Until recently, Willie Earthman hadn't seen a doctor in 60 years. That's also how long she has lived in the South Perry neighborhood. Each week she enjoys helping "the elderly". Willie is 101 years young. She was born in Pascagoula, MS on July 13, 1908. Their family owned 40 acres of land and had roots in India.

Willie remembers following her father around from age three until she was twelve years old. He taught her all about construction. "I know how many board feet of lumber it takes to build a house!" she boasts. Although he adored her, her father told her "it wouldn't be proper to keep following him" into her teenage years.

Willie married James Earthman in 1935. They had two children, Arealous ("Ace") and Arnetha (deceased). We are rounding up a classic car for Willie to ride in, for the parade.
