LABRADOR WINS IDAHO'S FIRST CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT

November 3, Boise Raul Labrador defeated Walt Minnick to take back Idaho's First Congressional District with just under 50% of the vote at about 1:30AM Wednesday early morning. Raul's message of fiscal conservatism, government accountability and controlling runaway spending was exactly the recipe the voters of the First Congressional district wanted to hear.
