

911 Operator (male): 911 what are you reporting?

Caller (female): I have a pedophile that's been calling my 14 year old daughter and now (undecipherable) he's in our back yard going up to her windows and stuff.

911: Ok, what's the location?

Caller: [REDACTED] East Marie Court.

911: [REDACTED] East Marie Court?

Caller: (undecipherable whispering) bedroom window!

911: Is he coming in?

Caller: (whispering) No, oh my God!

911: What's the phone number you are calling from?

Caller: [REDACTED]

911: [REDACTED]

Caller: (whispering) Yeah, Oh my God! Oh, my God!
Oh, come on, come on!

911: Ok, I am telling the police right now.

Caller: Ok.

911: Stay on the line with me.

Caller: Ok.

911: Your first name?

Caller: Familia

911: Camillia?

Caller: Yeah. (undecipherable) bedroom window.

911: Is he coming in?

Caller: No...I don't know, I shut the door and came back upstairs.

911: Did you say he was crawling in the window?

Caller: No, I shut the door. I had her come out of her bedroom and I shut the door. I saw him go in...

911: Can you get a description of him, is he white male?

Caller: white male, he's very tall, he has on a grey hooded sweatshirt.

911: How old is he?

Caller: Oh, boy...

911: 30s?

Caller: 40's

911: 40s? Ok. Thin, medium or heavy build?

Caller: He's not thin, he's slim, but he's built,

911: Ok

Caller: he's not fat or anything

911: Grey hooded sweatshirt, can you see what color his hair was?

Caller: No, he had a grey hooded sweatshirt on.

911: Ok. Is your backyard fenced?

Caller: No.

911: Are there any dogs back there?

Caller: No. He's on the east side front of the house. Go look over and see if you can see him. Ok, he's going past the window, he's at my husband's truck. I'm looking right at him.

911: Why do you think he's a pedophile?

Caller: He's, I talked to him last night. He's asking me about touching myself, do I feel horny when I kiss my boyfriend, and now he's going to the neighbor, he's across the street at the neighbors.

911: He is now?

Caller: Yeah. He's standing in their, at their (undecipherable) driveway. I am shaking so bad.

911: I am advising police as I am talking to you.

Caller: Ok, he's on Marie Court. He's checking his feet print in the snow. And (undecipherable) back when his feet in the snow.

911: Is the neighbors to the south or east of you?

Caller: It's across the street, south.

911: Across the street, south?

Caller: yeah, he is on Marie Court right in front of my house. He was kicking his footprint in the snow and we did have someone who went halfway to my daughter's bedroom one night and then the tracks stopped.

911: When was that?

Caller: This was, how long do you think that was, when we seen tracks, Dave?

Dave (background): Maybe a month.

Caller: Maybe a month. On January 24th was the first time we received the call from him. And so it was right around that time, right before that. And the tracks stopped and then whoever it was just stopped, so they must have backtracked and walked back, backwards.

911: Ok. What is your middle initial, Mary?

Caller: L

911: And what's your date of birth?

Caller: [REDACTED] Do you see him anymore? He's like, going around the culd-a-sac. He's in a spot where we can't see him right now. He's still in the culd-a-sac, though. Probably, he might just be (undecipherable) close to see where he can break in, I have no idea.

911: And what do you see that makes you certain this is the same male?

Caller: The same male as what?

911: As the one that called, any idea?

Caller: No, I don't.

911: Ok

Caller: But it's just, he walks, I'm watching him, couldn't see me and he walked up to my house, he was up into my kitchen. He stopped and then I kinda like, moved around so he, and I thought he seen me, but he didn't. So he goes and stops in the area, he's looking at the house, he comes into my yard, he's like looking around, I hear whistling (whistles), but he's not looking for a dog. He was up to my patio door downstairs.

911: Ok. Did you (undecipherable) officer contact then?

Caller: Oh, yeah. He's pretending likes he's looking for a dog, but he's not, he went to the bedroom window.

911: Ok, ma'am, I've gotten everything put into dispatch, if anything changes, give us a call back at this number, ok?

Caller: Ok, bye.

911: see you thanks.

New 911 call:

911 Operator (female): 911 what are you reporting?

Caller (female): I have a guy that's like casing houses and stuff and another guy who has been calling my daughter, so I don't know what's going on, he's been all throughout our yard, all throughout our neighbors yard...

911: He's at it right now?

Caller: Yup, he's still doing it.

911: Ok, Ma'am, what's your address?

Caller: [REDACTED] East Marie Court.

911: [REDACTED] East Marie Court. Ok, what's your phone number?

Caller: [REDACTED]

911: [REDACTED] Ok, what...

Caller: Don't let him see you! Don't let him see you.

911: What's his description, Ma'am, what's he look like?

Caller: He's got a white, I thought it was grey, but it's not, it's a, what color is that? A blue, get back!

911: Do you see any weapons?

Caller: No, he's got a blue, light blue jeans on, he has a black jacket...

911: Ok, hold on a second

Caller: Dark blue, right there! That's the person right there.

911: The police are right behind him?

Caller: Yeah, they are getting out. Ok, I can let you go now.

911: Ok, so are they talking to him, or are they...

Caller: The police rolled up on him and got out of the car.
