Dear Staff,

It has come to my attention that there is a disproportionate spending in the state supplemental capital budget the legislature adopted last week.

My own analysis has shown districts represented by democratic senators whose seats are up for reelection this year received nearly twice as much funding for construction projects as districts served by republican senators whose seats are also up for re-election (below).

In light of this, I request that the non-partisan Senate committee staff investigate whether the disparity in the supplemental 2011-13 capital budget is abnormal, or instead continues a trend concerning capital spending in election years.

Specifically, I'd like you to determine the accuracy of my analysis and produce an analytical comparison of capital budget spending allocation by legislative district over the last 10 election cycles to determine if there is a trend of districts represented by majority party incumbent Senators up for re-election receiving a disproportionate share of project spending.
