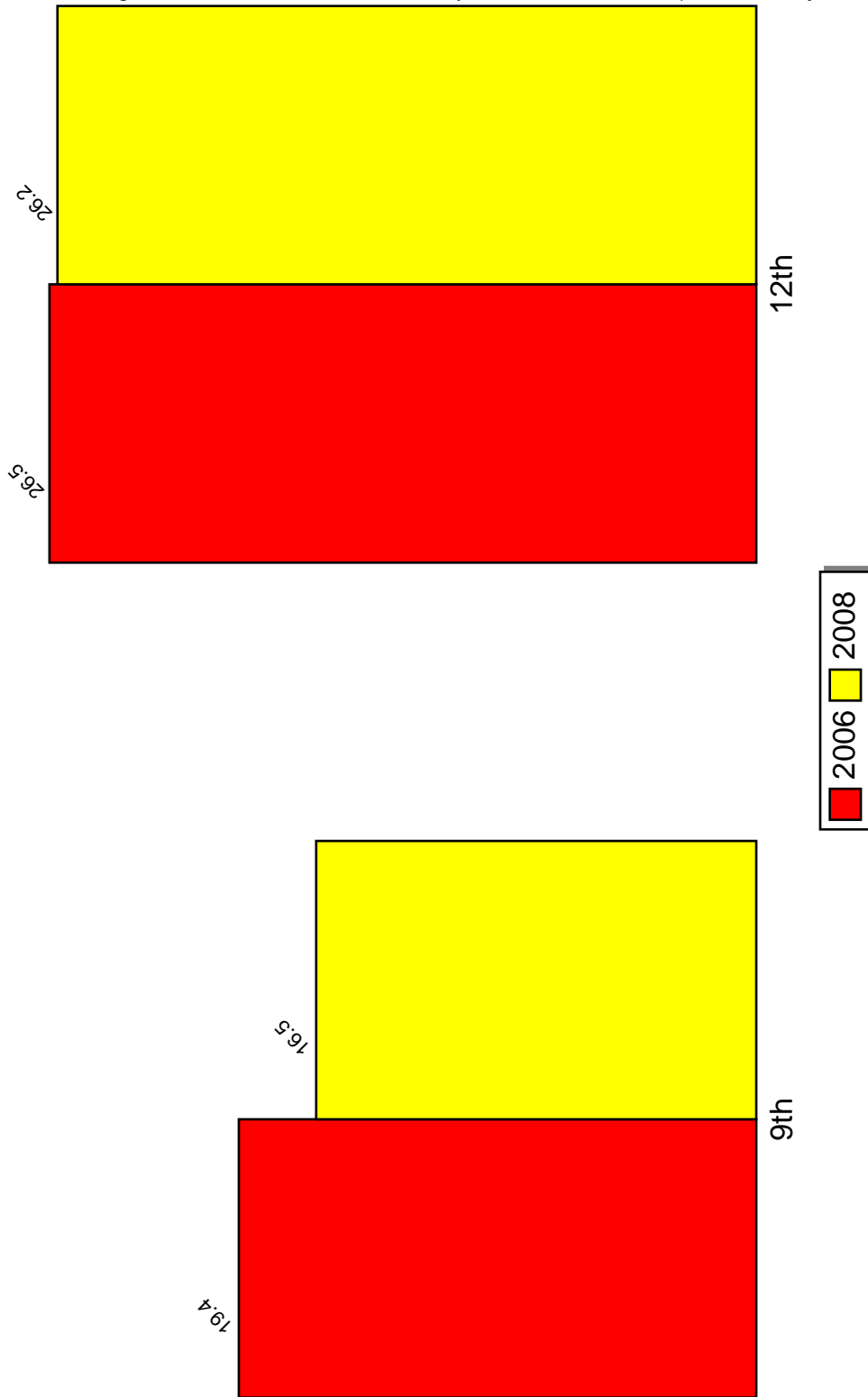
Figure 10: Lifetime Use of Methamphetamines

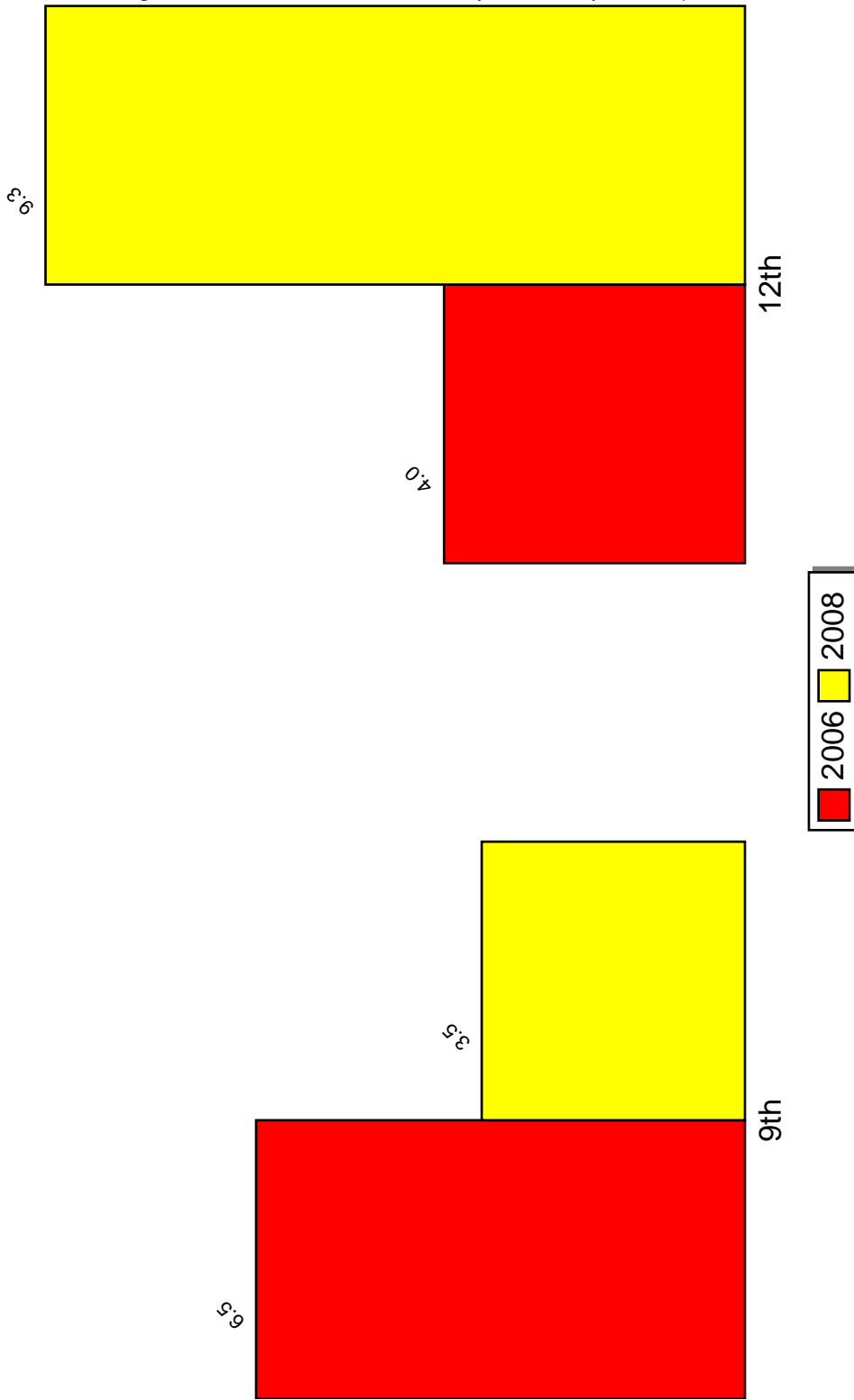
Figure 11: Lifetime Use of Prescription Pain Relievers (Vicodin, Oxycontin, ...)

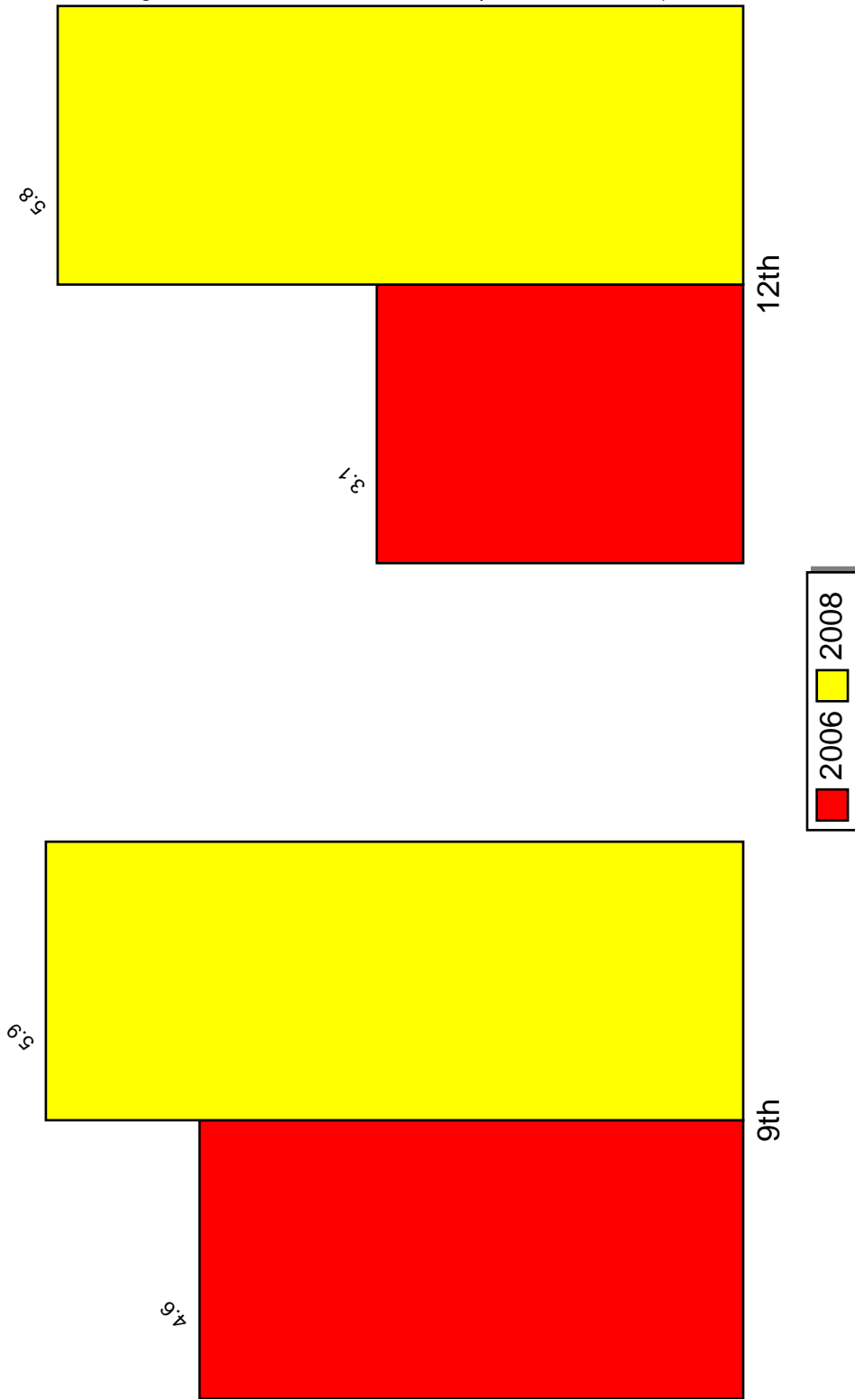
Figure 12: Lifetime Use of Prescription Tranquilizers (Xanax, Valium, ...)

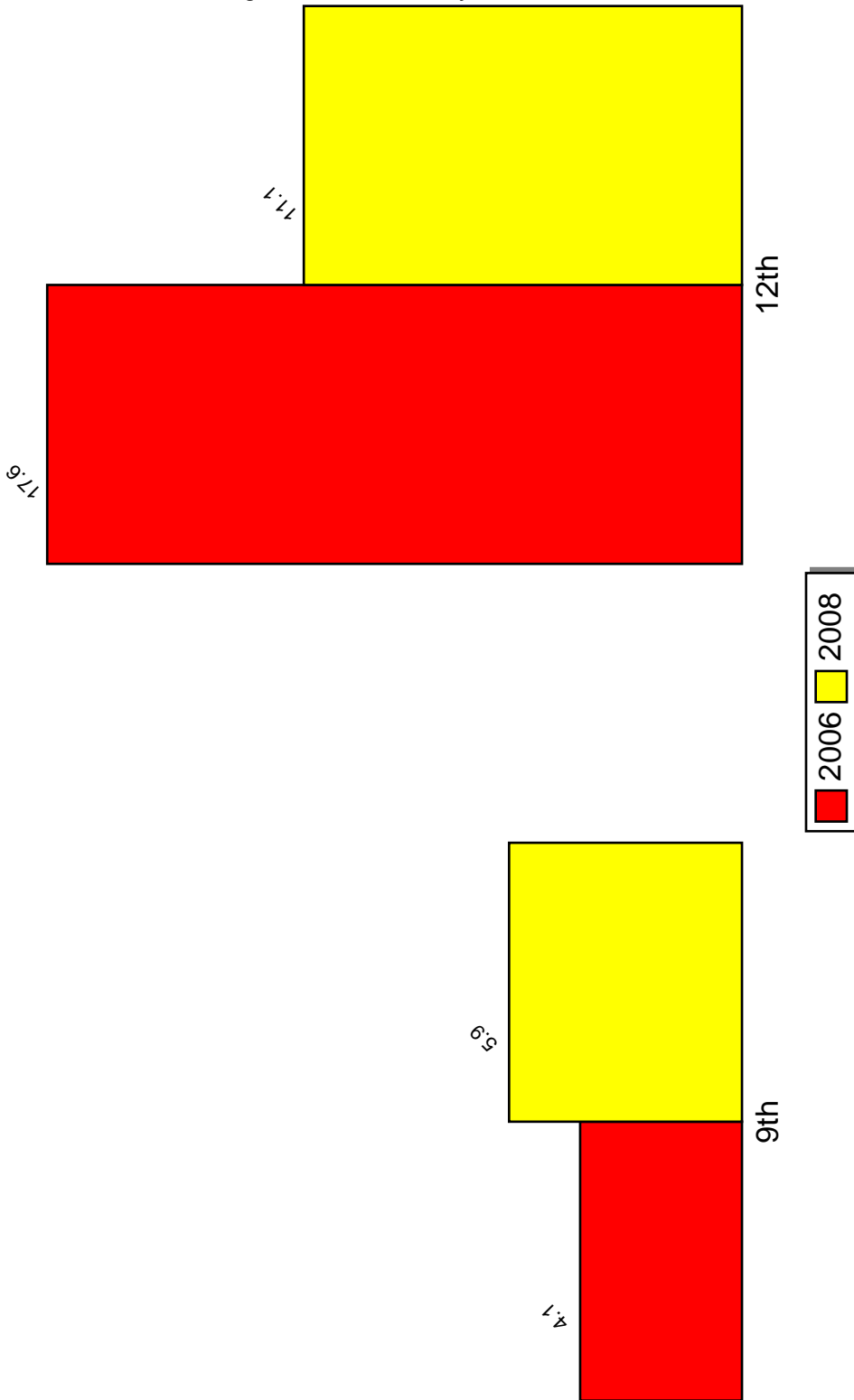
Figure 13: Lifetime Use of Prescription Stimulants (Ritalin, Adderall, ...)

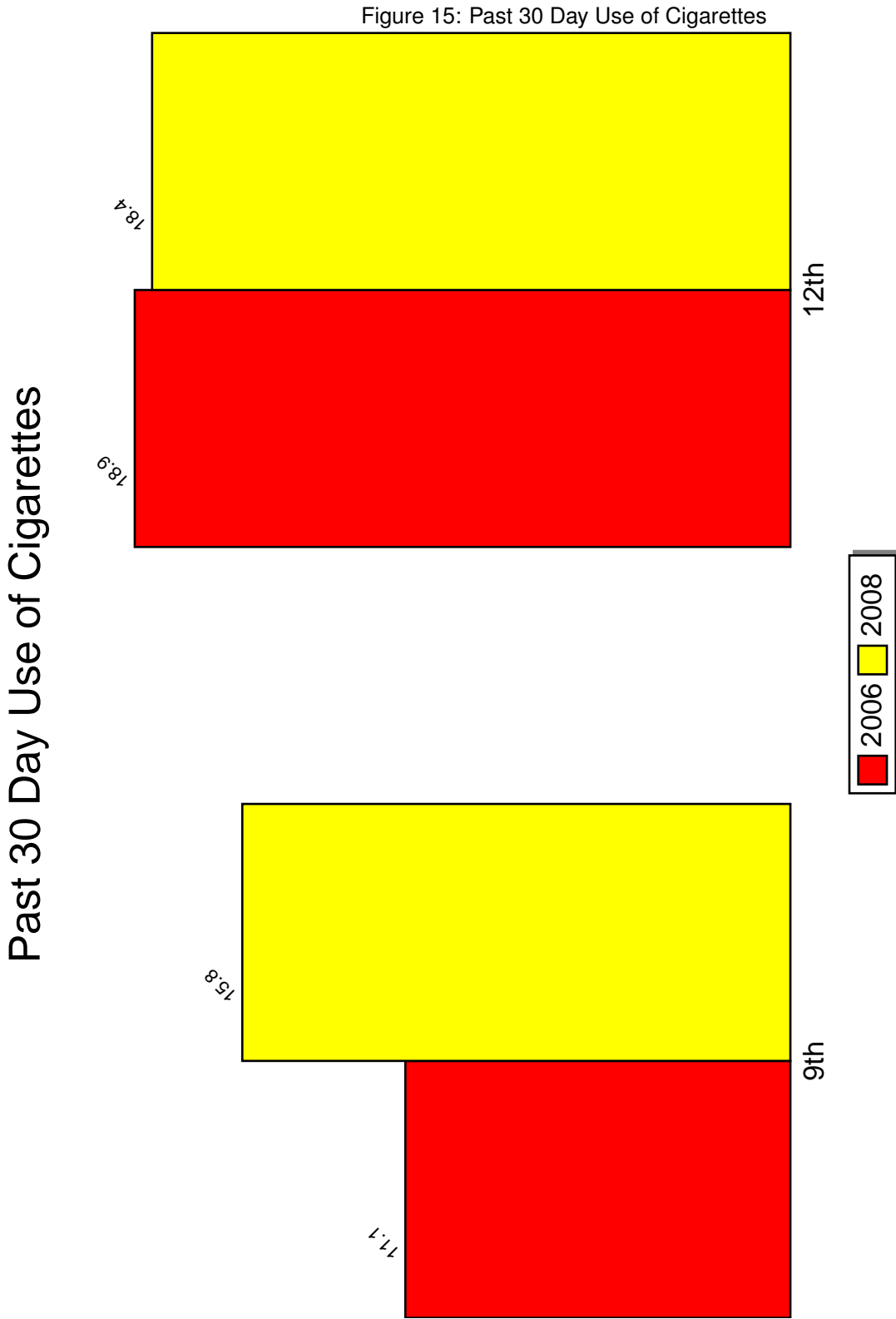

Figure 14: Past 30 Day Use of Smokeless Tobacco

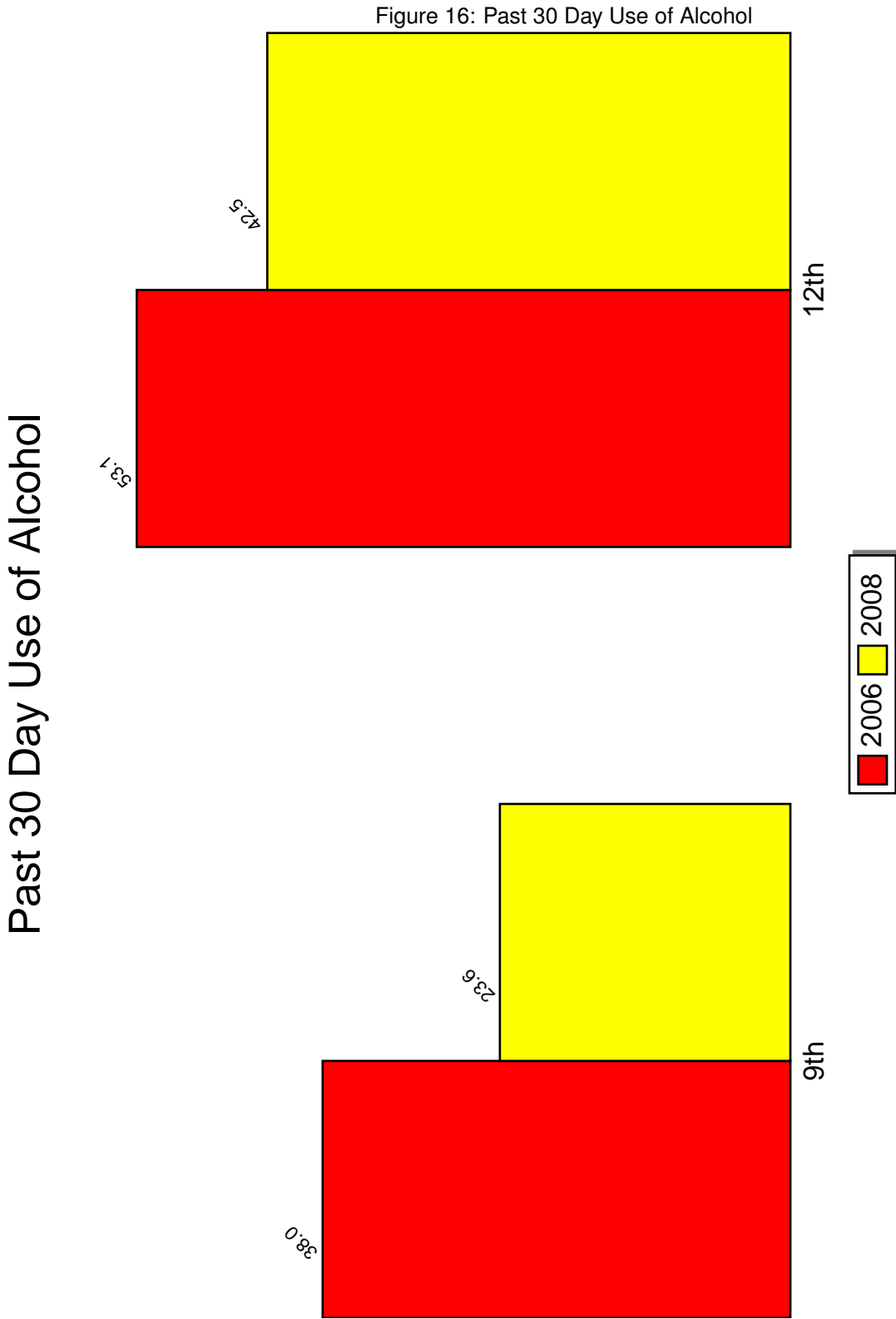

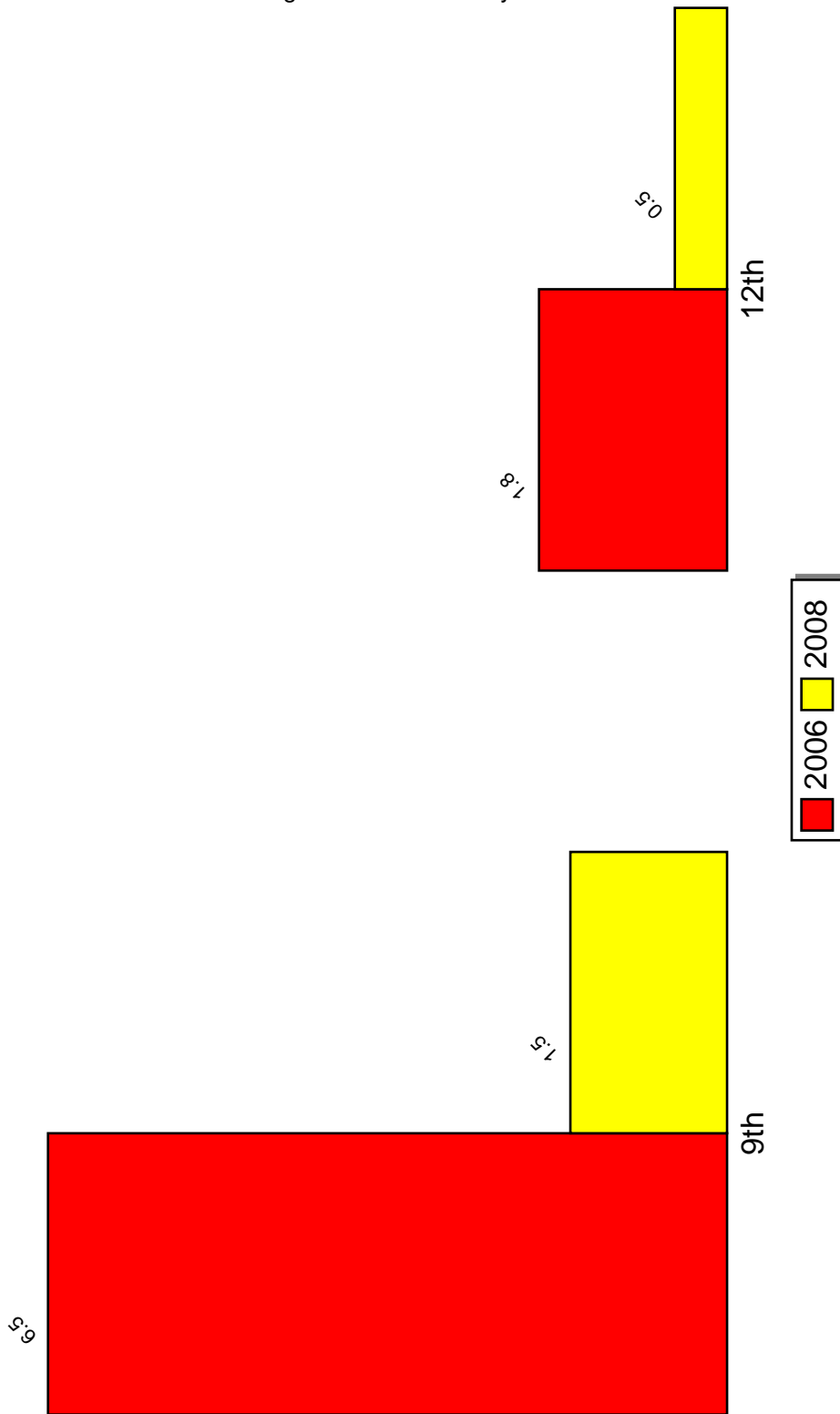

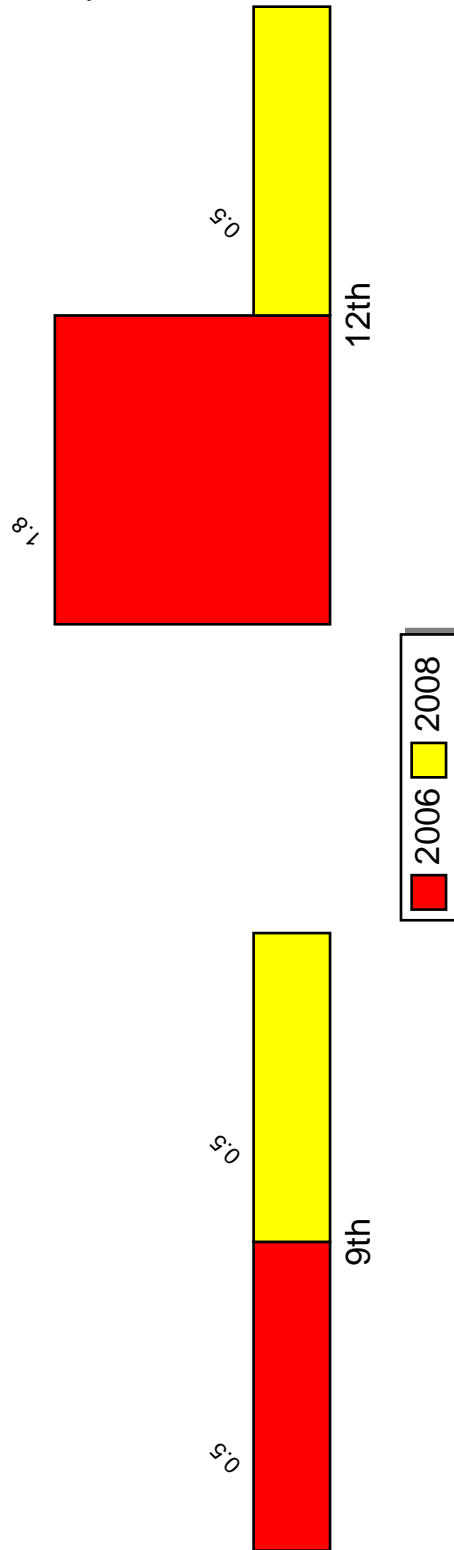
Figure 17: Past 30 Day Use of Inhalants

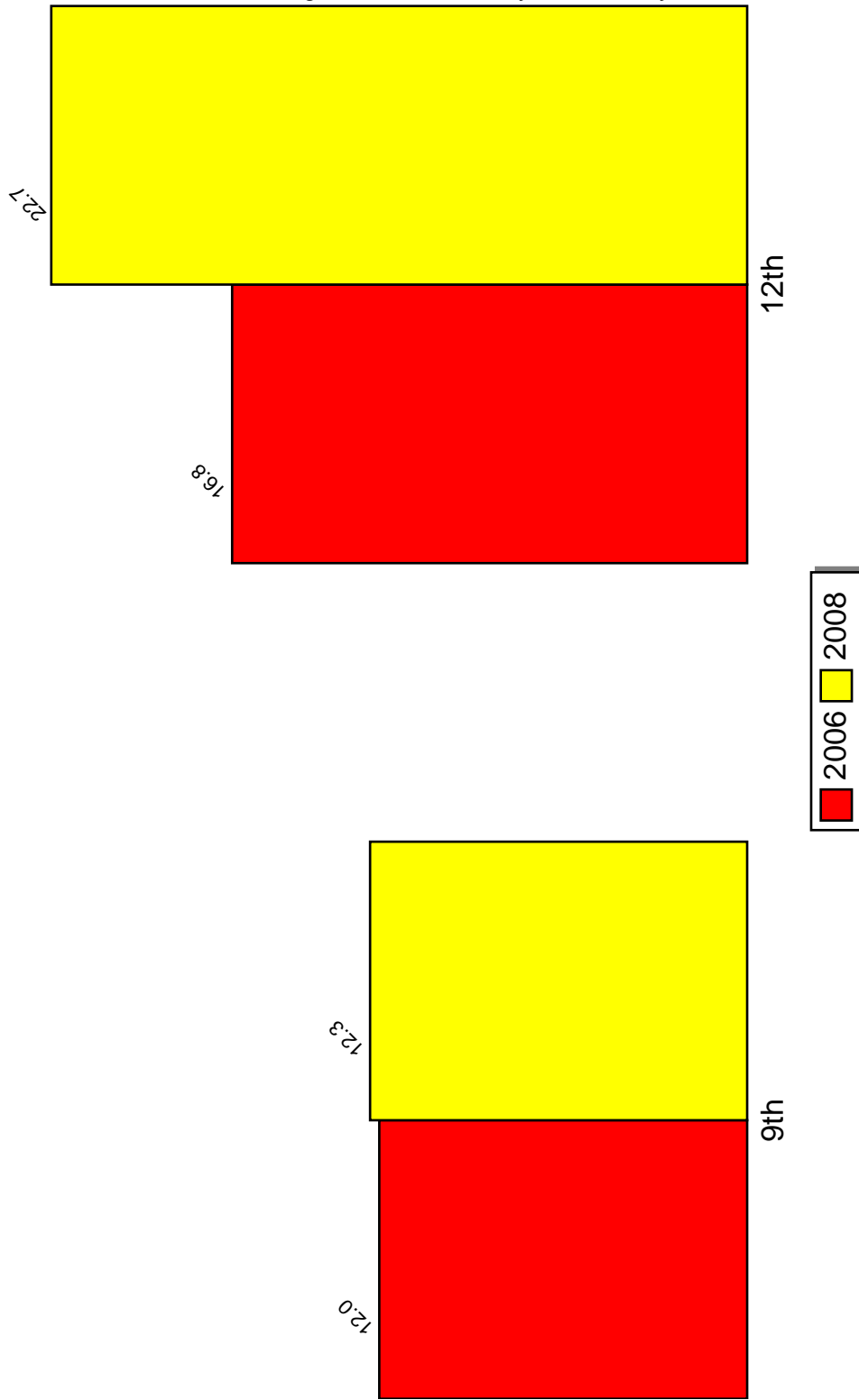
Figure 18: Past 30 Day Use of Cocaine

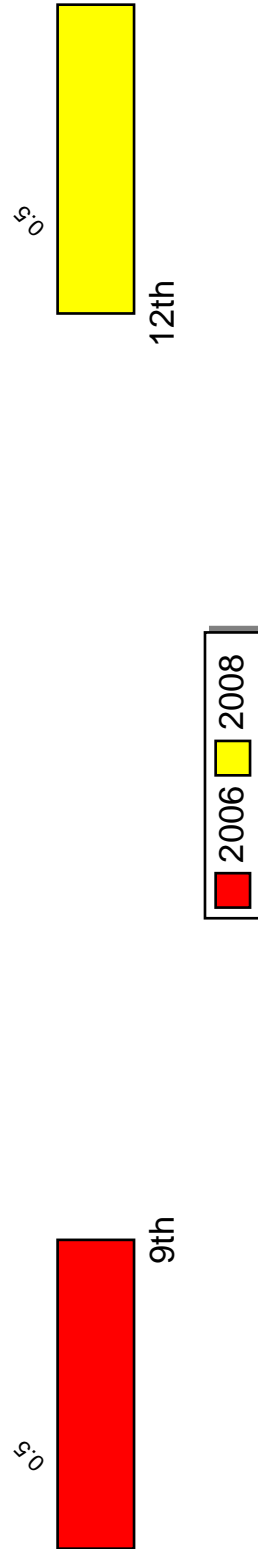
Figure 19: Past 30 Day Use of Marijuana

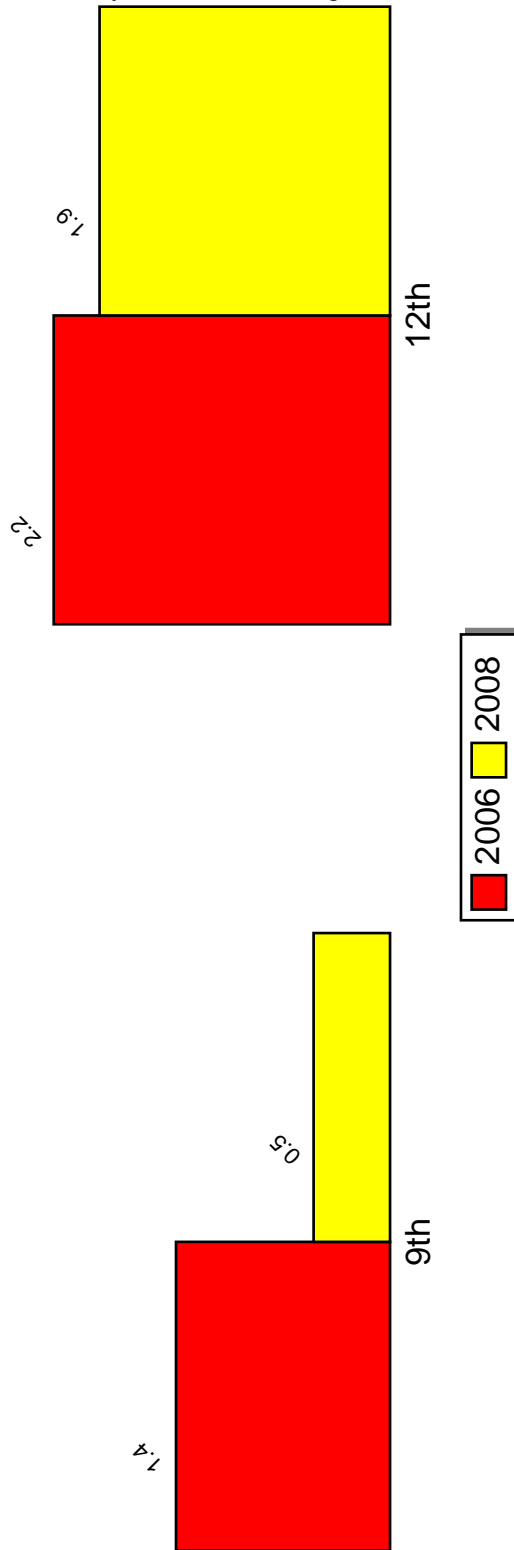
Figure 20: Past 30 Day Use of Heroin

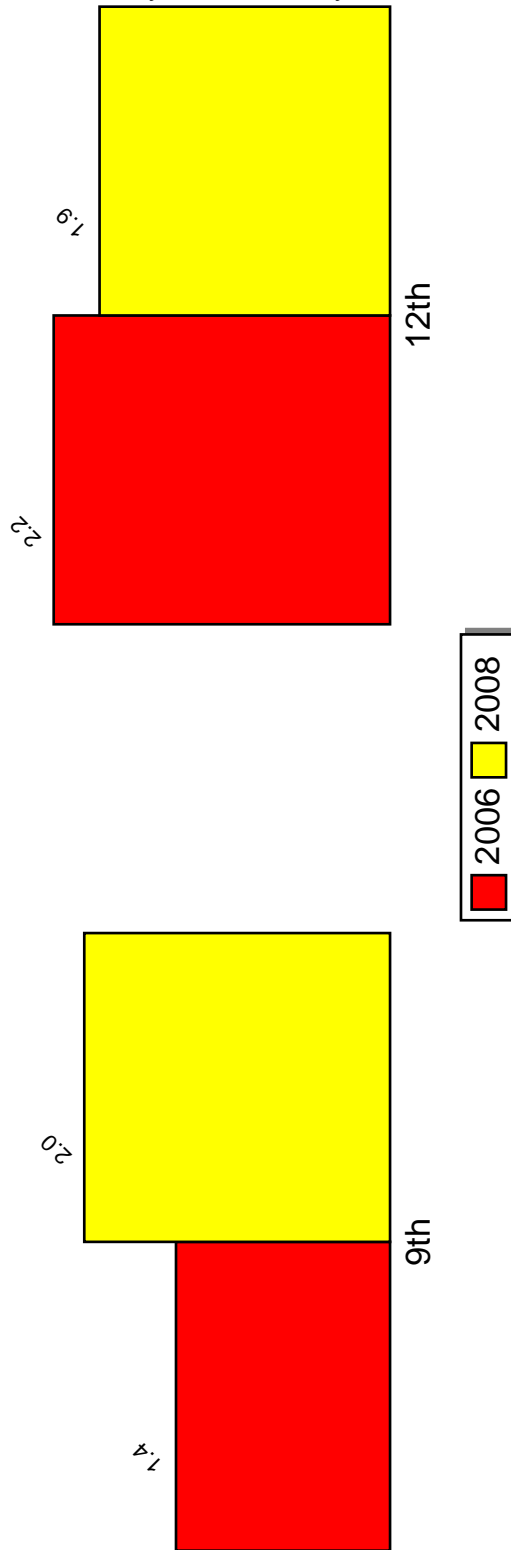
Figure 21: Past 30 Day Use of Hallucinogens

Figure 22: Past 30 Day Use of Ecstasy

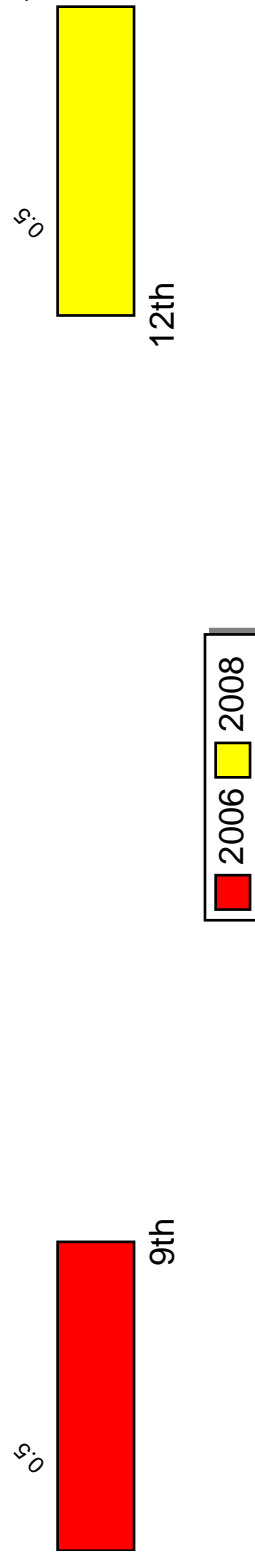

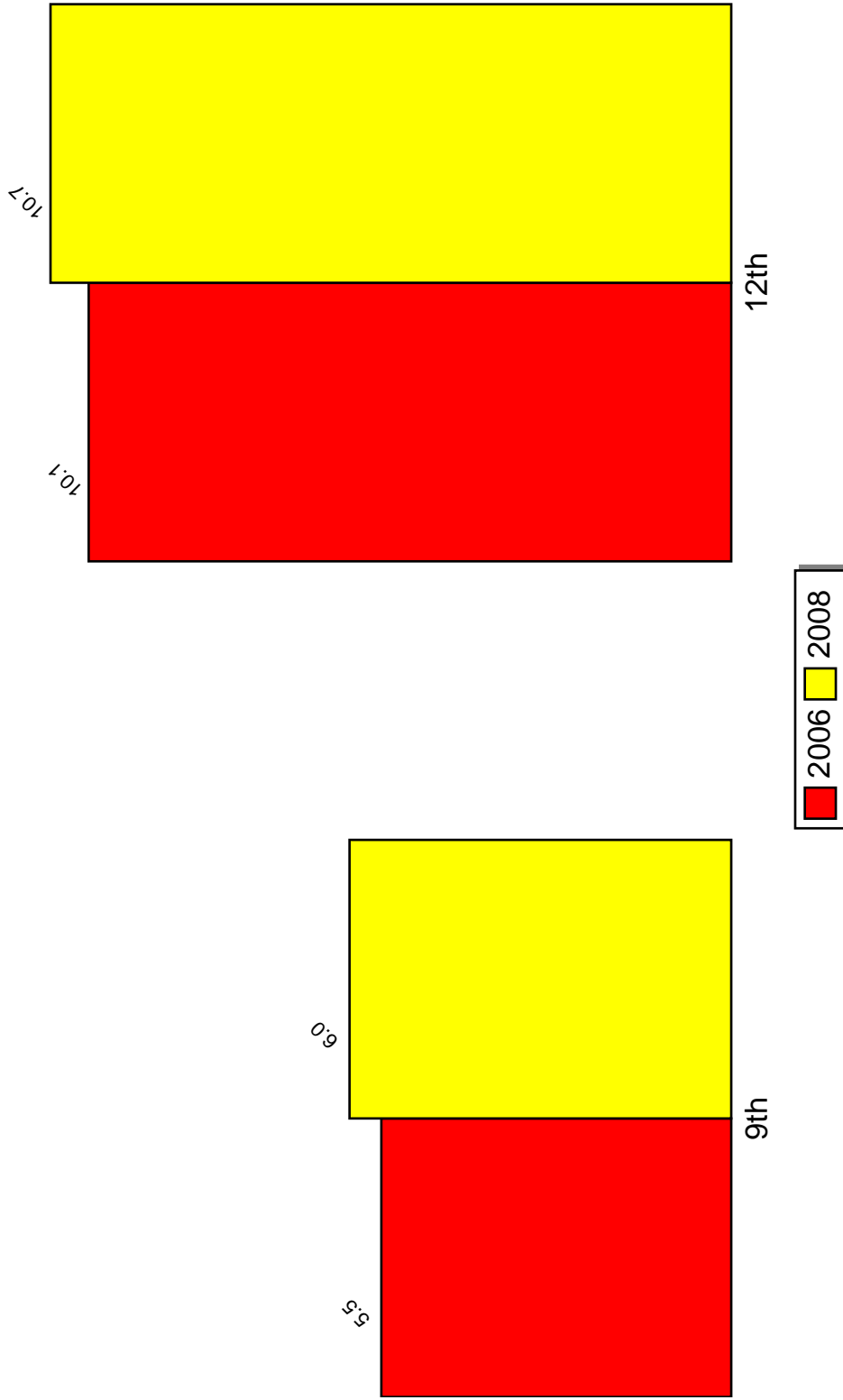
Figure 23: Past 30 Day Use of Methamphetamines

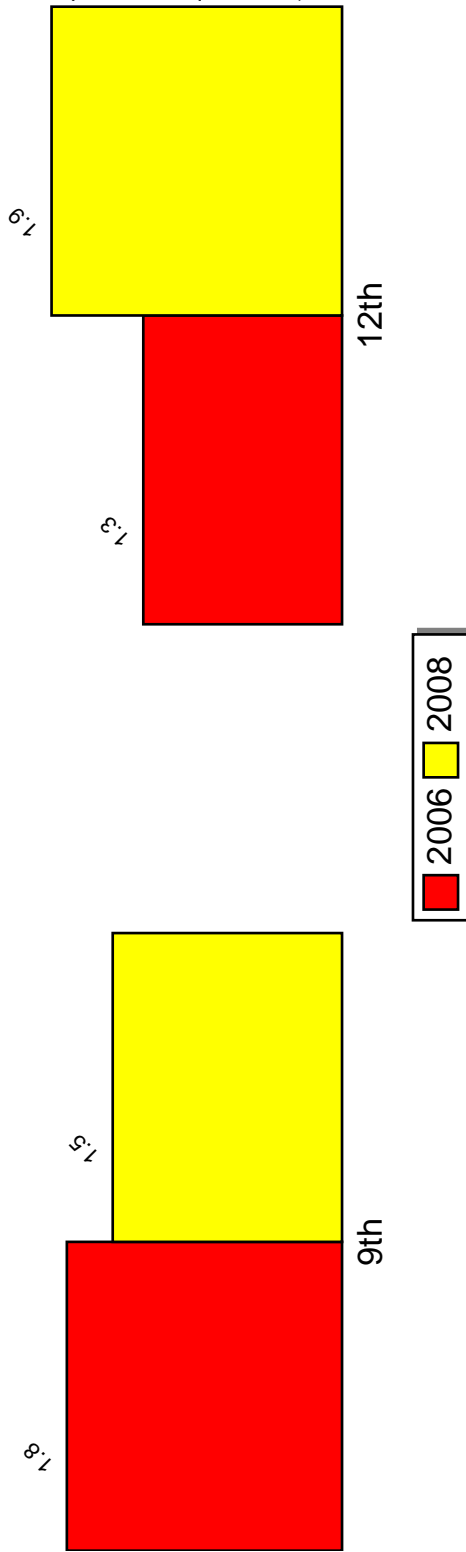
Figure 24: Past 30 Day Use of Prescription Pain Relievers (Vicodin, Oxycontin, ...)

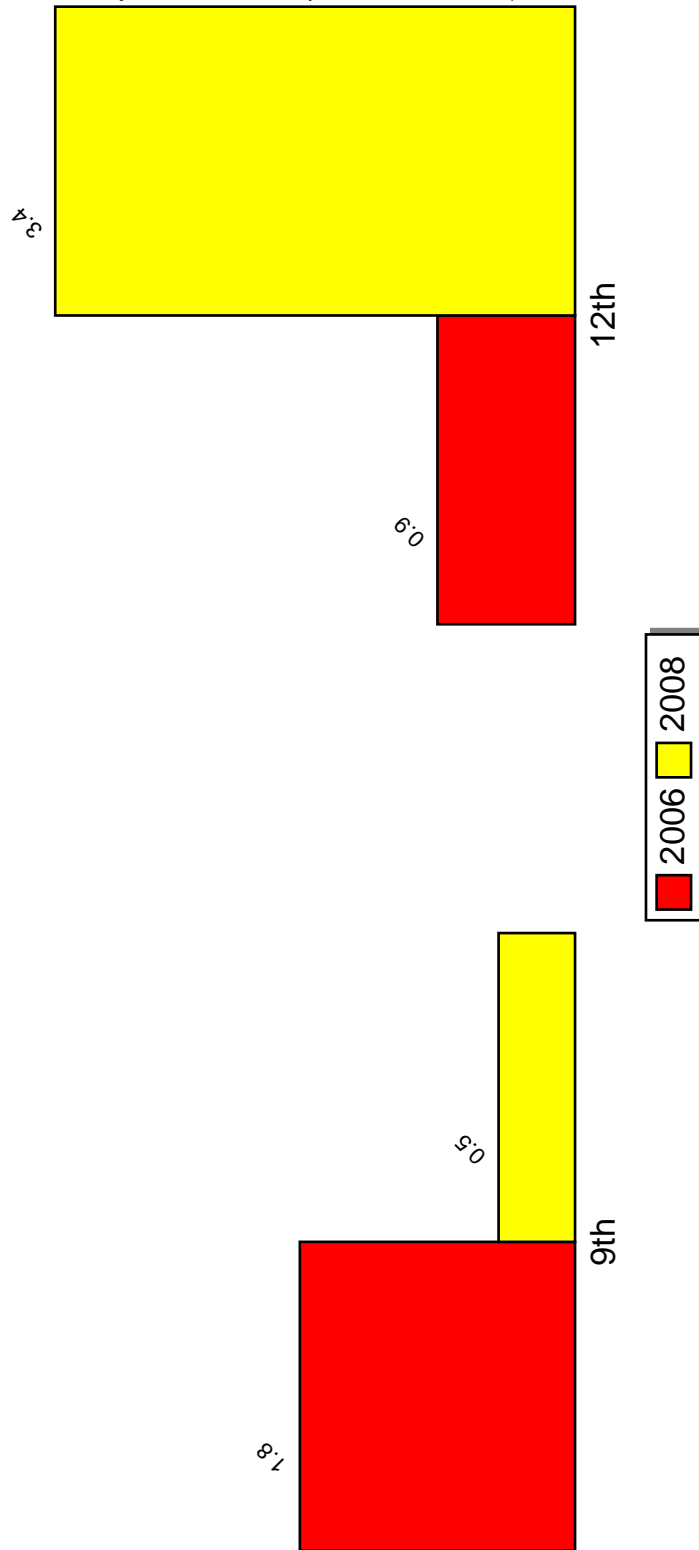
Figure 25: Past 30 Day Use of Prescription Tranquilizers (Xanax, Valium, ...)

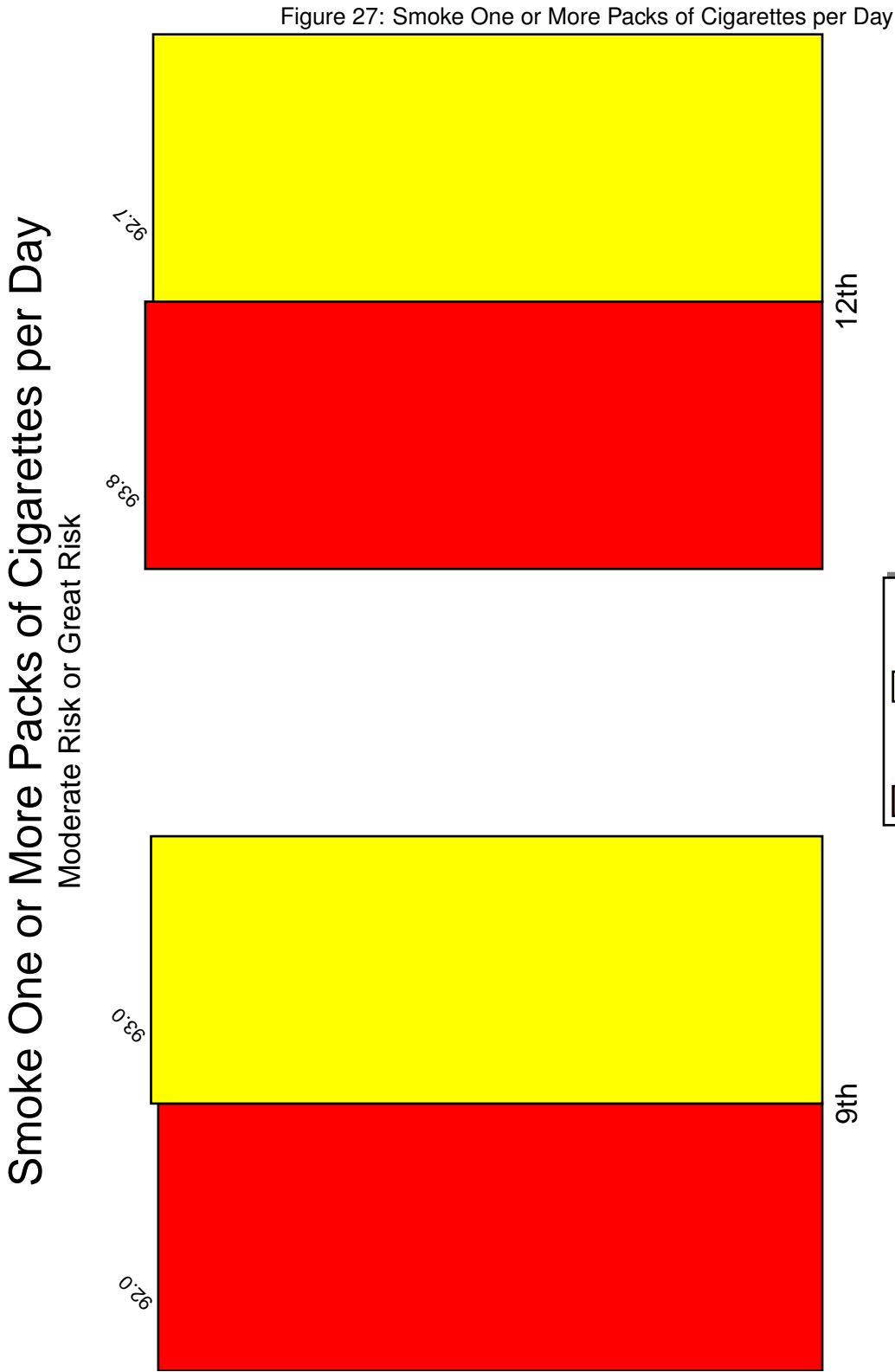
Figure 26: Past 30 Day Use of Prescription Stimulants (Ritalin, Adderall, ...)

## 2 Perceived Risk of Use

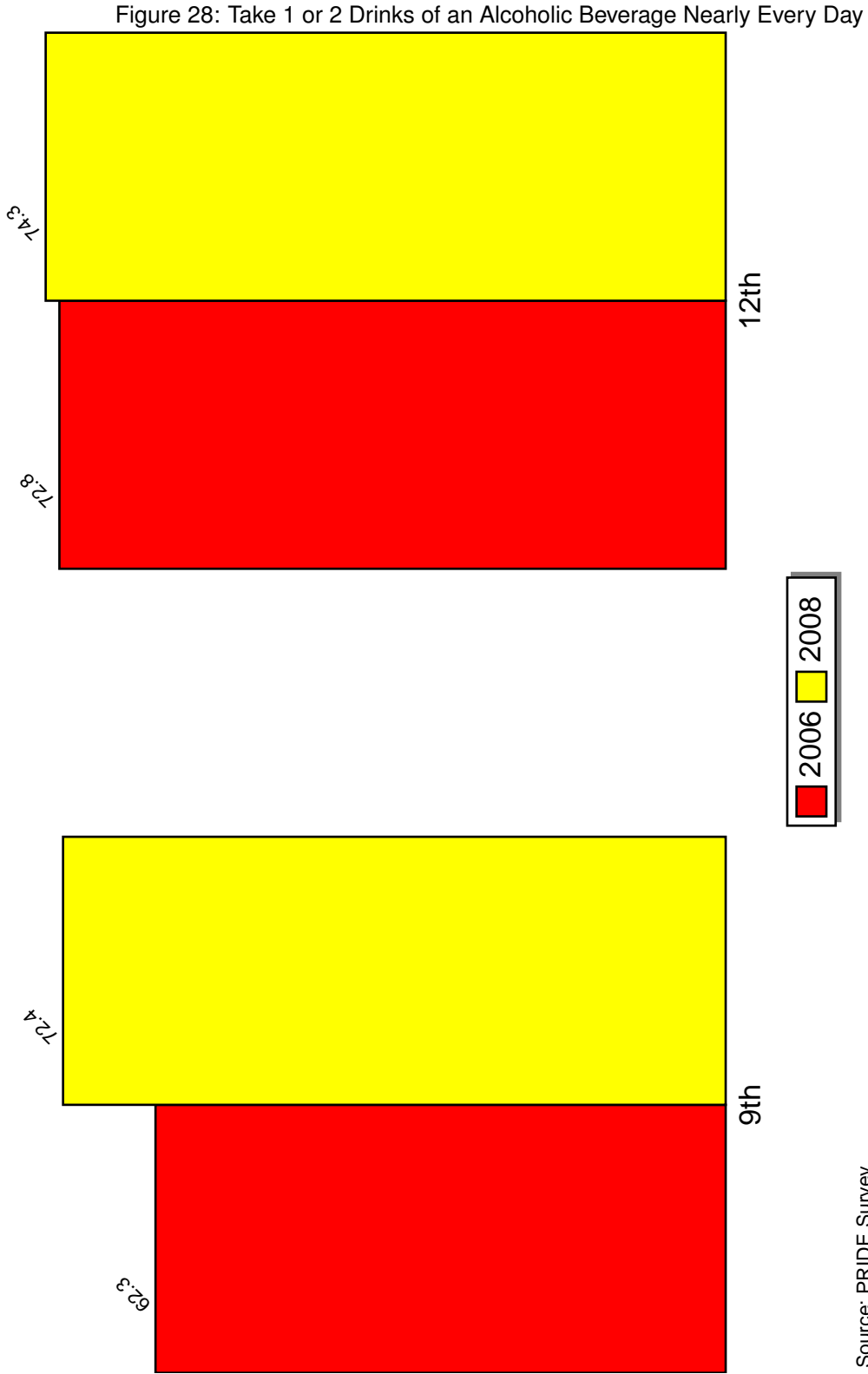

# Take 1 or 2 Drinks of an Alcoholic Beverage Nearly Every Day

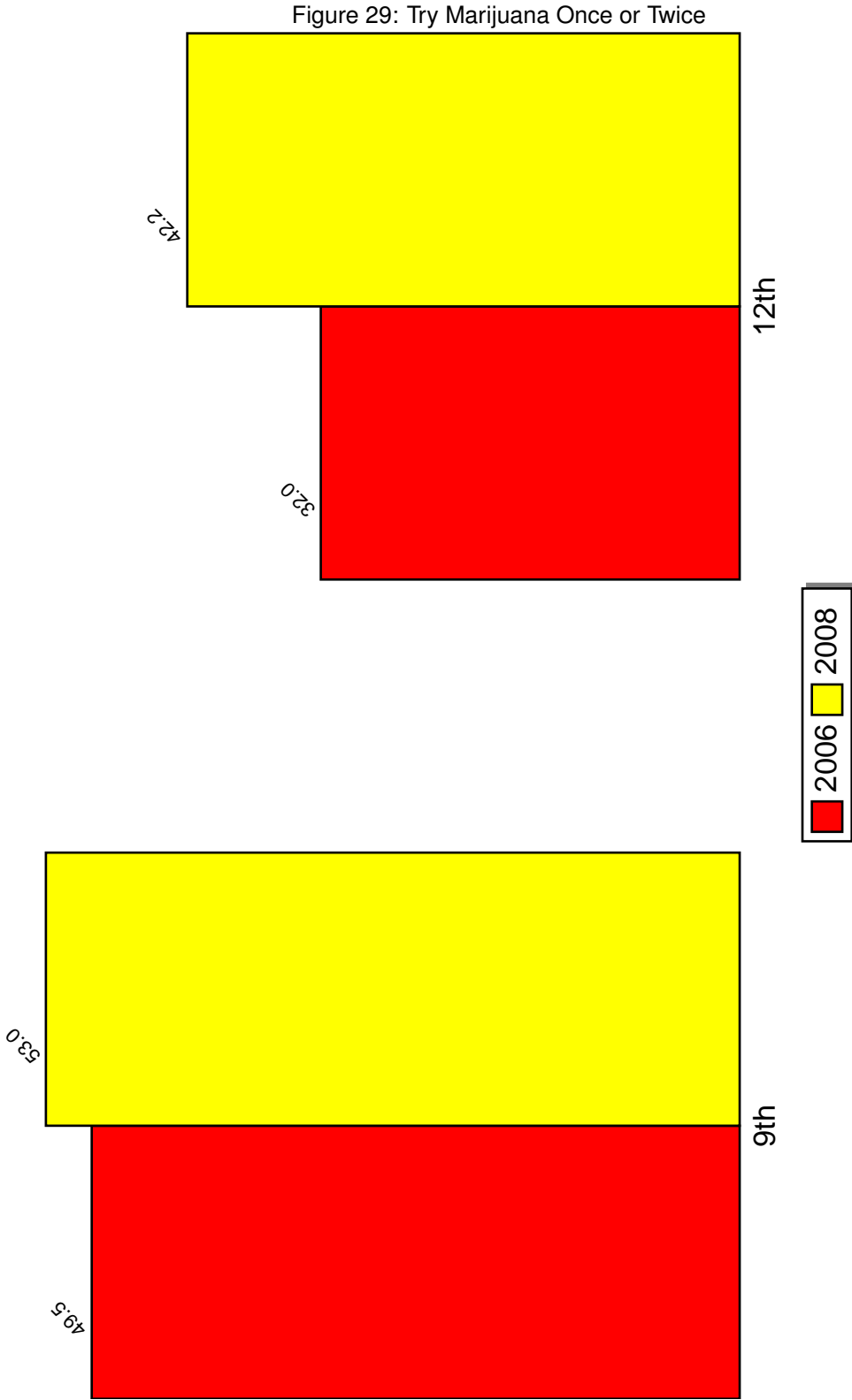

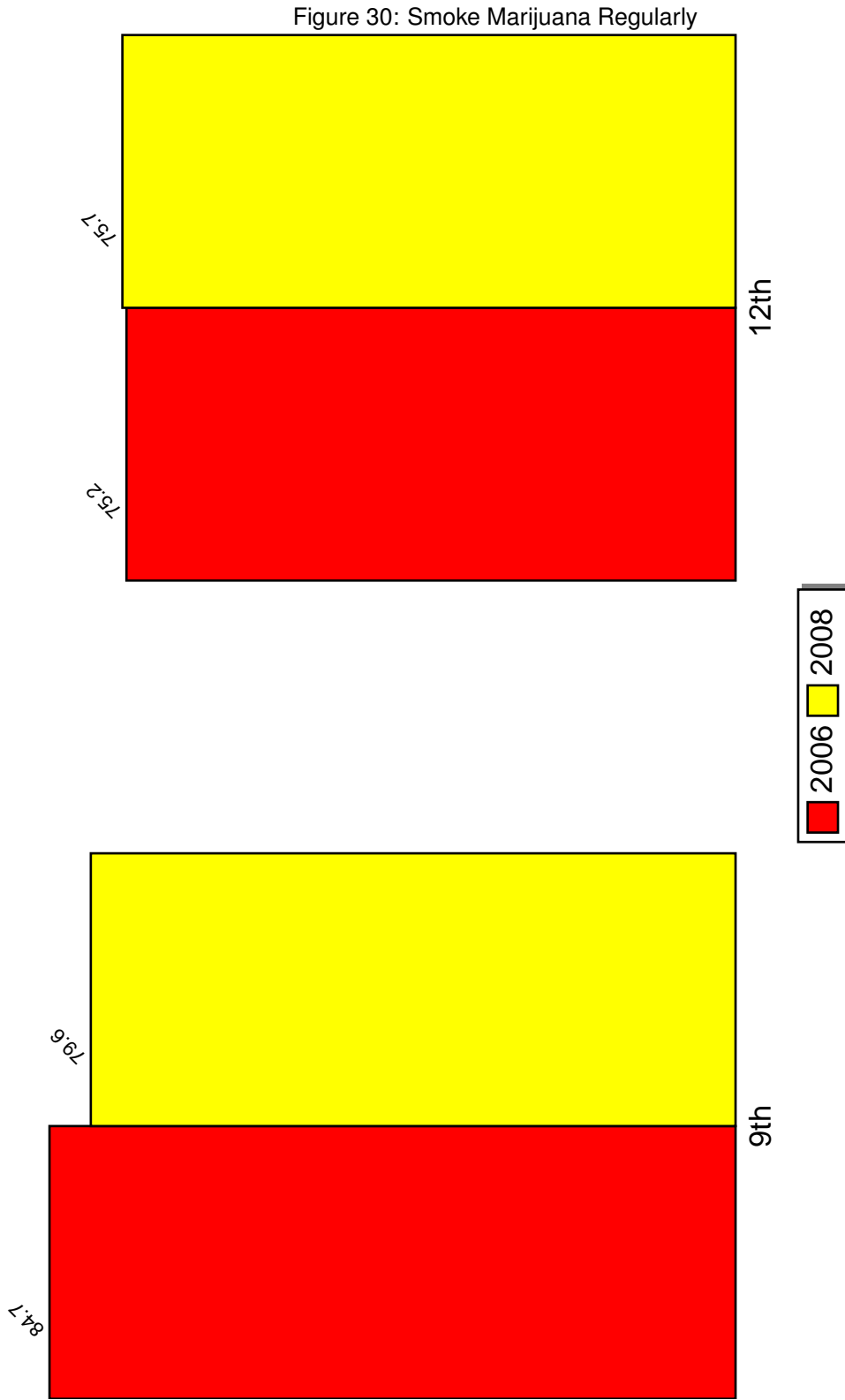

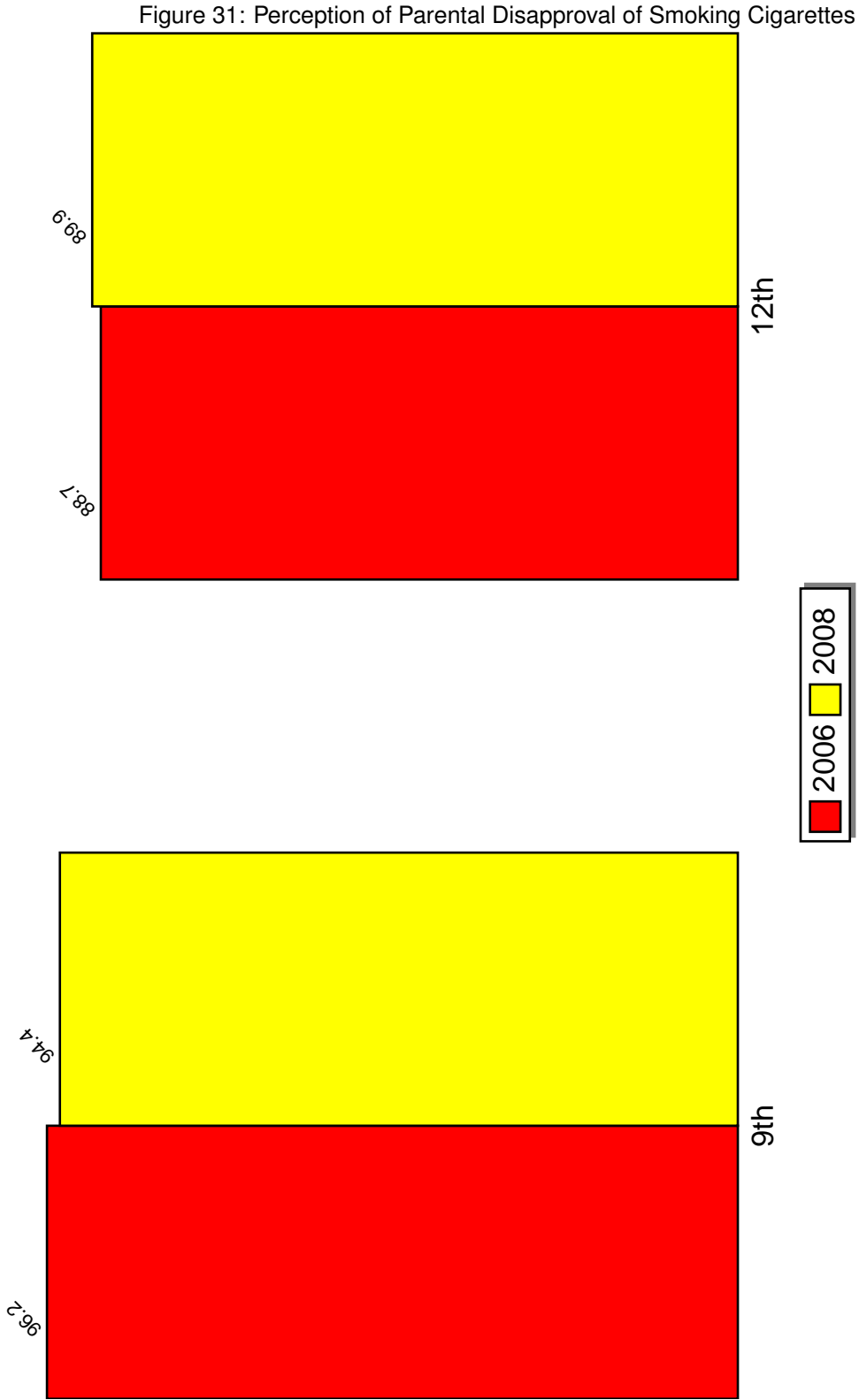

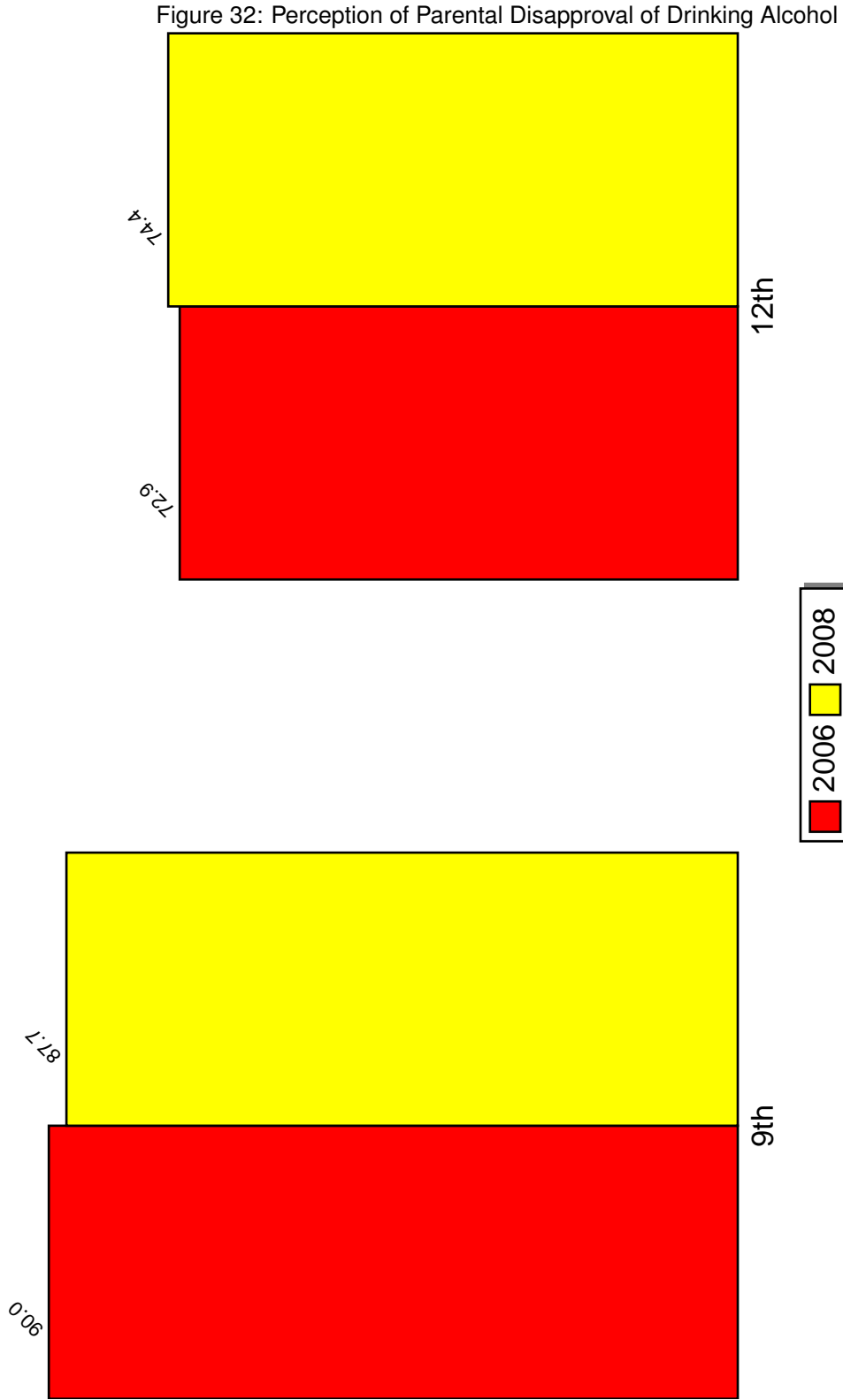

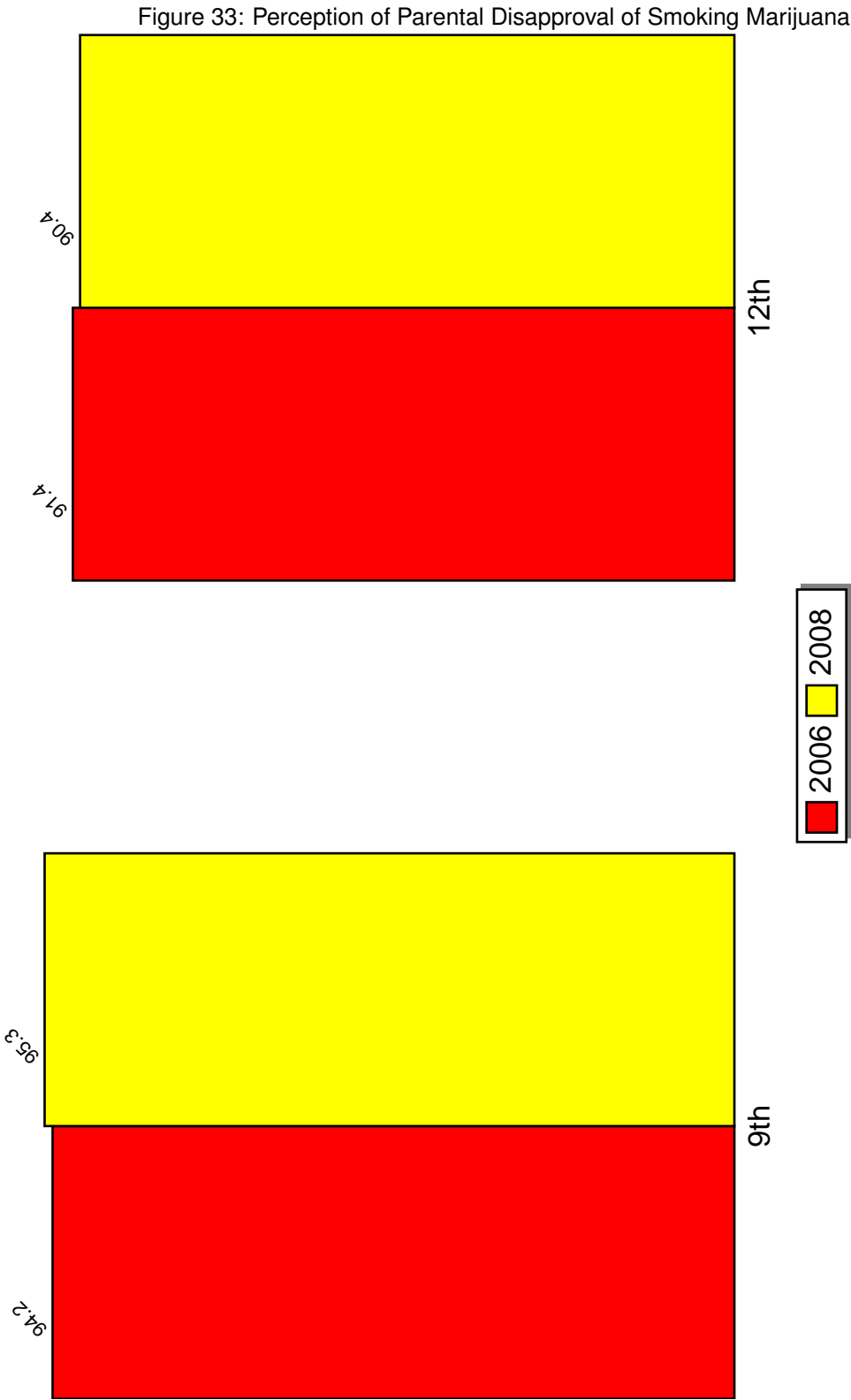

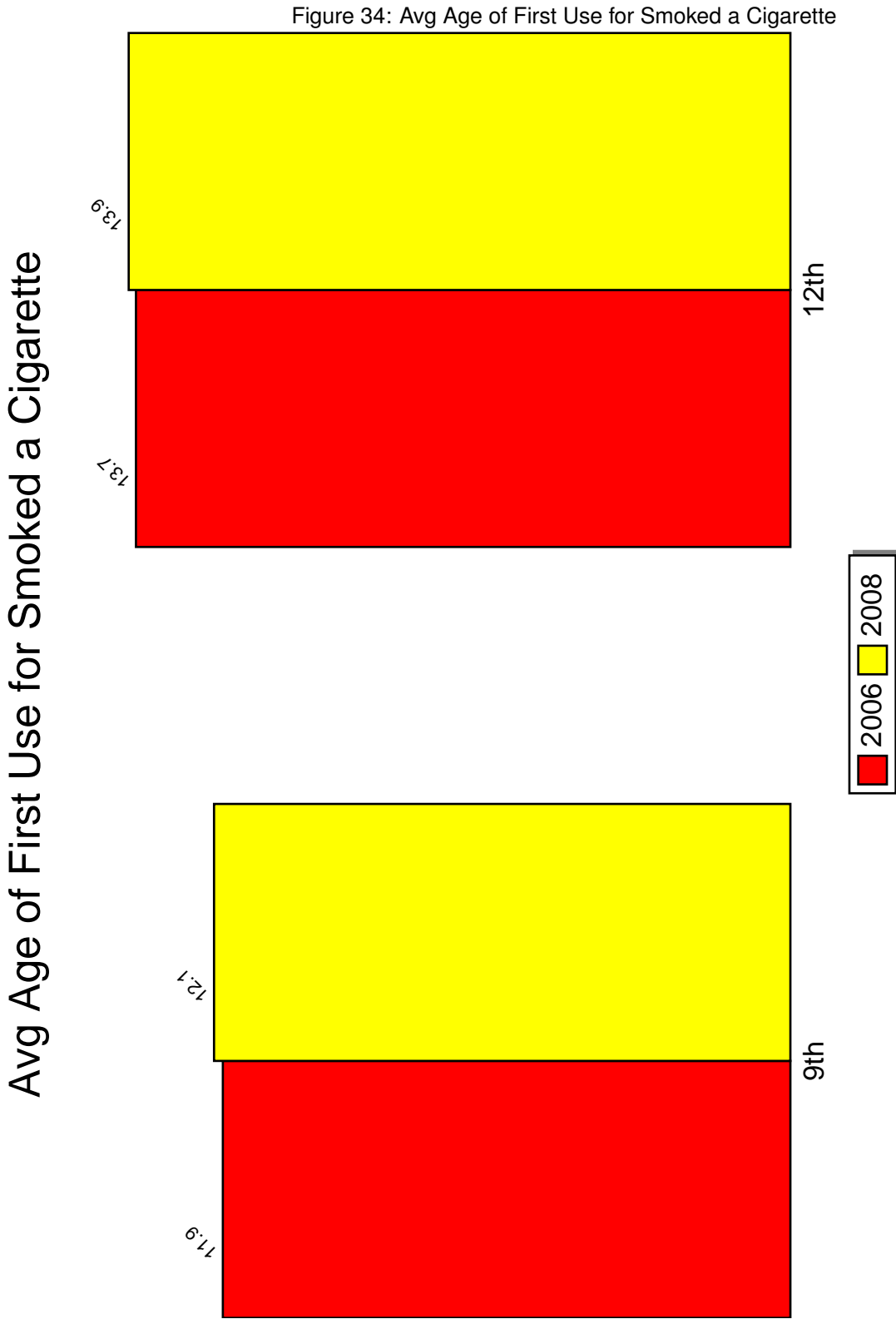

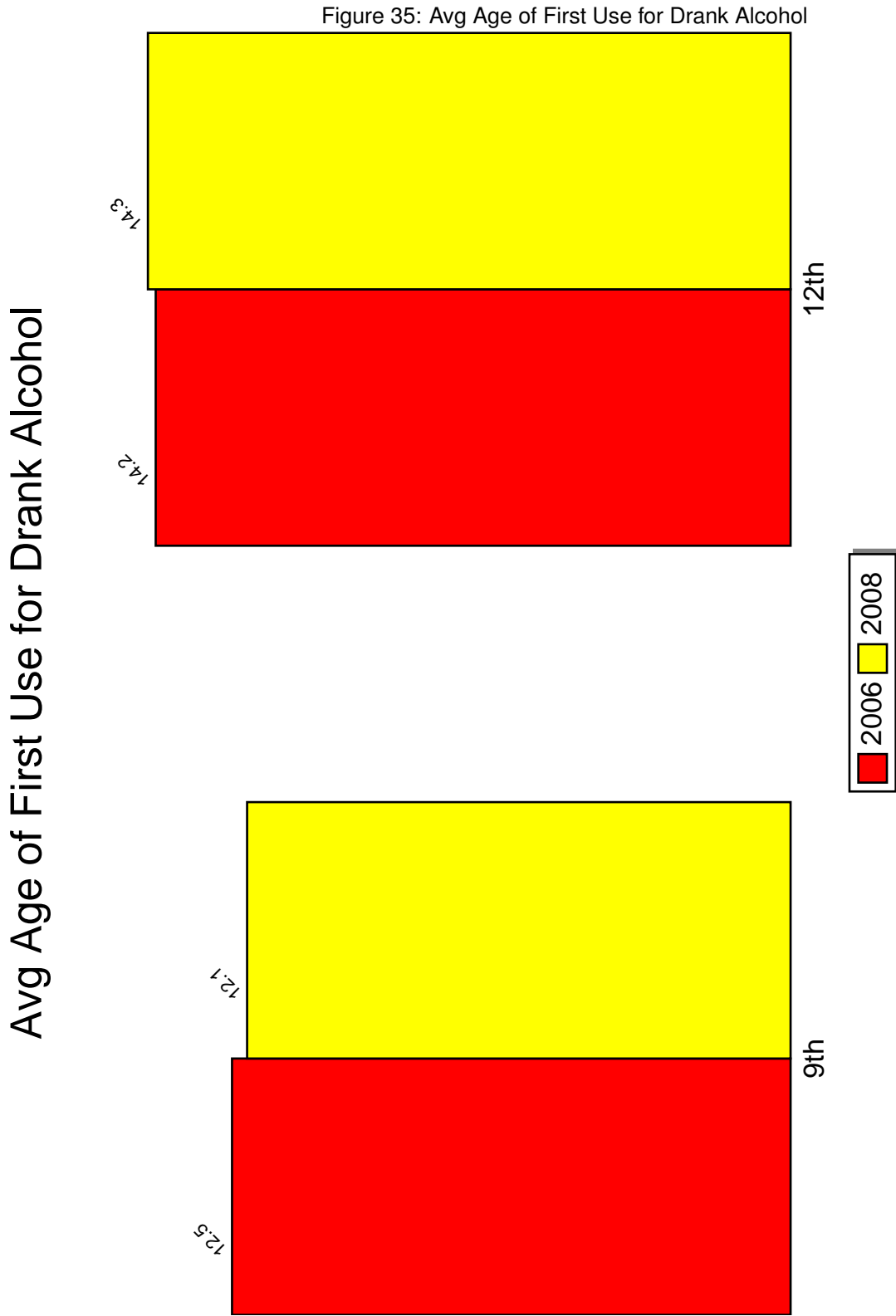

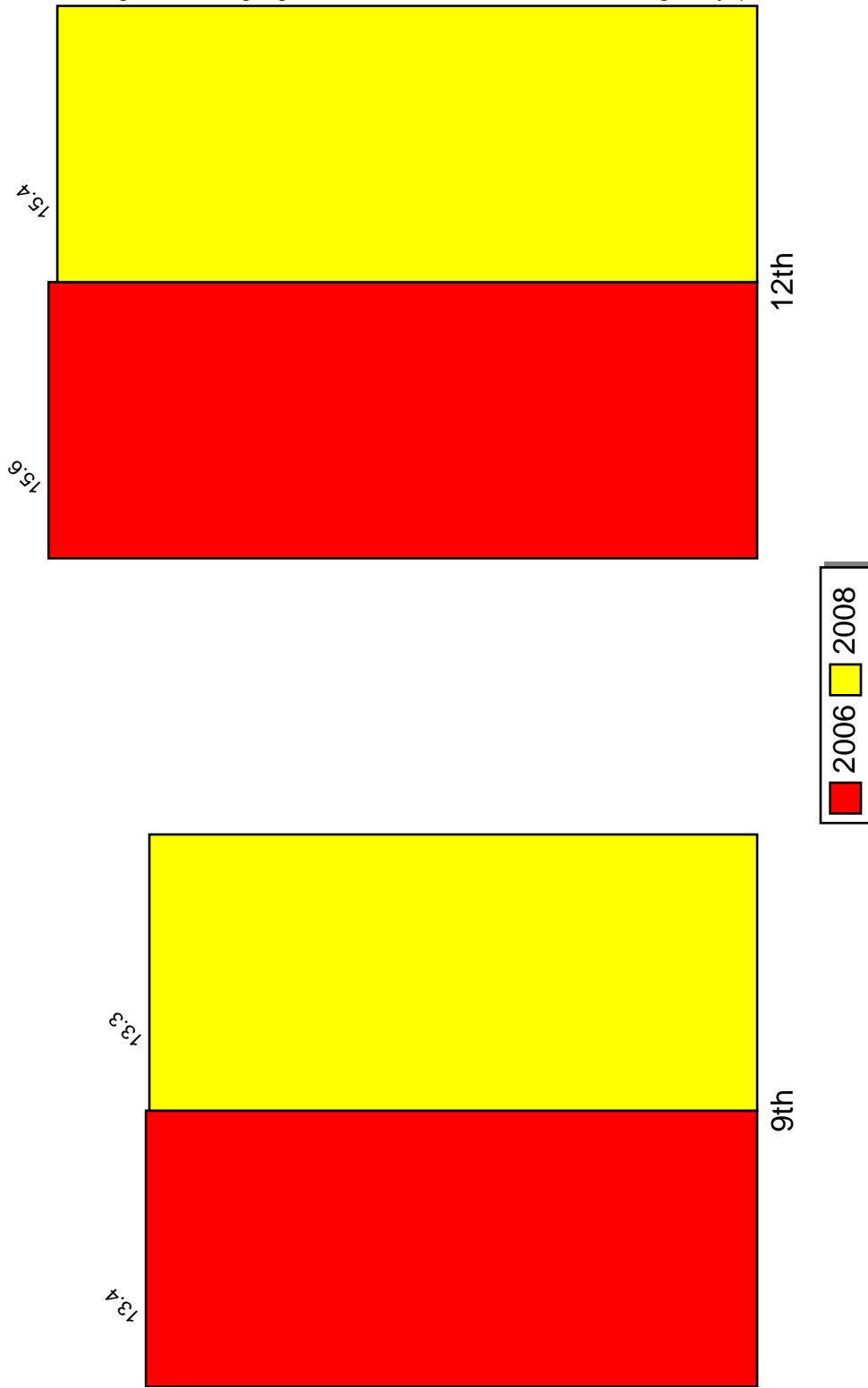

# Avg Age of First Use for Drank Alcohol Regularly (1-2 Times/Month)

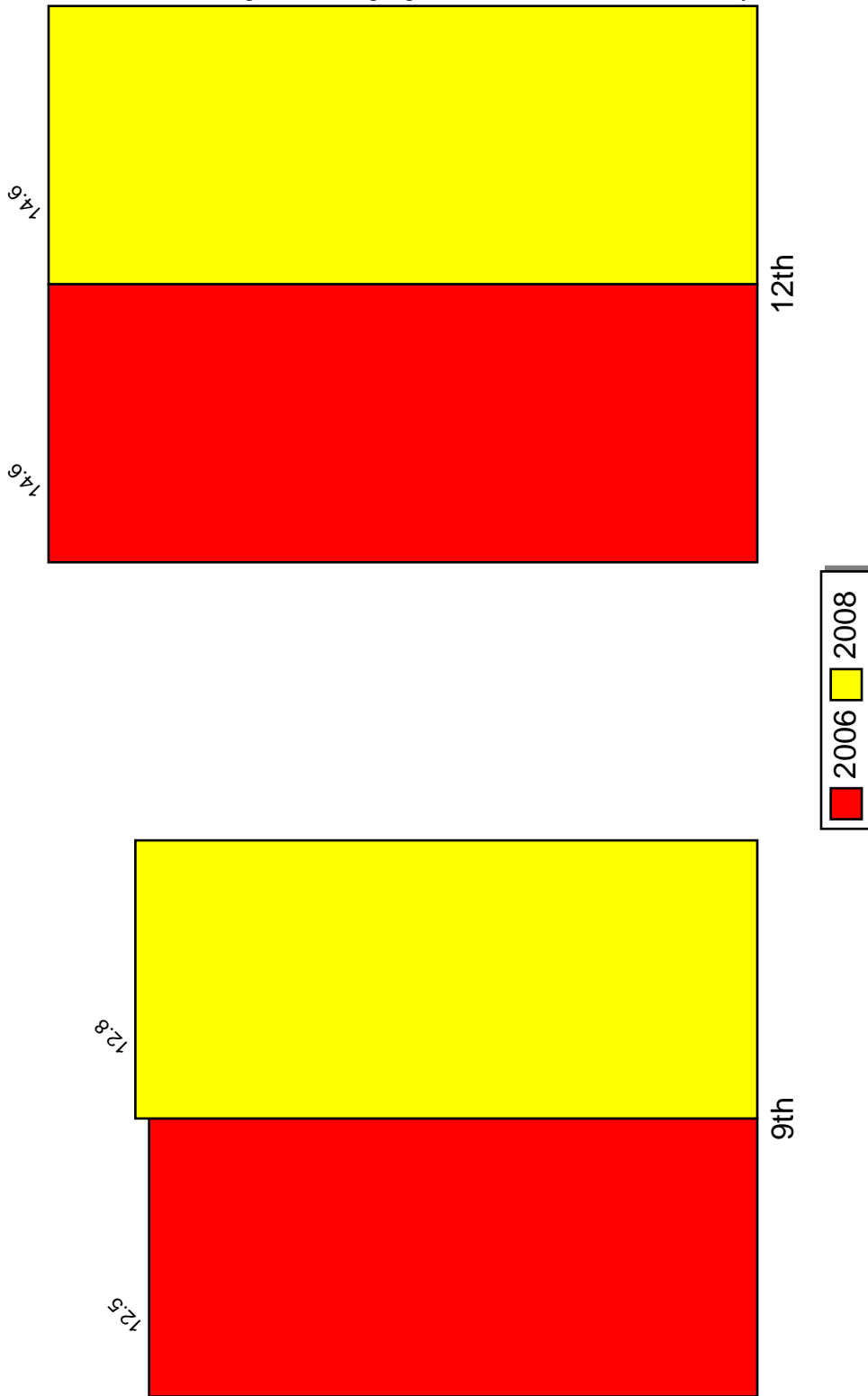
Figure 36: Avg Age of First Use for Drank Alcohol Regularly (1-2 Times/Month)

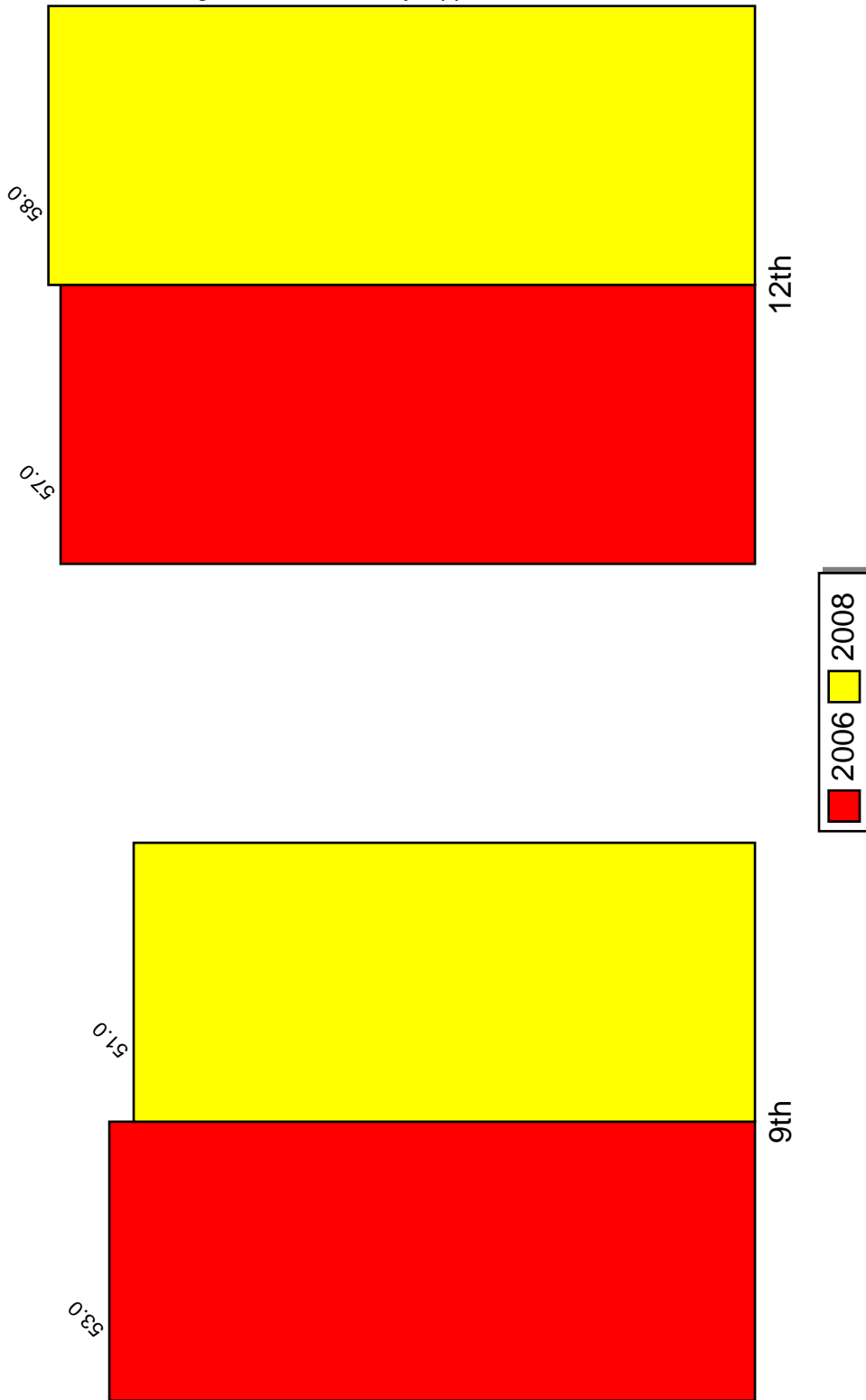

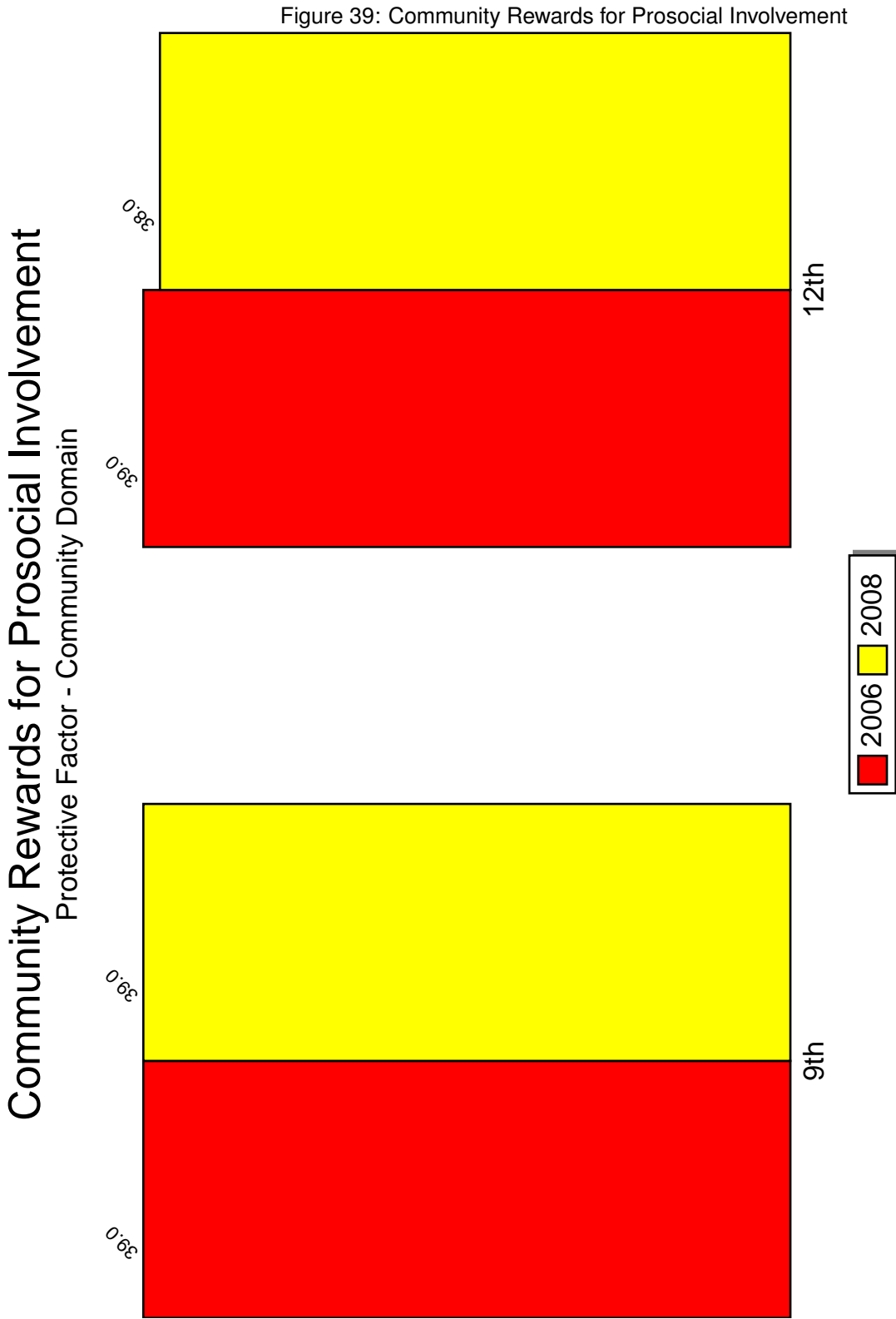

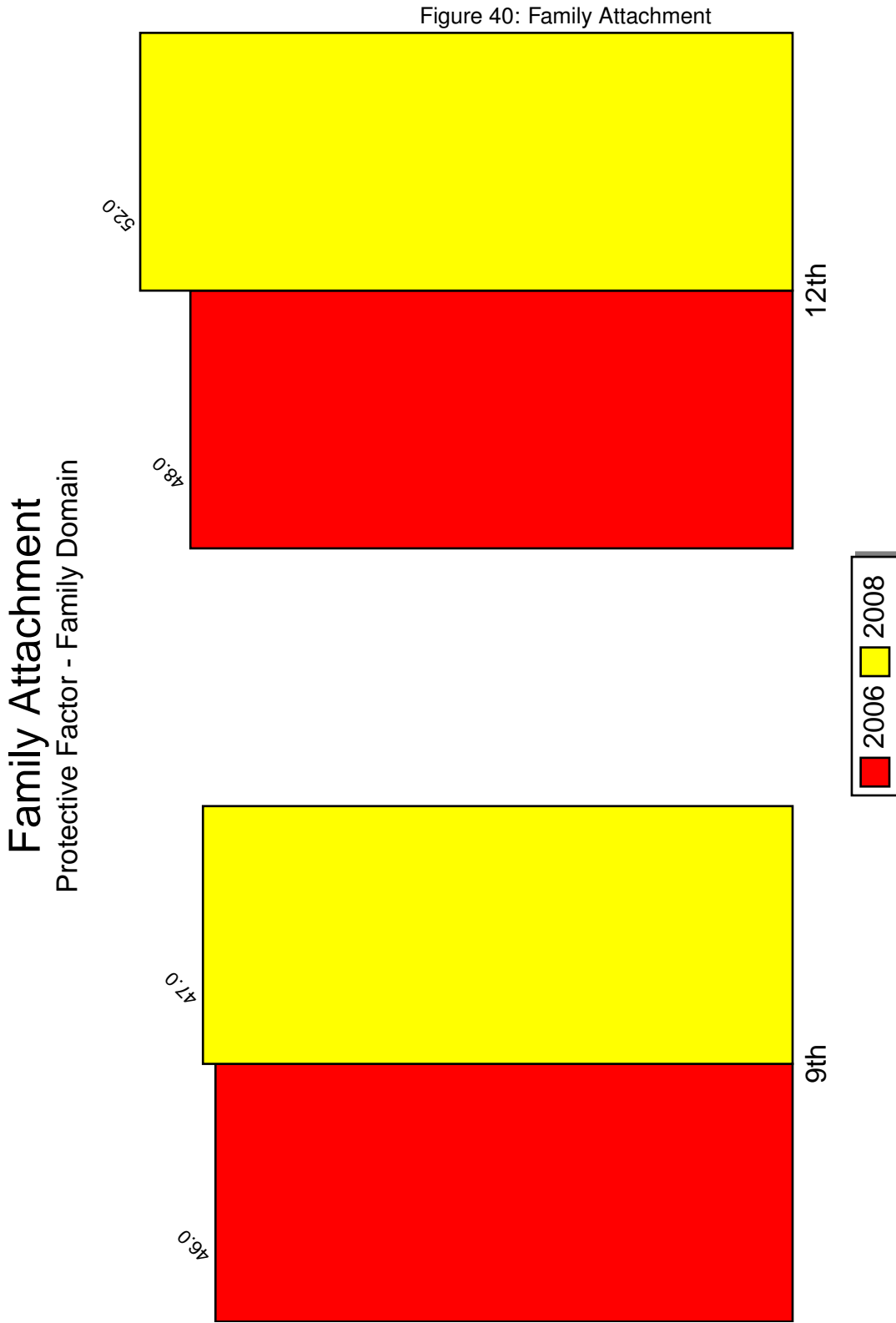
Figure 38: Community Opportunities for Prosocial Involvement



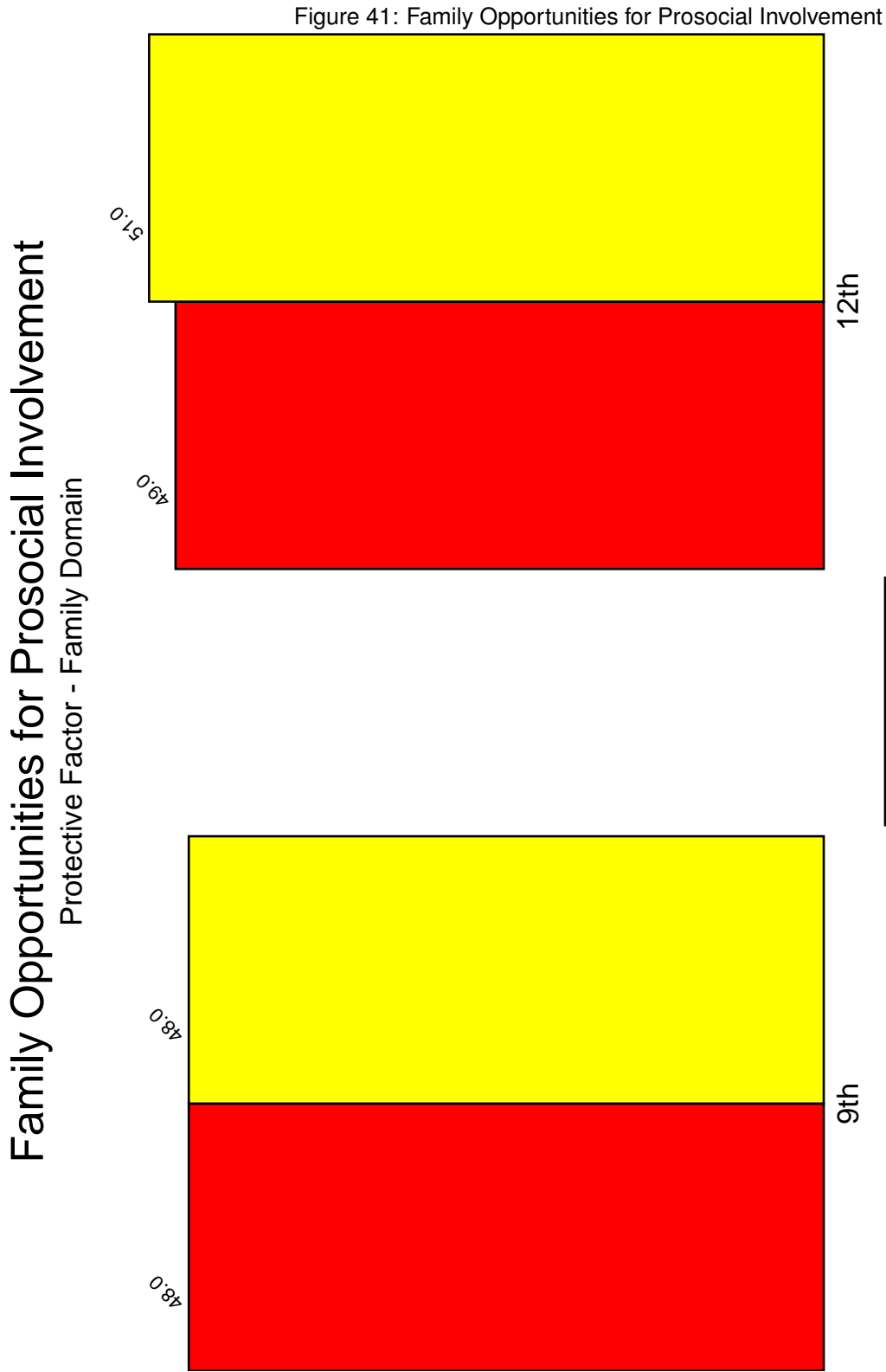

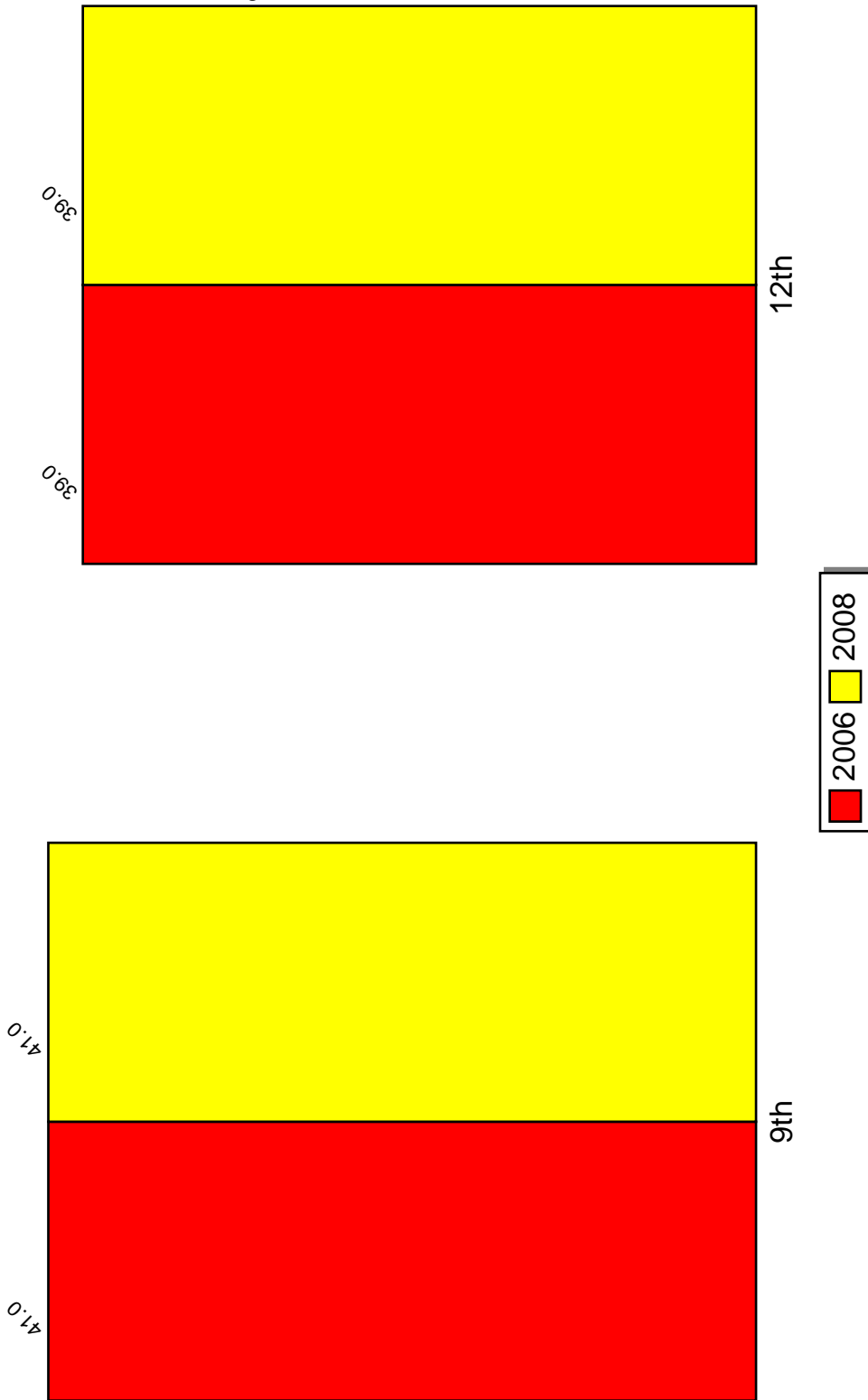




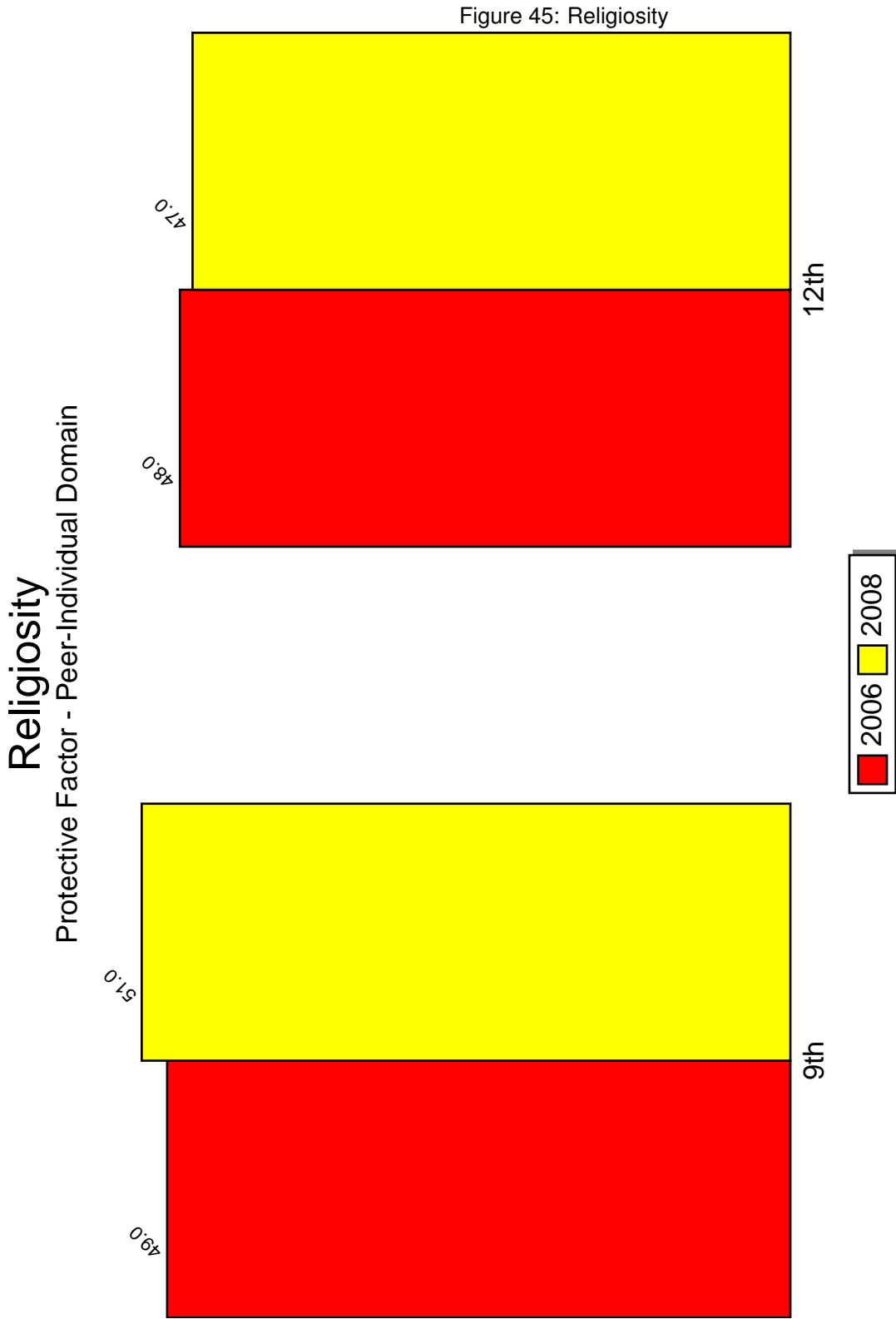
# School Rewards for Prosocial Involvement

Protective Factor - School Domain

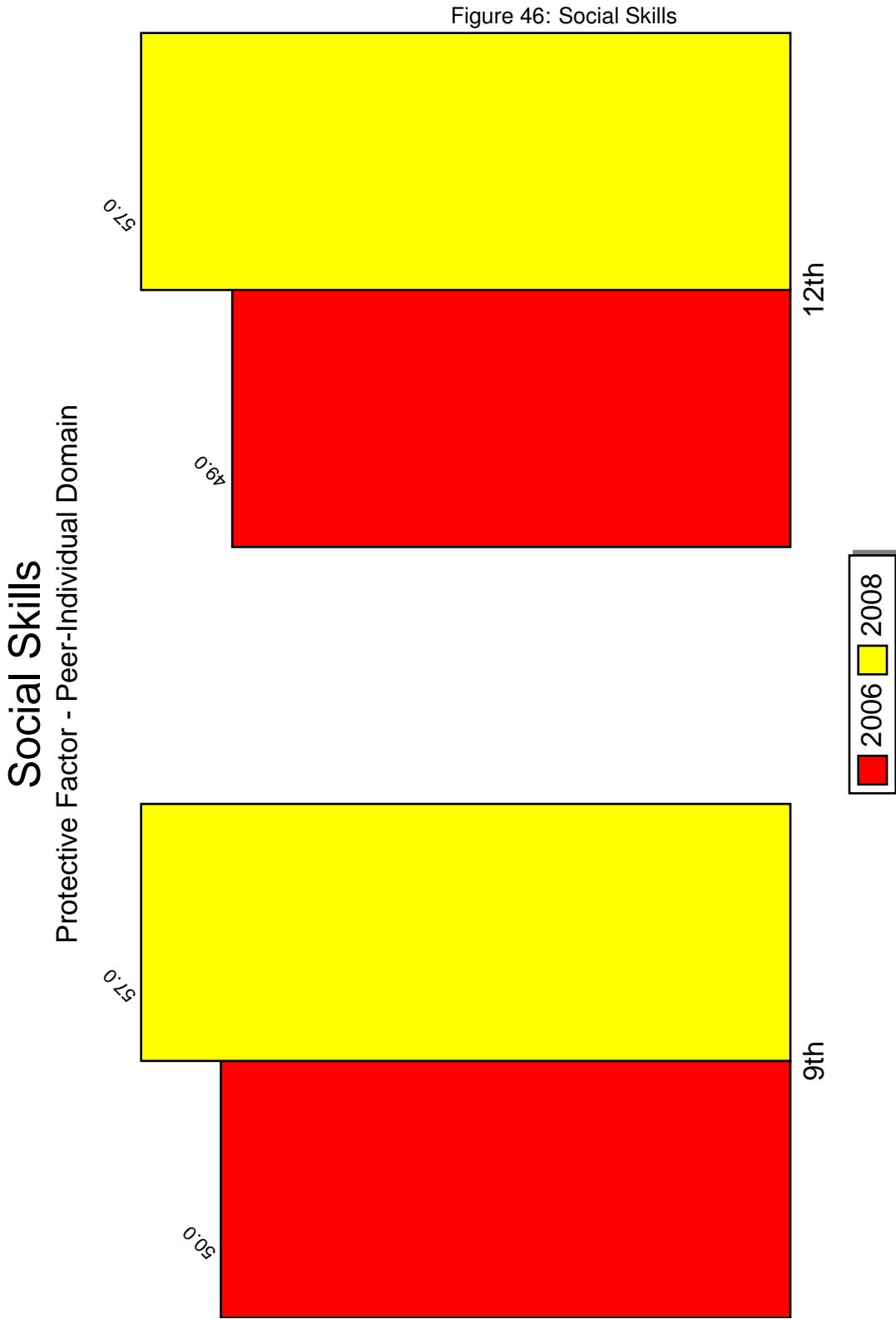
Figure 44: School Rewards for Prosocial Involvement

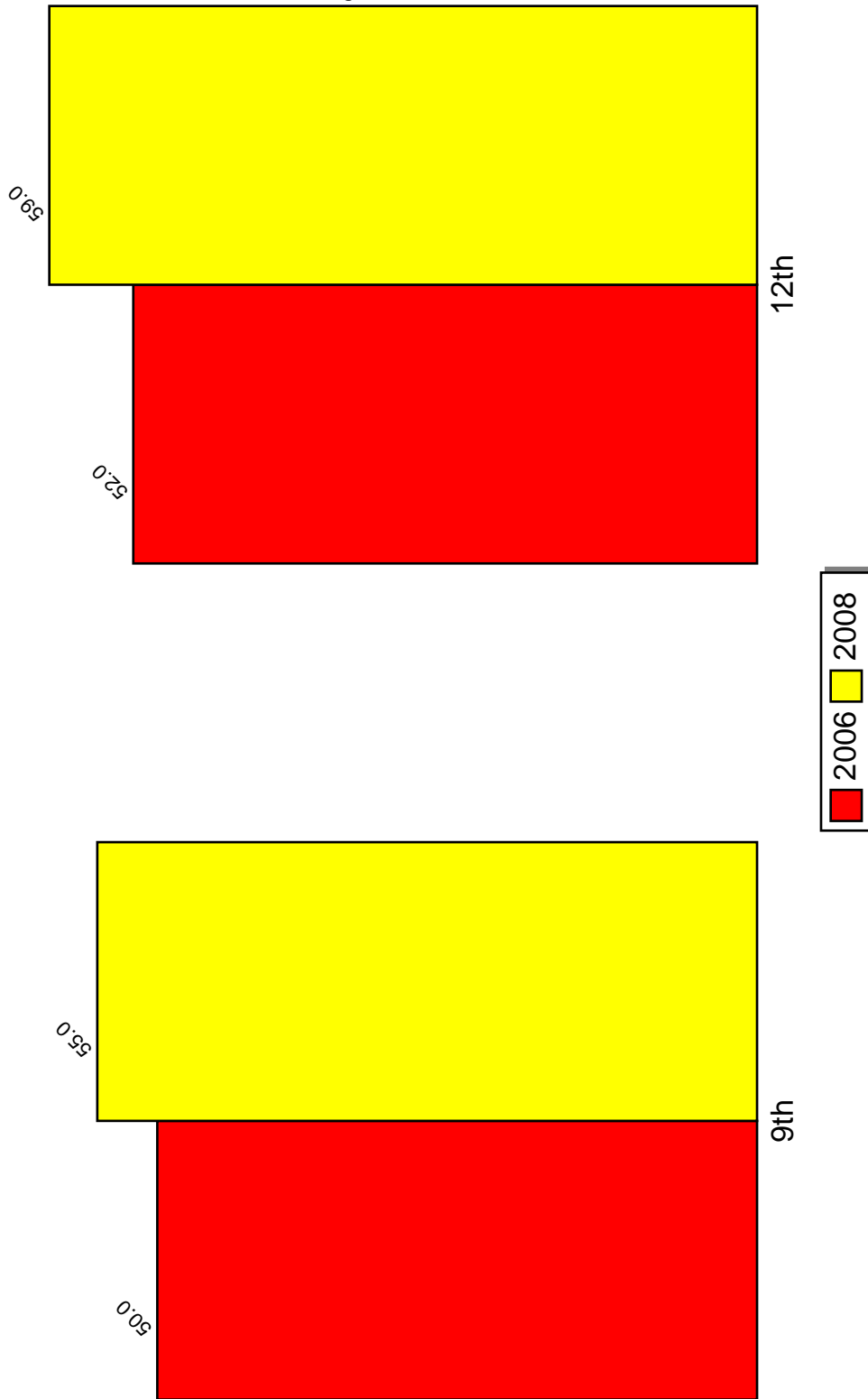

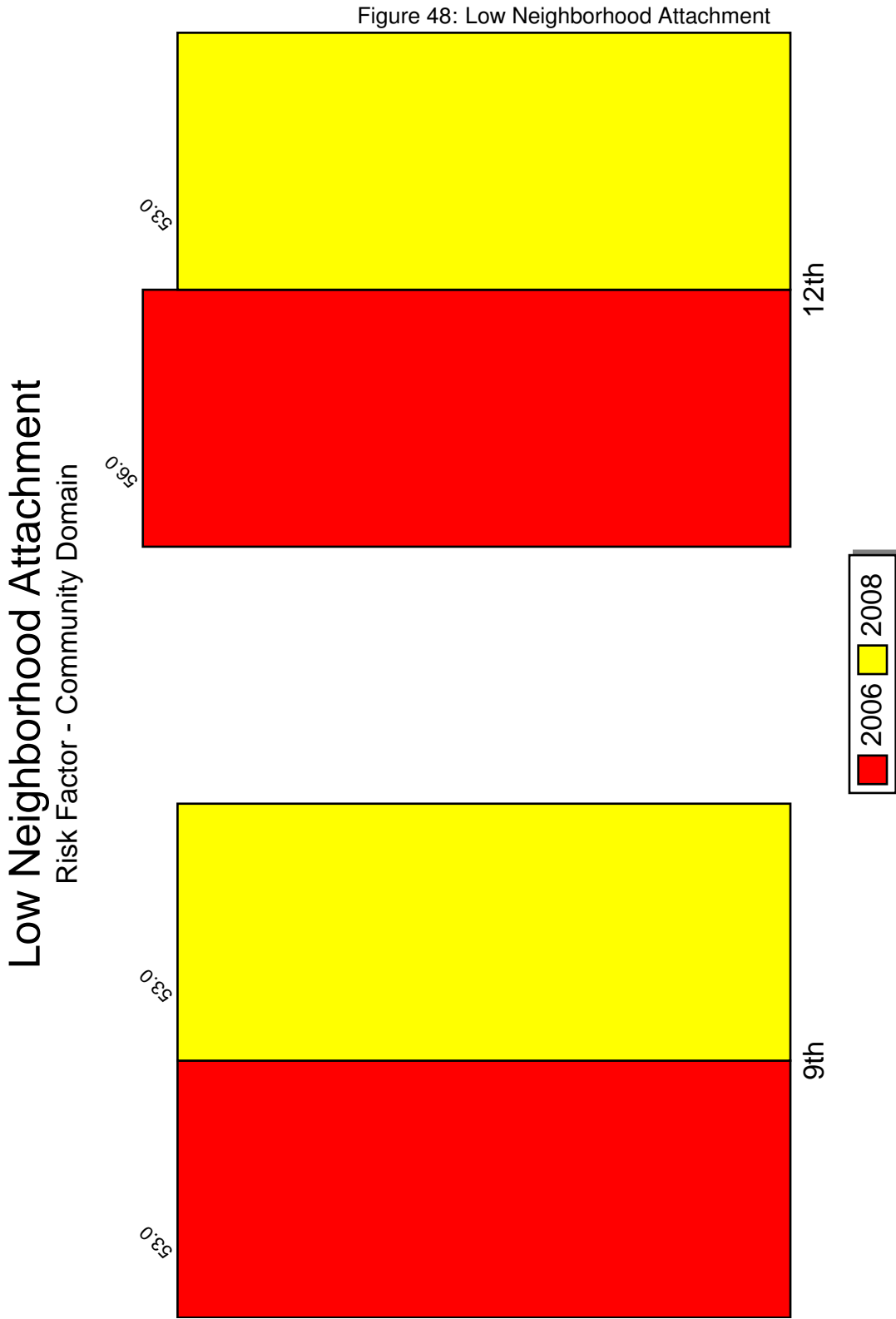
# Belief in the Moral Order

Protective Factor - Peer-Individual Domain

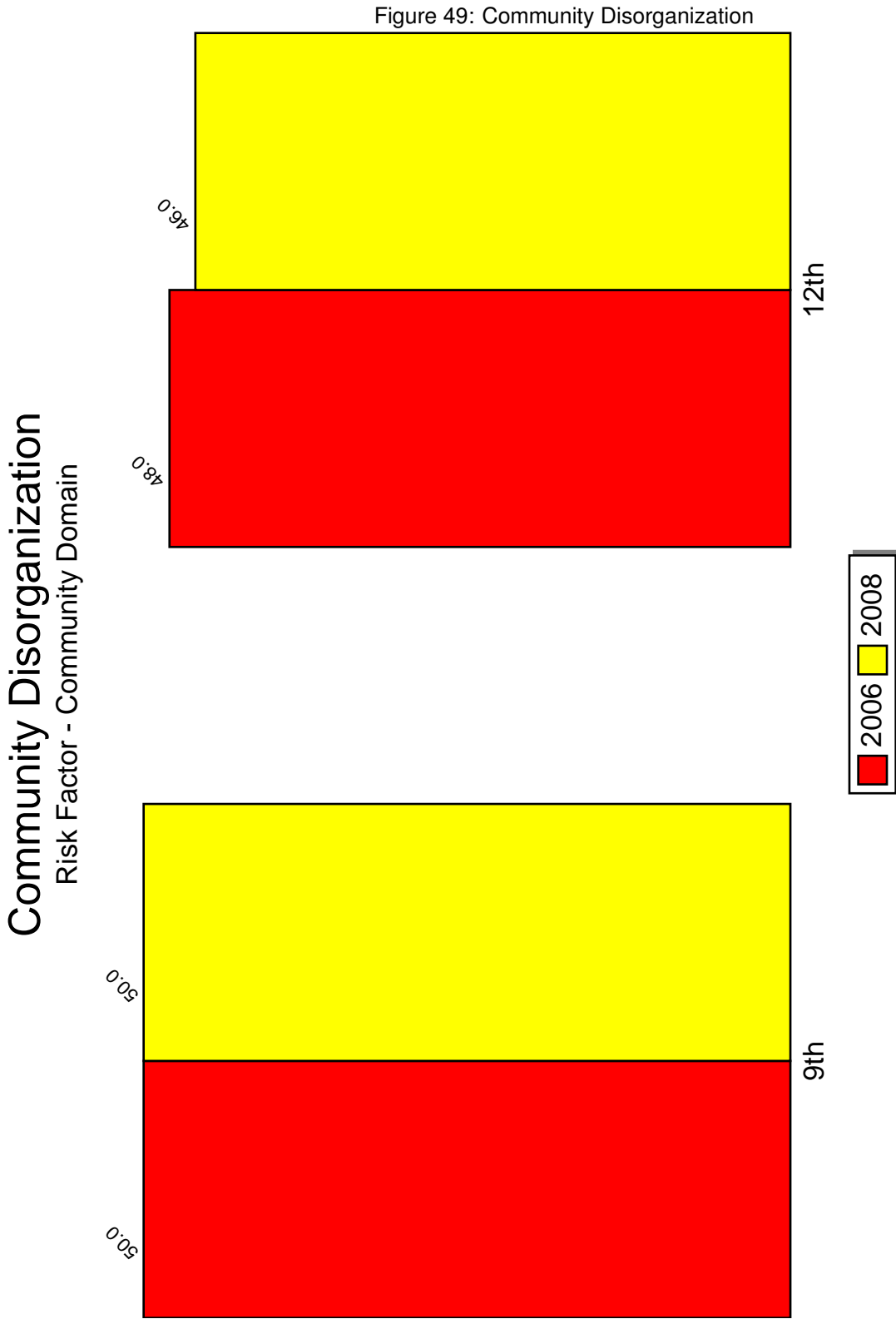
Figure 47: Belief in the Moral Order

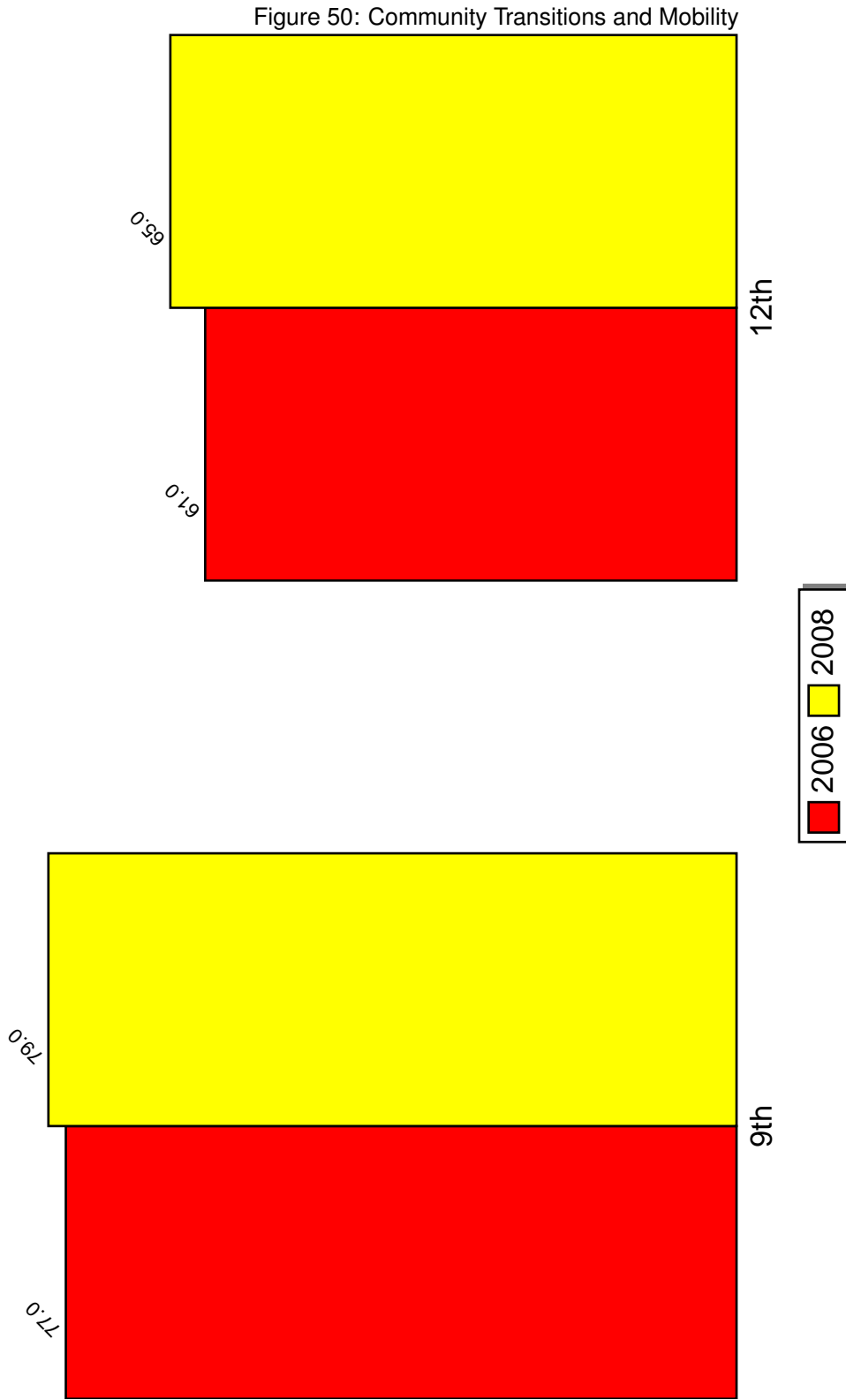

Risk Factor - Community Domain

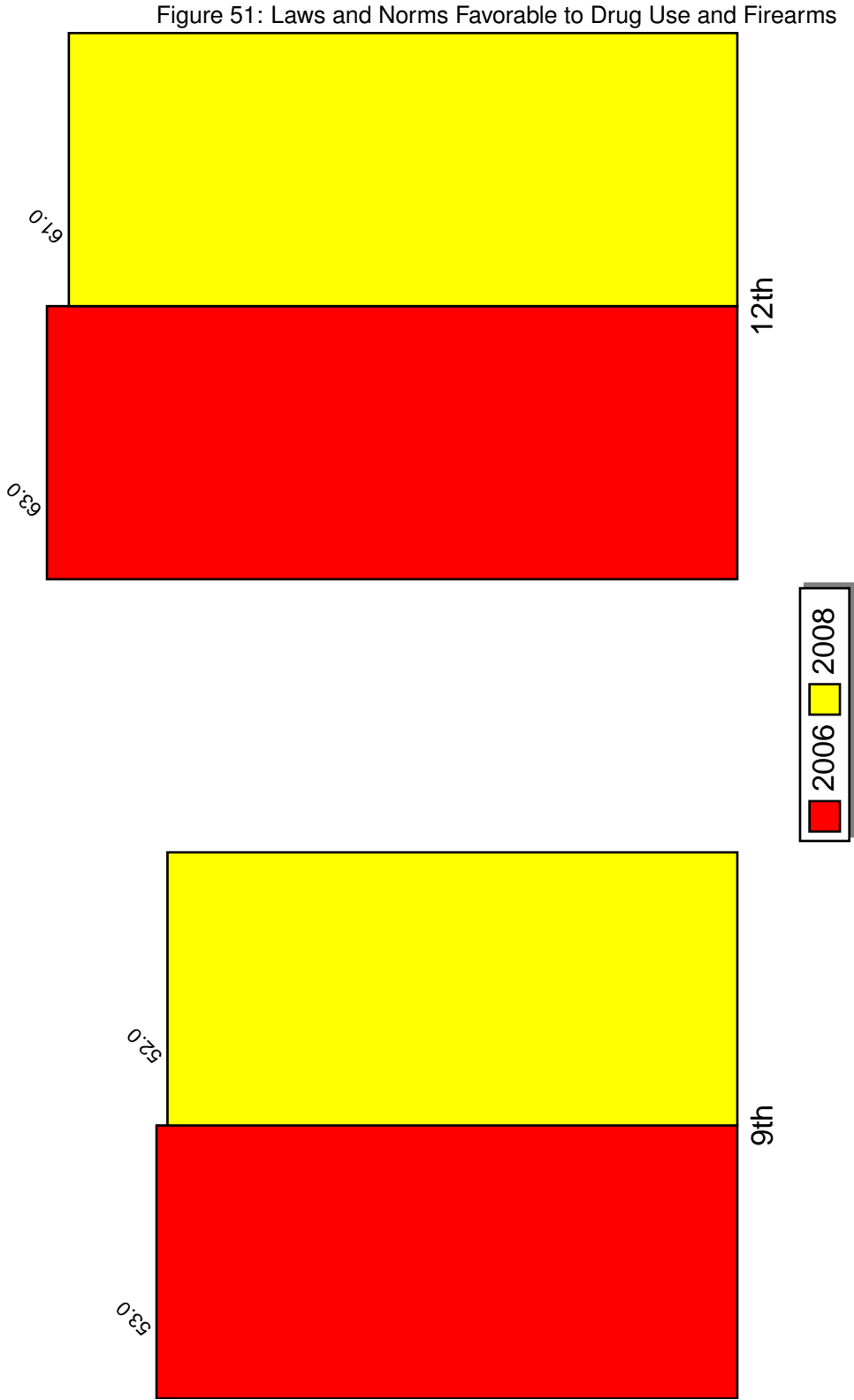

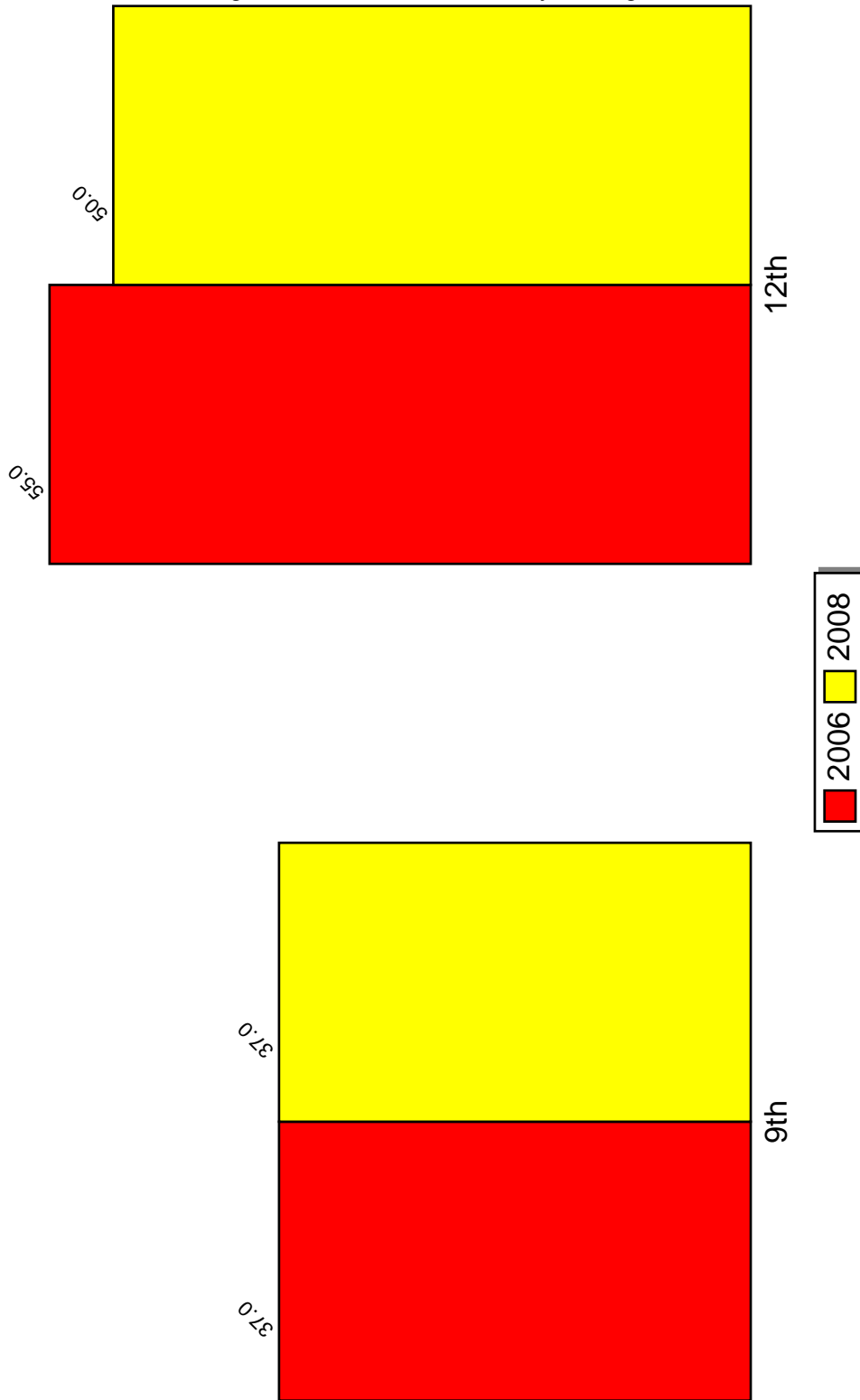

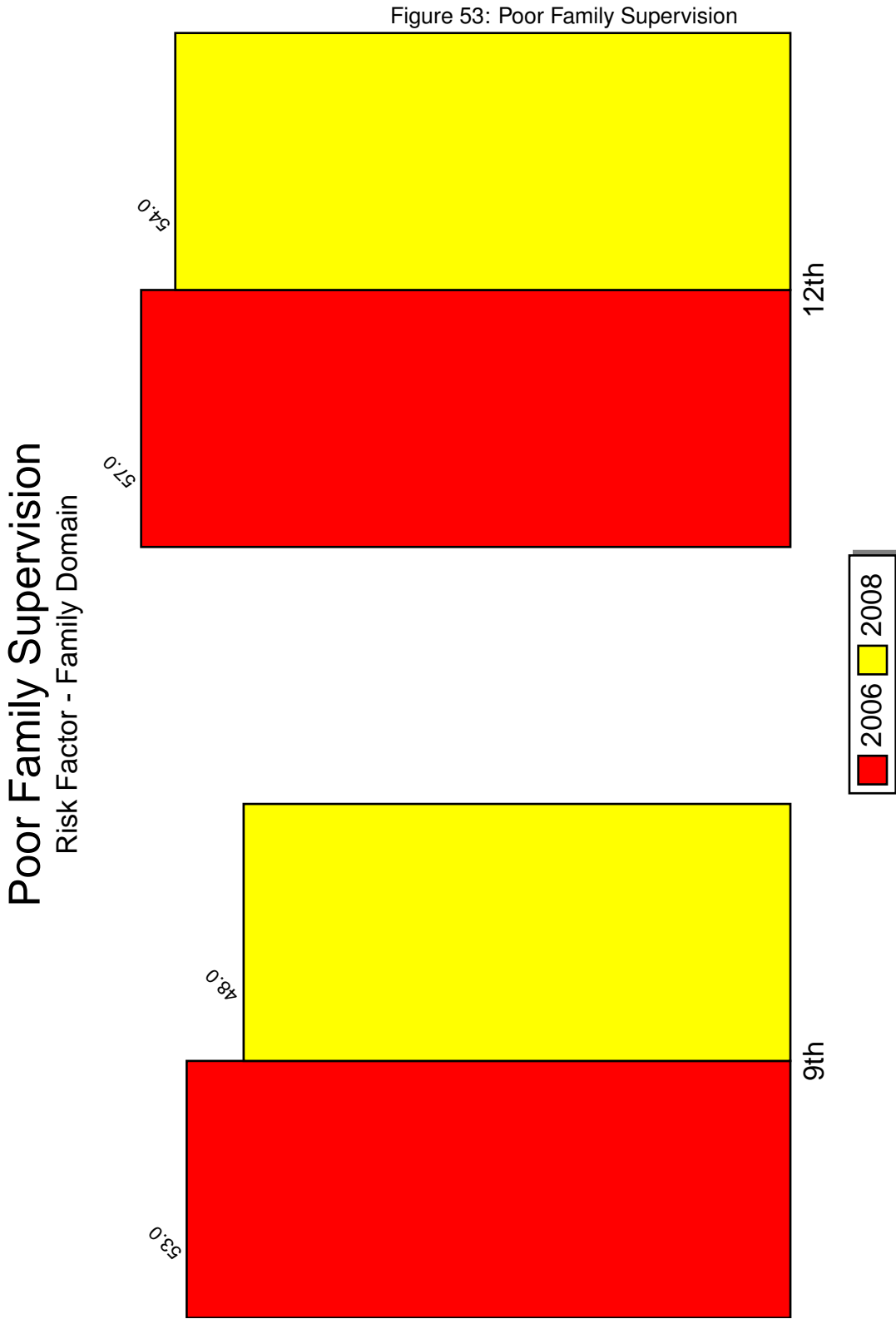
# Perceived Availability of Drugs and Firearms

Figure 52: Perceived Availability of Drugs and Firearms

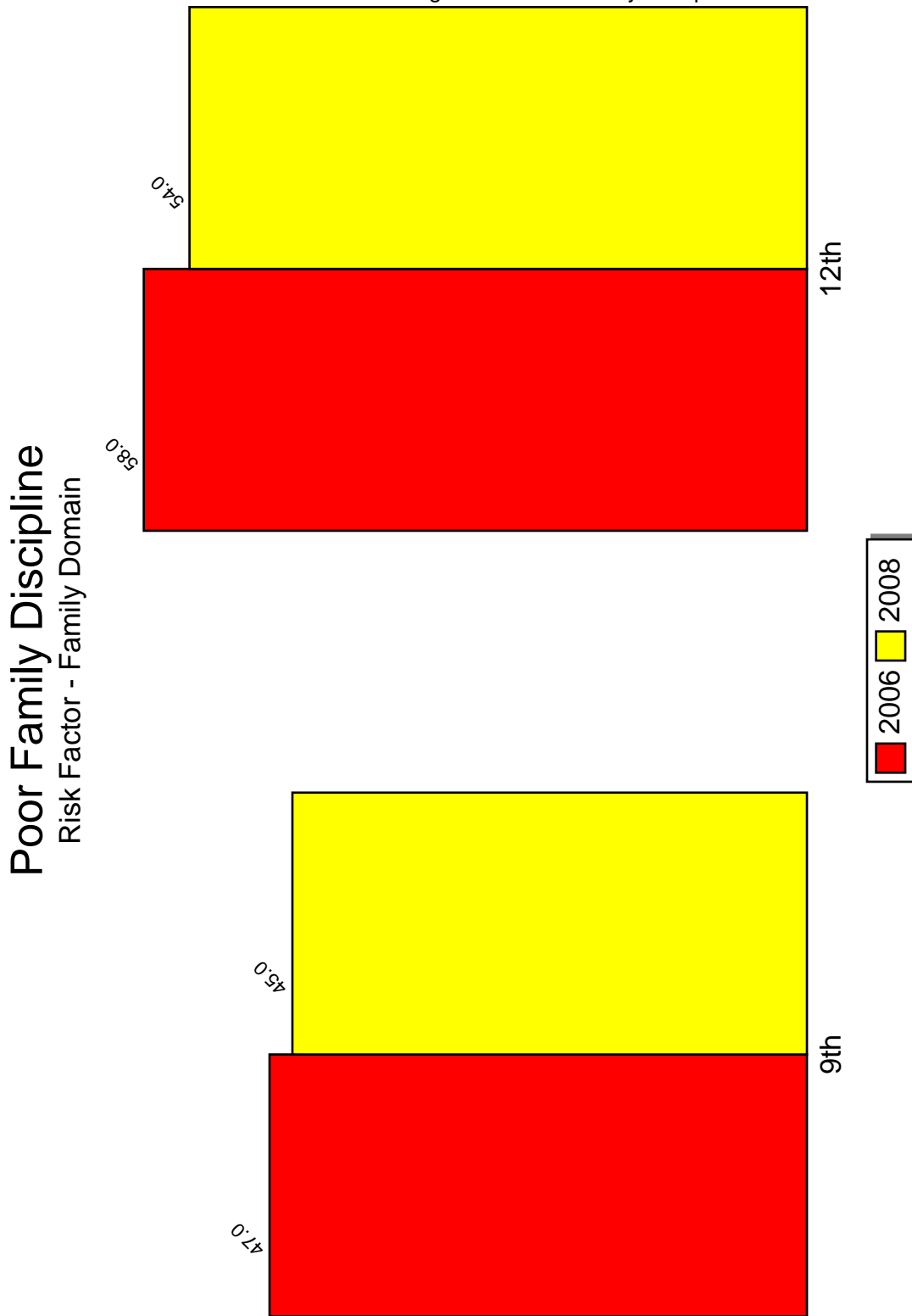

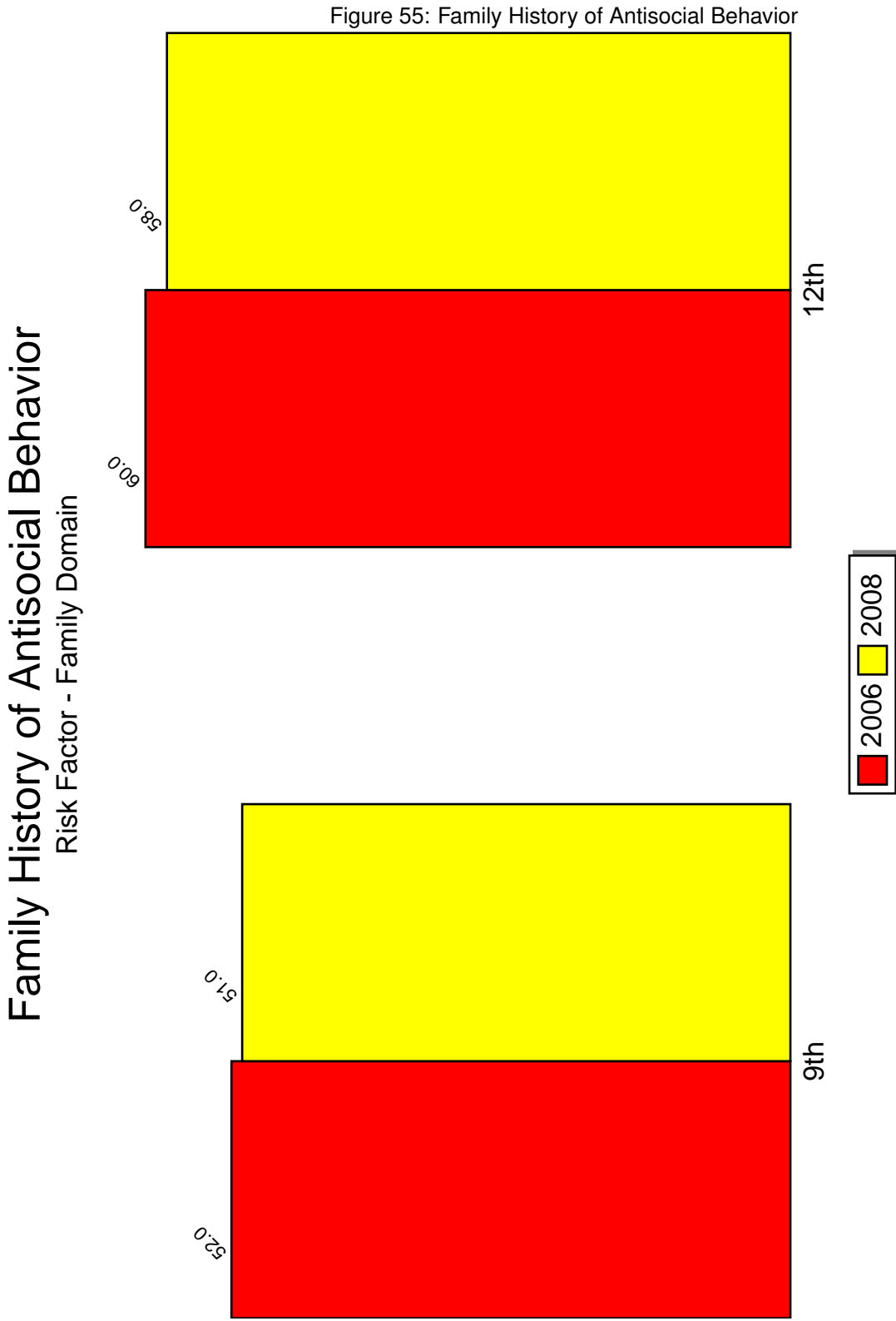

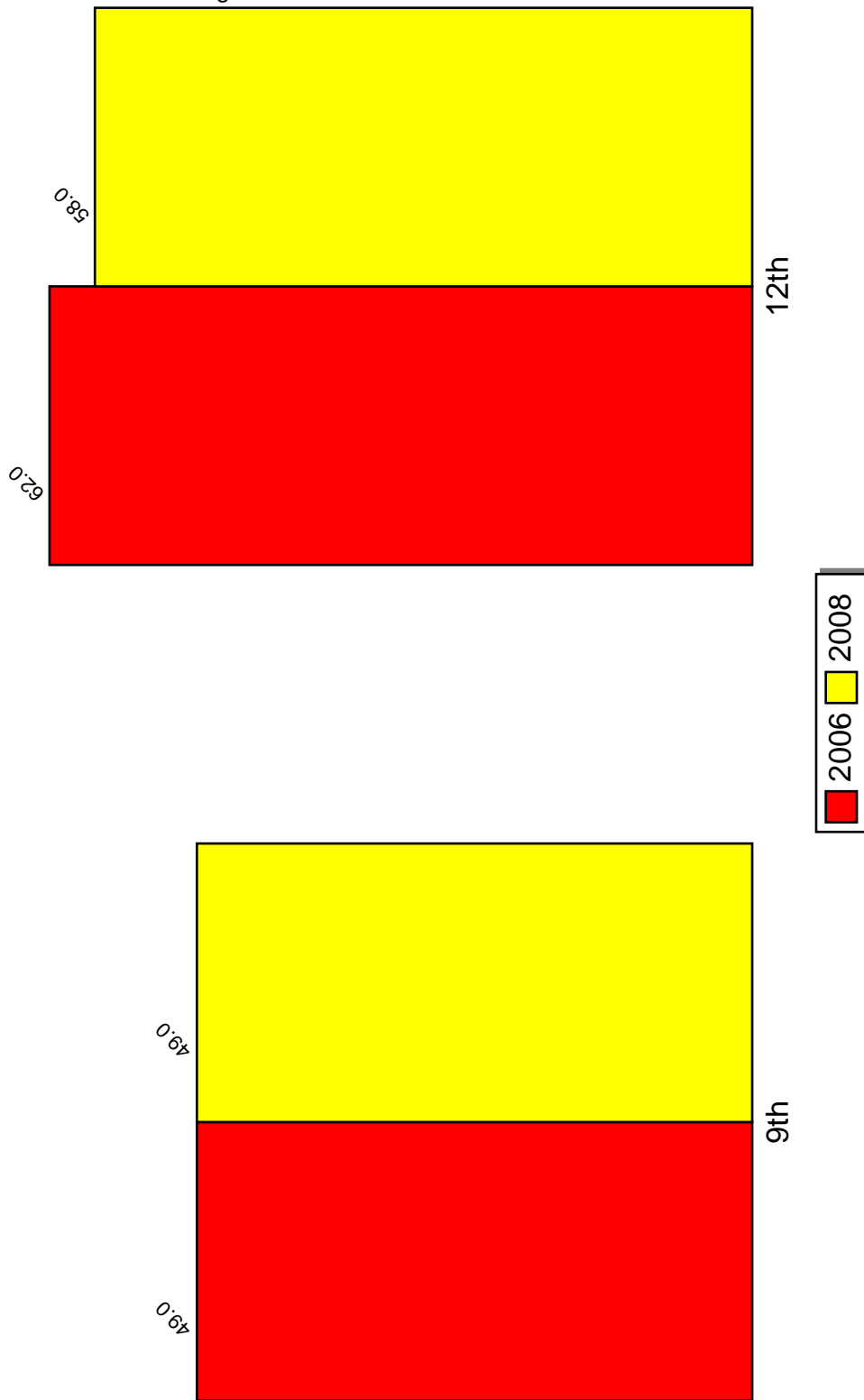

Figure 56: Parental Attitudes Favorable Toward ATOD Use

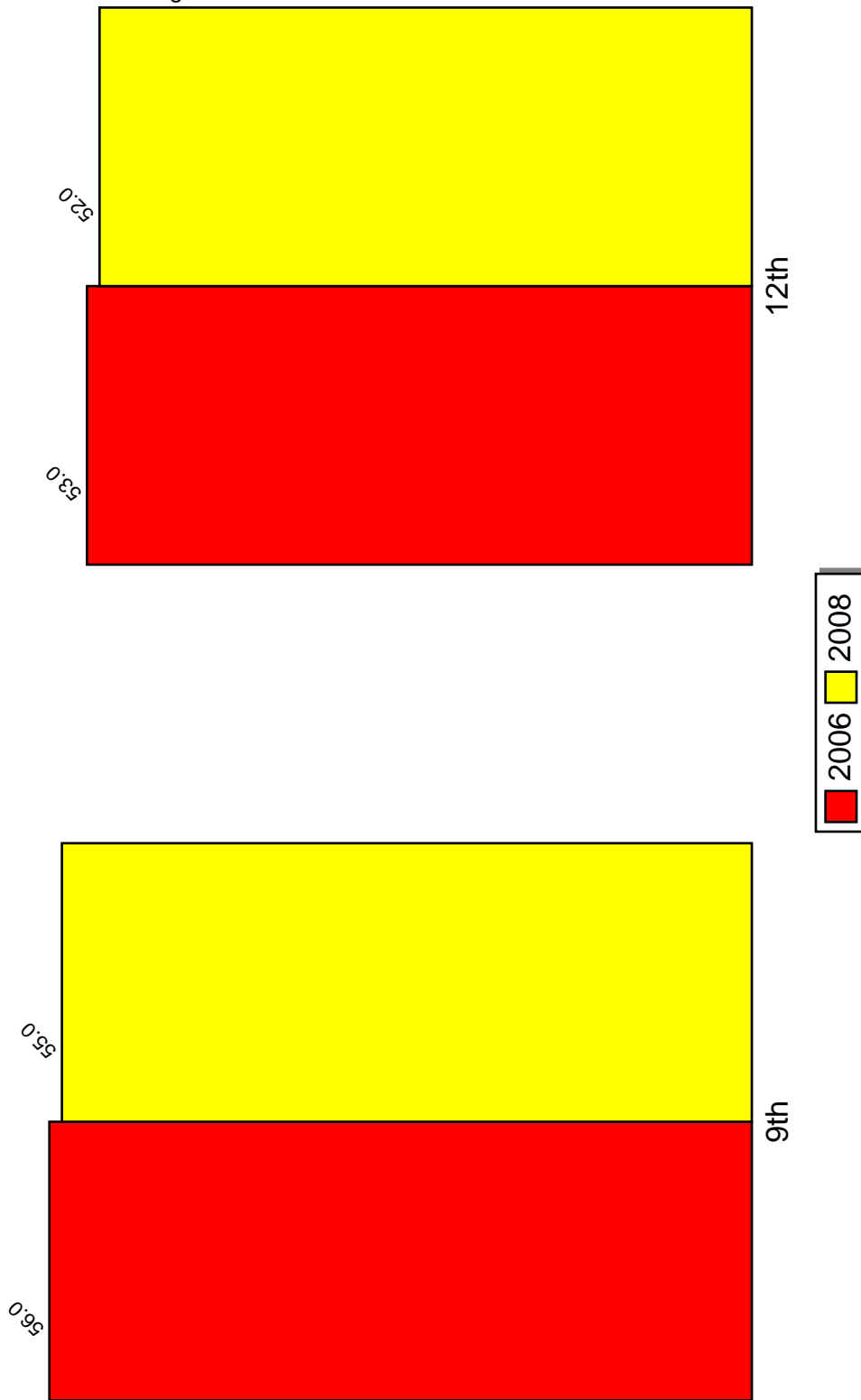

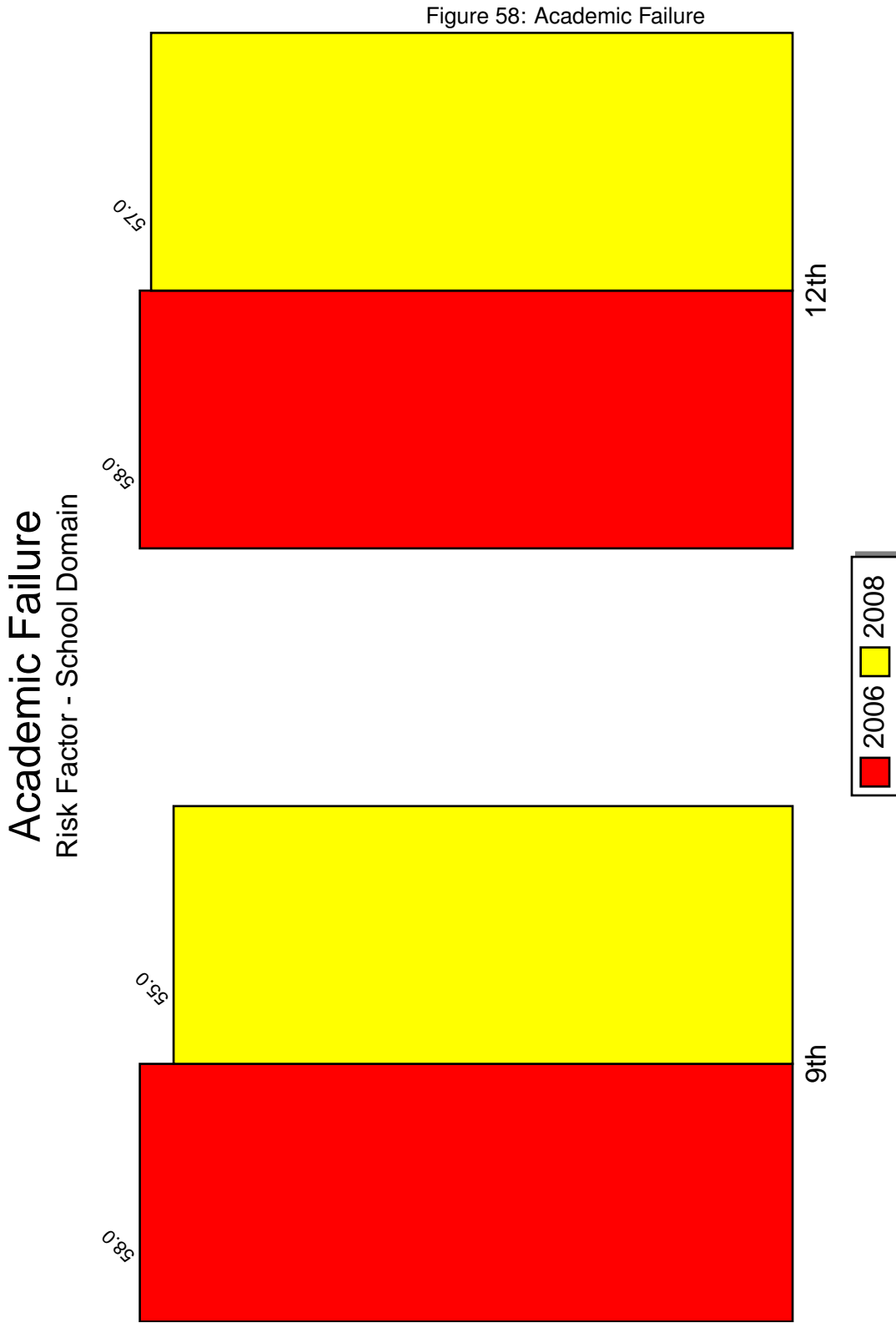
# Parental Attitudes Favorable Toward Antisocial Behavior

Figure 57: Parental Attitudes Favorable Toward Antisocial Behavior

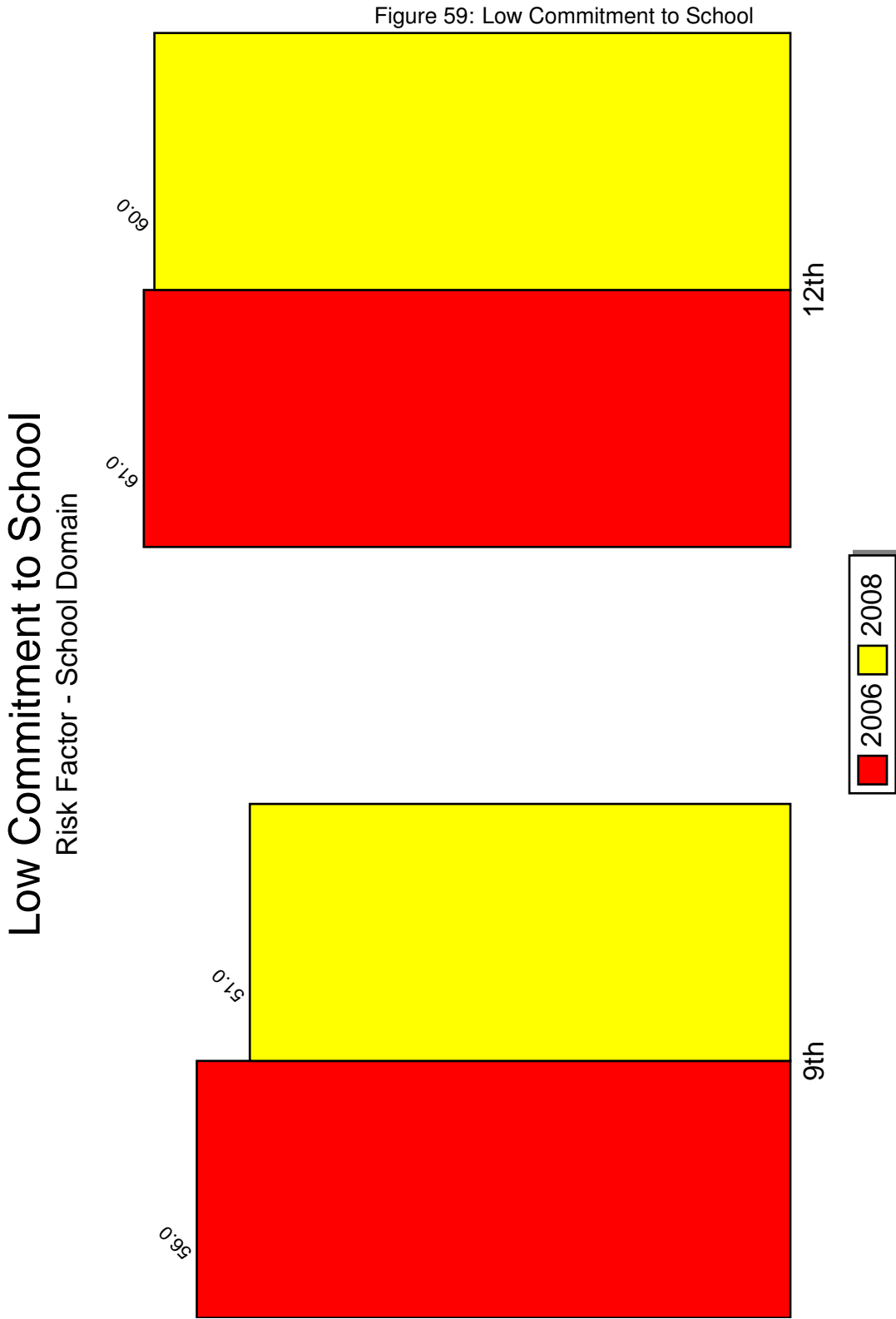

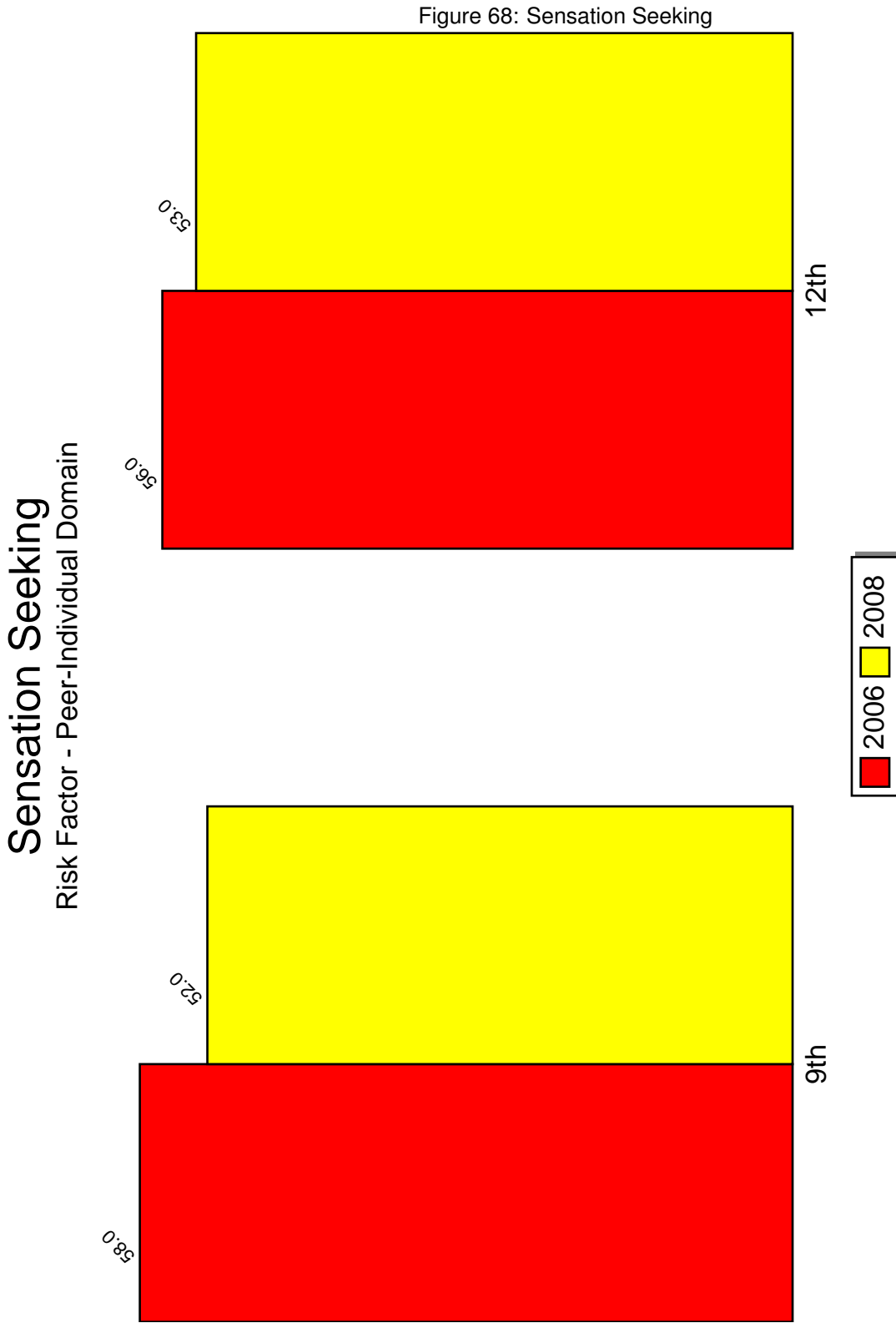
Figure 67: Early Initiation of Drug Use and Antisocial Behavior

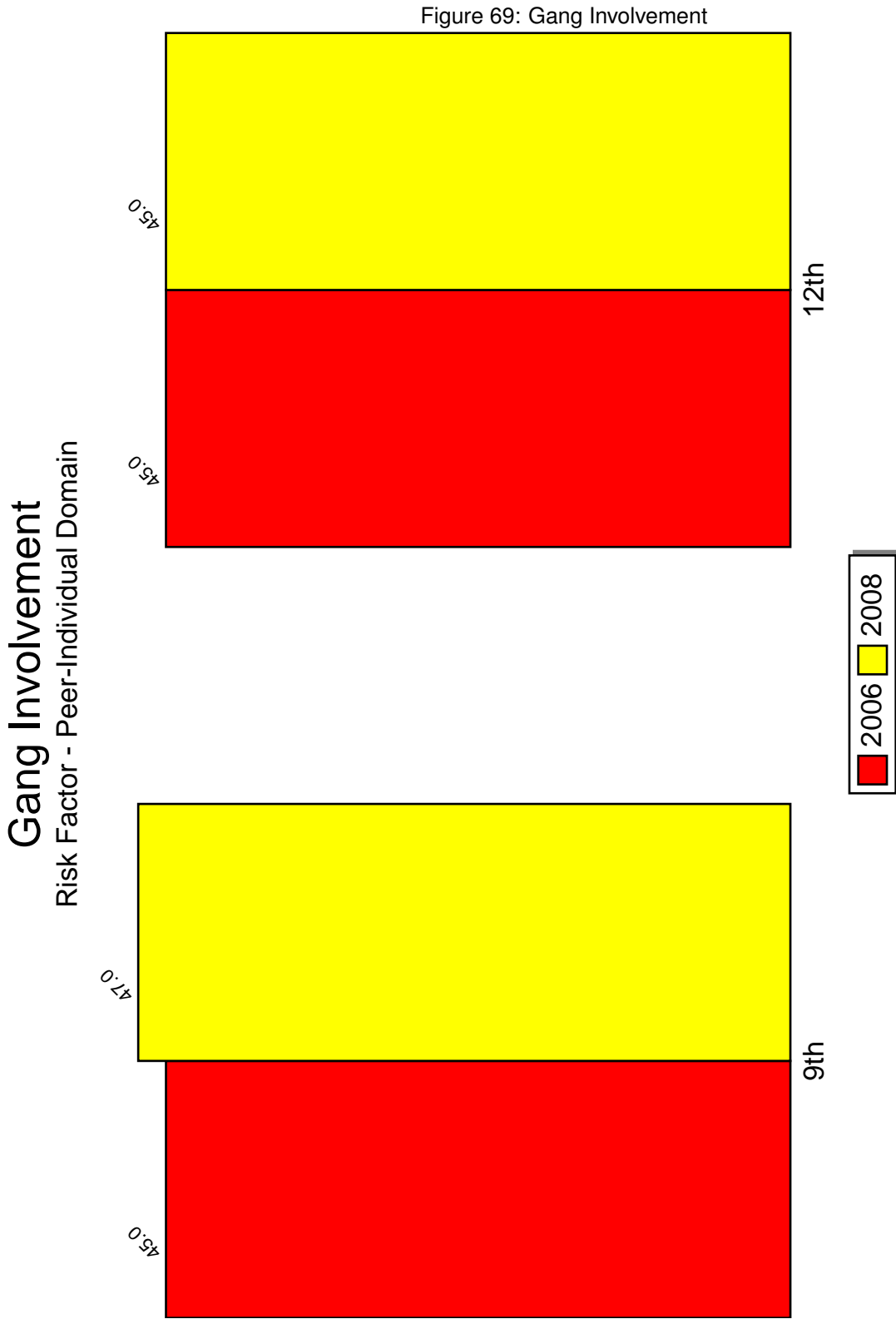
