Idaho Employers Back Challenger Shauna Hillman for Legislature

Wallace, Idaho – Shauna Hillman, challenger for Idaho State Rep. District 7A in the May 20 Republican primary, continues to receive endorsements from Idaho employers in the mining, timber and service industries.
