

Post Falls Police Department activities report for Aug. 24-25:

Graveyard Shift:

Mal Injury E White Sands

An individual called and reported that her ex had come to the residence and slashed one of her tires on her vehicle. Ofc Thompson arrived to take photos and take a report.

Agency Assist

Officers and K9 unit Andor assisted CdA Police in the search for a suspect in an armed robbery that occurred on Sherman Ave in Coeur d'Alene. The investigation of this incident is still on going.

Warrant Service E Seltice Way

A male was contacted behind a business, and after running his name through communications it was confirmed that he HAD a warrant through Kootenai County. The male was taken into custody and transported to PSB without incident.

Found Property E Poleline & N Chase

Officers responded to the area after a report from someone of two vehicles in the roadway. Officers arrived and found two bicycles lying in the middle of the road. A report was completed and the bikes were stored at the PFPD.

Swing Shift/Sunday:

K-9 apprehension "Non-bite." Officers responded to E. River Place for a suspicious call, possibly a break in. When officers arrived this house has been in foreclosure for a while and has been a place for juveniles and transients to go. Upon arrival the neighbors advised they could see flashlight movement and called the police. K-9 Officer and PSD Andor entered the house with other officers and gave commands for anyone inside the residence to come out! Upon giving K-9 commands a male exited and said he was sorry and to please not release the dog or hurt him. The male advised he was given permission by another male to stay at the residence. The male was released and at this time there is no paperwork posted on the door and no information on a responsible. I believe this residence is now owned by a bank back east.

Officers responded to a few more verbal domestics, suspicious calls, welfare checks, noise complaints, citizen assist, trespassing calls etc.

Day Shift/Sunday:

Day shift responded to 37 calls for service, including one incident of a Hit & Run at the Riverbend Inn, a citizen dispute in the 1800 block of E 3rd, and a shoplifting at the Walmart on Mullan. The shoplifter had an existing warrant and was arrested on scene.
