Good Morning:

I believe that the Officers had the right to contact the individual to address his presence in the area in light of the circumstances. The initial contact was merely to either confirm or eliminate the individual for additional investigatory contact

The Officer's safety concern was heightened when the individual did not respond appropriately to the Officer's request for contact. The fact that the individual responded by arming himself actually confirmed the Officer's safety concern. Certainly, this would not be an issue if the individual had suddenly reached inside his clothing, picked up a rock a stick, or some other obvious weapon. At that point, the Officer had done nothing other than initiate contact. The Office had not even requested identification before the situation escalated without an obvious reason therefore. The Officer did not know what was unfolding, so he requested compliance for public and officer safety reasons. When the individual declined to appropriately respond to the Officer's repeated requests, the circumstances required a more intensive type of contact. The individual's response to the increased contact by the Officer only made the situation worse because now the Officer's concerns appear to be confirmed with each passing moment.

Each individual in this Country is entitled to walk down the street without being harassed by law enforcement; however, uninstrusive contact as initially occurred herein typically does not precipitate the contacted individual into responding by essentially arming themselves. If the individual had immediately dropped the "weapon" upon request, then the Officer's safety concerns would have been somewhat alleviated. Unfortunately, the individual chose poorly and only

made the situation worse.
