

Post Falls Police Department activities report – for Aug. 28-29:

Graveyard Shift:

Explosion, Area of South Greensferry Rd

Multiple reports of a loud explosion in the area. Unsure where the origin was. Officers patrolled the area and nothing unusual observed. A short while later KCSO advised they had fireworks reported in the vicinity in KCSO jurisdiction.

Suspicious, Crown Pointe

RP advised a white van with Washington plates was driving in the area without headlights. Officer located the vehicle and found the occupants were Kirby Vacuum salesmen and were finishing an sale. Everything checked out with the occupants of the van.

Suspicious, E Mullan Ave Wal-Mart

Rp reported hearing what they thought to be a “small caliber” pistol shot in the area. Officers checked the area and did not locate anything unusual.

Found Child, CDA Ave

Rp found a 9 year old boy walking the area and thought he may be lost. Officer arrived and contacted the child’s parents who came and took him home. Child was supposed to be going to a friend’s house after being at the park and hadn’t.
