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# Can You Identify this Person?

??? was a chief of the Spokane Tribe whose long, and ultimately tragic life spanned the fur-trading, missionary, and white settlement eras of the region. His father, also a Spokane chief, sent ??? off with fur traders at age 14 to be educated at the Red River Settlement's missionary school in Canada. ??? returned after five years, fluent in English and French, to



become an influential leader and spokesman for his tribe. He opened a rough school to teach reading and writing and also taught his fellow tribesmen agricultural techniques. He participated in many peace councils, including those of 1855 and 1858, and was known as a steadfast advocate of peace and an equally steadfast advocate of a fair land settlement for his tribe. He never wavered on his insistence that the Spokane people should have the rights to their native lands along the Spokane River, a goal which proved unattainable. His own farm in what is now the *Hillyard* area of Spokane was stolen from him late in life and he and his sadly diminished band were forced to camp in Hangman Valley, where boys from the growing city of Spokane would throw rocks onto their tepees. A kindly landowner allowed ??? and his family to camp in Indian Canyon, where he lived out the rest of his life in poverty. He died there in 1892 and was buried in a pauper's grave. Decades later, a Spokane city park was named after him and a statue erected in his honor.

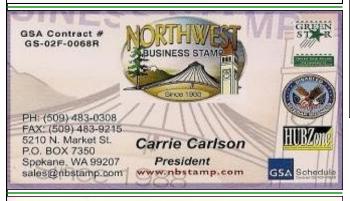

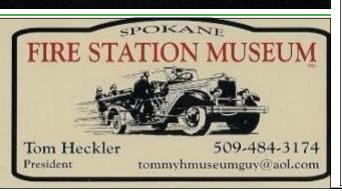

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The two-story Minthorn-Russel Block as an arcaded corbel cornice and is divided into two bays by brick pilasters at the corners. The original storefront configuration is intact with two recessed entrances. A faded advertisement painted in 1903 is

located on the north elevation of the building and reads, "Drugs, Russel Hotel, Rooms for Rent." The building was built for druggist Sherman Minthorn and for merchant Robert Russel with eight single-occupancy hotel rooms on the second floor known as the Russel Hotel. The Hillyard City Drug from 1903 to 1985 occupied the north storefront. The south storefront was occupied by the Buckley Clothes Shop. Beginning in 1935, the Capitol Bar was located in the south storefront, and continues to occupy this space.

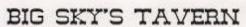

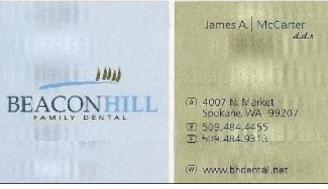

#### **Time Management Tips**

I c. crushed pineapple

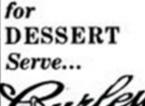

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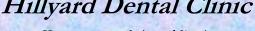
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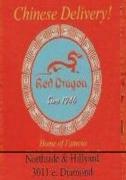




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The Family Treasures Building is a simple, one-story formed concrete block structure with tan brick veneer on the facade, ceramic tile parapet coping, and a two-bay storefront with a recessed entry. For two years from 1948-1950, Tip Top Variety and the Hillyard Donut Shop occupied the



building, and for 51 years from 1950 to 2001, the building housed Family Treasures, a business that specialized in antiques and collectibles. The building replaced the Gordon Motor Company, a service station that previously occupied the building site.

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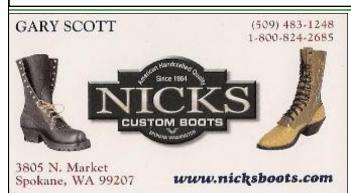
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
