There are plans in the permitting process for ConocoPhillips to ship four loads and Imperial Oil/ExxonMobil to ship more than two hundred oversize loads of equipment from the Port of Lewiston in Idaho, through Northern Idaho and into Montana along non-interstate routes, like U.S. Highway 12 and U.S. Highway 89, taking up two lanes of traffic. Some would be more than two hundred feet long and weigh up to three hundred tons. They would have police escorts and travel only at night from midnight to 6 a.m. The maximum allowed traffic delay would be fifteen minutes. Both sets of shipments would take several days to reach their final destinations.
