Crime Stoppers of the Inland Northwest is offering a cash reward for information on the theft of a bronze statue that was reported to Coeur d'Alene Police on January 18th 2014.

Sometime between Friday night on January 17th and early Saturday morning January 18th, parts of a statue depicting a 1920s-era woman on a bicycle being followed by two dogs were stolen.

The statue entitled "Kate" appeared to have been removed with the use of a vehicle by possibly using a rope or a chain. The matching bronze bicycle the statue was attached to, and a small bronze statue of a dog were not taken but it appeared to officers an attempt was made to steal the entire statue.

Coeur d'Alene Parks Director Steve Anthony estimated the artwork is worth about \$25,000, though if recycled the stolen pieces would be worth much less.
