Demographics rule Democrats

Chicago's Democrat Mayor Rahm Emmanuel made headlines recently when he asked the Obama administration to ship a thousand unaccompanied illegal alien children to his unfair city - although it must be noted that he did not offer to house any of the children in his own home. Naturally, he expects the taxpayers to underwrite his generosity.

Emmanuel's offer is a bit ironic in that we're told that these children are fleeing Central American gang violence. Chicago's murder rate is competitive with Honduras' and, within the small subculture where most of Chicago's violence occurs, it's actually far higher. According to a sociological study, three quarters of Chicago's murders are committed within a subculture that numbers only 175,000. Idaho Republican Gov. C.L. (Butch) Otter made headlines by asking that the Obama administration not burden the taxpayers of his state with babysitting duties. And the illuminati predictably condemned him as a heartless racist.

The millions of illegal aliens who were granted amnesty during the Ronald Reagan administration vote overwhelmingly Democratic. Republicans, who think that they'll earn the everlasting gratitude of this current crop of illegal aliens, might want to consider that.

A recent article in Politico explained how the Democratic Party expects to gain majority status in Texas by 2028 and in Georgia perhaps as soon as this year. The reason for their optimism is not that they're winning the debate. They're winning the migration and reproductive battle in those states.

Democrats are licking their chops as Georgia's African-American and Latino populations rapidly grow. Along with gays and unmarried women, these demographics vote overwhelmingly Democrat. Democrats don't have to persuade anyone. They just have to nurture the grievance culture that flourishes in those demographics to keep them in the fold.
