The undersigned, a law enforcement officer, competent to testify, states as follows: That he/she believes a crime was committed by the above named defendant/defendants in the County of Spokane, State of Washington, because:

On 05-26-15 at 0205 a ~~redacted~~ 911 to report seeing a fire in the area of 20 E. Chattaroy Road, in Spokane County, Washington. Fire Department units were dispatched to the area. They found the residence at 20 E. Chattaroy actively burning and an unattached building on the property fully engulfed.

The residence consisted of a main house which was an off-white one story residence with the "20 E" to the left of the door. There were several outbuildings including a large red shop / garage, two small red sheds, and a the large outbuilding that was fully involved in flame. Also on the property were at least nine vehicles and a metal travel trailer.

Fire units began to actively fight the fire. They forced entry to the locked front door of the residence and began to search for residents. In a bedroom of the residence they found what appeared to be a naked female lying prone on a bedroom floor. They removed the female from the residence and found that she was deceased, this body was later identified to be that of Lisa Canfield. They found that Lisa Canfield had an unknown article of clothing over her mouth and numerous lacerations on her body including on the upper arms. fire fighters later found blood pooling in the bedroom, under where the body had been laying.

The fire personnel noticed that a portion of the residence was on fire and the outbuilding on the property was also fully engulfed with fire. The ground between the two buildings had unburnt items between them, indicating that there were two possible sources of ignition.

Fire Personnel, while attempting to extinguish the fire in the outbuilding filled with hay, found the extremely burnt body of a second person lying in the burning building, this was later identified as the body of Terrance Canfield. The fire was extinguished and the bodies remained on scene.

Fire Personnel summoned Deputies and Detectives from the Spokane County Sheriff's Office, including your Affiant, who responded. The area was surrounded and secured.

Interviews were conducted with Amanda Murry, who lived at 20 E. Chattaroy with her mother, Lisa Canfield, her step father, Terrance Canfield, and her brother John Constable. Amanda Murry told

investigators that she has been living at 20 E. Chattaroy since December of 2014, when she moved out of a house with her estranged husband Roy H. Murry. Prior to the move Amanda had been living in Lewiston, Idaho with Roy Murry. Amanda Murry said that Roy Murry has been becoming increasingly delusional and suffers from Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder from combat injuries suffered by Roy Murry in Iraq, while serving in the U.S. Army. Amanda. Amanda Murry said that her mother Lisa did not like Roy Murry and her step father Terrance Canfield and Roy never got along with one another.

Amanda Murry said that, since she moved out, Roy Murry thought that her family members had been somehow keeping her away from Roy and possibly encouraging the separation. Amanda Murry said that Roy Murry had been to the house on Chattaroy many times before, and occasionally would sneak in the back door and sit in Terrance Canfield's chair. Amanda Murry said that the last time Roy Murry was at 20 E. Chattaroy was on 04-03-15. Amanda Murry said that Roy Murry was still living at 727 9th Avenue apartment #2 in Lewiston, Idaho. Amanda Murry said that Roy Murry drives a black in color 2010 Dodge Caliber with Idaho license plate number N184600. Amanda Murry showed investigators a photograph of the insurance card for this vehicle. Amanda Murry told investigators that Roy Murry owned several firearms including: a Springfield XD handgun; an AR-15 style pistol, which Roy Murry calls "puppy"; a .22 caliber Ruger semi-automatic rifle; several AR-15 style .223 caliber rifles; a Mosin Nagant .30 caliber rifle; and a Remington model 870 shotgun. Amanda Murry told investigators that Roy Murry never touches his ammunition but wipes each round off prior to loading them into a magazine using the same cloth, so that no fingerprints get onto the rounds as he loads them. Roy Murry told Amanda that this helped his ability to "shoot and scoot" which meant he did not leave behind any DNA or fingerprints. Amanda Murry told Detectives that there were numerous firearms inside the residence on Chattaroy road, including a 357 caliber revolver near Lisa Canfield's bed. Amanda Murry also told investigators where to find valuable items and cash stored in the residence, including silver coins and \$3,000.00 cash.

Amanda Murry said that Roy Murry's parents live at [REDACTED] in Walla Walla, Washington and that Roy Murry would have no other reason to be in Walla Walla.

Amanda Murry said that on 11-25-15 at about 1330 to 1400 she received a call from Roy Murry using his Sprint cellular phone (509) 200-9004. Amanda Murry said that she and Roy Murry had a conversation about the upcoming divorce. Amanda Murry said this conversation would have been the first conversation in which it was clear to Roy that the divorce was going to happen. Amanda said that she thought it strange that this conversation with Roy was so "amicable" even though they discussed divorce, because all of their recent conversations had not been amicable. Amanda told investigators that Roy Murry has two cellular phones that he routinely uses; a Sprint cellular phone (509) 200-9004 and an AT&T cellular phone (206) 321-2963.

Amanda Murry told investigators that she works a regular schedule at Sacred Heart Medical Center as a nurse. On the evening of 05-25-15 she was scheduled to work from 1500 to 2330, her normal shift. Amanda Murry said that she would normally leave her house to go work at 1400 and would get home from work at about 0000 or 0030. Amanda Murry said that she drove the same car all of the time and usually parked in the same lot in front of 20 E. Chattaroy. Amanda Murry said it would have been easy for anyone who knows her to see that she was home by finding her car at the residence. Amanda Murry told investigators that Roy Murry was aware of her work schedule and vehicle. Amanda Murry told investigators that while at work on 05-26-14 she was asked to hold over and work longer. Murry texted her mother and told her that she would be working late but did not tell Roy Murry. Amanda Murry last had contact with her mother at about 1930 on 05-25-15 via text and everything seemed fine at the residence. Amanda got off work at about 0338 on 05-26-15, having worked much longer than she had been scheduled to. Amanda Murry drove home and when she arrived at the residence there were fire trucks and police at

the residence. Amanda made a call to Roy Murry, who did not answer. Amanda Murry did not leave a message but at about 0730 she received a call back from Roy Murry, who told her he was in Lewiston.

Amanda Murry said that Roy Murry was the only person who she suspected had any reason to do harm to the residents of 20 E. Chattaroy.

Amanda Murry said that Roy Murry is unemployed and lives off of a military disability from his injuries. Roy Murry brings in about \$1,500.00 to 1,800.00 a month which is deposited in a Chase bank account. Roy Murry likes to use cash for his purchases but possesses and uses a debit card associated with the Chase bank account for withdrawal of cash and purchases. Amanda Murry also said that Roy Murry has a Bank of America credit card that is nearly maxed out.

Amanda Murry said that Roy Murry had on several occasions indicated that he felt her family, including Terrance Canfield and Lisa Canfield, were keeping them from reconciling their marriage. Amanda said that Roy Murry did not like Terrance Canfield and was very bitter toward him as Terrance made Roy follow the "house rules" when he visited the home. Amanda said that Roy Murry had "demonized" her family over the years while speaking to her. She said that Roy Murry had always been resentful toward Lisa Canfield as Lisa had not liked Roy Murry since meeting him. Amanda explained that although Lisa Canfield had taken issue with Roy that she was always very fair and tried to help Roy in various family disagreements. Amanda said Roy had on multiple occasions said he felt like Lisa cared for her family more than him. Amanda said that Roy would see the killing of the family as a loss of her security and love for the most important thing in her life. Amanda explained that Roy would think this would cause her to reconsider ending the marriage and leave Roy Murry as the only person she had for comfort and stability. Amanda said that Roy had told her that her family was a hindrance between the two of them and them having a successful marriage. Roy had on several occasions said he would never come back to the home on East Chattaroy after disagreements with her family. She explained that he would return but that Roy had indicated the family was keeping Roy and Amanda from making their marriage work.

A friend of the family who lives nearby named Vanessa Kaleikini told investigators that she had been at the residence on the evening of 05-25-15 and all seemed fine. Kaleikini told investigators that she suspected that perhaps Roy Murry had something to do with it because he was "psycho" and she also knew Roy Murry had recently been arrested for a weapons violation. Detectives from the Spokane County Sheriff's Office requested and obtained cellular phone records for Lisa Canfield, Terrance Canfield and John Constable. The last outgoing text or call was at 0016 on 05-26-15 from the cell phone of John Constable to Abi Cosgrove, a co-worker. Abi Cosgrove was interviewed and informed investigators that at the time of this text message there were no indications that anything at the residence was amiss.

On 05-26-15 Detective Drapeau was granted a search warrant to search the residence and property of 20 E. Chattaroy. Upon initial search a third body, later identified as that of John Constable, was located in the burned section of the main residence.

Detective Ricketts contacted the Lewiston Idaho Police Department and asked them to check on Roy Murry at his address in Lewiston. Officers of the Lewiston Police Department, including Lt. Bud Hurd, were aware of Roy Murry and considered him anti police. They drove to 727 9th Ave, apartment number 2, and knocked on the door, Roy Murry initially did not answer but eventually came to the door. Roy Murry was not cooperative with the police but did say sometime between 1 and 2pm on May 25, 2015, he went to the Safeway store in Lewiston and purchased a salad using his father's Safeway club card which he ate the salad there and then discarded the receipt in the garbage at Safeway; that he then went to a Vape shop to buy some vapor oil for his E Cigarette, but could not identify the Vape shop he went to; that he then went home; that he had seen a missed call from his wife that came in around 430 am on 05-26-15; and he returned her call from his residence at 0700 hours; that Murry never mentioned he had gone camping over night with friends.

Lewiston Idaho Police saw the black 2010 Dodge caliber of Roy Murry parked at the apartment complex.

Detective Drapeau checked the criminal history and found that Roy Murry had been arrested in 2010 for firearms and dangerous weapons.

Investigators from the Spokane County Sheriff's Office and Spokane County Fire Departments continued to search the residence and property at 20 E. Chattaroy.

A specially trained K-9 was used on the burned areas of the residence and alerted to the presence of accelerants. Investigators also found that portions and items inside the barn and residence had the odor of gasoline on or around them.

Fire investigators found and collected the plastic top from a standard road flare, which was located in the front yard of the house. It did not appear that this plastic flare cap had been there long. The white cap to the road flare top was gone and it appeared something had been scrapped across the striker plate. Fire investigators also found what appeared to be the remains of a burned road flare in the burned portion of the residence.

The three bodies were removed from the residence and autopsies were performed by the Spokane County Medical Examiner's Office.

Investigators found seven .22 caliber cartridge cases in the main residence, all of the cartridges were Remington brand, rim fire .22 caliber cartridge cases. There were no other Remington brand 22 caliber cartridges found in the residence. There were no road flares, consistent with the road flare cap, found on the property.

The silver coins and \$3,000.00 cash were recovered from the bedroom of Amanda Murry. According to accounts from the family including Amanda Murry, most items of value, including firearms appeared to still be in the residence with the exception of one item. Amanda Murry indicated that Roy Murry had given her a firearm which was kept in the home on her bed. She indicated that Roy Murry had worn this firearm on his ankle regularly until the time she moved from their shared residence to her parents' home at 20 E. Chattaroy Rd. She indicated she had taken it with her. This item was not located in the home.

Spokane County Medical Examiners conducted the post mortem examinations of Terrance Canfield, Lisa Canfield, and John Constable.

Medical Examiners found that Terrance Canfield's body was burned and charred with some of the limbs consumed by fire. Medical Examiners determined that the cause of Terrance Canfield's death was multiple gunshot wounds. At least one bullet was recovered from the body and it was consistent with a .22 caliber. Medical Examiners determined that Terrance Canfield was deceased before his body was burned and they ruled the manner of Terrance Canfield's death a homicide.

Medical Examiners found that Lisa Canfield suffered from at least five gunshot wounds. Five bullets were recovered from her body. All of these were consistent with .22 caliber. Medical Examiners determined the cause of Lisa Canfield's death to be multiple gunshot wounds and the manner of her death to be homicide.

Medical Examiners found that John Constable suffered from multiple gunshot wounds. Four bullets were recovered from the body of John Constable. Medical Examiner's determined that the cause of John Constable's death was multiple gunshot wounds, and the manner of his death was homicide.

Ryan Constable, the brother of John Constable and Amanda Murry, was interviewed. He told investigators that he knows Roy Murry and that Roy Murry is an apocalypse "prepper" and knows that Roy has associates that he trains and preps with. Several years ago Ryan Constable was with Roy Constable in the area of Garden Spot Road in Washington. He and Roy Murry went to a residence in the area that Roy Murry described as his training area and storage. The home was owned by a male who was running for

Stevens County Sheriff at the time. At that time Kyle Constable saw Roy in possession of a firearms sounds suppressor for a pistol. Kyle has also seen Roy Murry in possession of one other sound suppressor.

Detective Drapeau applied for and was granted a search warrant for the cellular phone records of both Roy Murry's cellular phones including location information. He executed that search warrant with Det. Keyser and examined the results. Investigators found in the cellular phone records for (509) 200-9004, that an outgoing call was made from this phone on 05-25-15 at 1341. This call activated a cellular tower in the Lewiston, Idaho area. An incoming call was made to this phone on 05-26-15 at 0438 by Amanda Murry which lasts only 25 seconds. This call activated a cell tower in the Lewiston, Idaho area. An outgoing call was made from this phone to the cell phone Amanda Murry on 05-26-15 at 0741. This call activated a cellular tower in the Lewiston, Idaho area. Between the above calls there is no location information available.

Detective Drapeau knows that the drive time between Colbert and Lewiston, Idaho is just over two hours, but can be shorter based on speed and traffic conditions, which are ideal at 0200 to 0400.

Detective Keyser found that records from the other cellular phone of Roy Murry (206) 321-2963 showed that on 05-25-15 at 1740 the phone received a call in the Lewiston, Idaho area. And on 05-26-15 at 0439 the phone received a call in the Lewiston, Idaho area. There were no calls between these two calls but there were ten accurate GPS locations that are generated by the phone and are not tied to the cellular calls logged between these two times. All of these GPS vary in accuracy, and are in the greater Lewiston, Idaho area.

On 05-27-15 Det. Keyser with the Spokane County Sheriff's Office called Roy Murry at (509) 200-9004. Det. Keyser told Roy Murry he would like to meet with, and interview, him. Roy Murry appeared to be cooperative and Roy Murry set up a meet at a business in Pullman, Washington. Roy Murry called and cancelled this meeting. A second meet was arraigned at a business in Spokane, Washington. Roy Murry called and cancelled this meeting as well. A Third meeting was arraigned at a business in Pullman, Washington. Roy Murry called to cancel this meeting. A fourth meeting arraigned at a business in Moscow, Idaho. Roy Murry met with Det. Keyser and Sgt. Marske at the business in Moscow, Idaho. Roy Murry was seen driving his black 2010 Dodge caliber, which he parked in an adjacent business lot to avoid being seen driving it.

Det. Keyser interviewed Roy Murry in Moscow Idaho regarding the incident; Roy said that he had been in Lewiston Idaho on 05/25/15 and had gone camping with friends in the Pullman area near a river. Roy Murry told Det. Keyser that he left for the camping trip in the late afternoon and returned from camping around sunrise on 05/26/15. When Det. Keyser questioned Roy Murry about his friends Roy Murry indicated he would not tell Det. Keyser who he camped with or provide contact information for these people because they were involved in the intelligence community and would not speak with law enforcement. Roy Murry told Detectives that he left both his cellular phones at his apartment in Lewiston while he was away camping. Roy Murry also told investigators that he purchased gas that day for his vehicle and described the location of the gas station.

During the interview Roy Murry allowed Detective Keyser and Sgt Marske to inspect his hands and arms for injuries. Det. Keyser and Sgt. Marske saw that Roy Murry had an approximately quarter inch abrasion on the upper left inside bicep that had bruising around it and appeared to be fresh. Roy Murry told Detective Keyser that he thought that injury was from a bush. Det. Keyser and Sgt. Marske saw that Roy Murry had an approximately quarter inch to one half inch abrasion on the palm of the right hand. Roy Murry told Det. Keyser that he possibly did this with a knife. Det. Keyser and Sgt. Marske

also saw that Roy Murry also had a three to four inch scratch on the right forearm. All of the injuries appeared to be recent. In addition to these injuries Sgt. Marske noticed that Roy Murry's face had some uneven redness similar to a sunburn or flash-burn. Photographs of Roy Murry were taken. During the interview Roy Murry told Det. Keyser that had missed a call from Amanda Murry at about 0440 on 05-26-15 because he was sleeping. This contradicted his statement that he had been camping without phones until sunrise on 05-26-15. This interview was recorded and several times during the recording Murry indicated he did not want to answer questions about who could have committed this crime while the recording was going; After the recording was turned off Roy Murry told Det. Keyser and Sgt. Marske that he had earlier been recruited by the Russian Secret Police known as the FSB but rejected this recruitment and that it was possible the FSB was involved in this crime. Roy Murry made statements that indicated law enforcement would never catch them if they had been responsible.

A Washington DOL Firearms purchase check showed that Roy Howard Murry currently owes the following firearms: a Taurus .38 caliber pistol; a Glock .22 caliber pistol, serial number PRL846 (your Affiant is not aware of a .22 caliber glock pistol manufactured as a .22 caliber, but there are .22 caliber conversions made and used in other Glock models including the Glock model 22 your); a Glock 9mm pistol; a Heckler & Koch 9mm pistol; a Hi-Point 9mm pistol; a Bersa .380 caliber pistol; a Magnum Research .50 caliber pistol; the frame for a tactical solutions pistol; a Glock .40 caliber pistol; three Springfield Arms 9mm pistols; a Kel-tec 9mm pistol; an unknown brand 9mm pistol; a Beretta 9mm pistol; and a Colt 32-20 caliber revolver. This database does not usually contain all handguns owned by persons in Washington State and does not include rifles.

On May 28, 2015, Detective Ricketts began background investigation into Roy Murray. During that investigation he spoke with BATF Special Agent Todd Smith, Bonner County Deputy Jason Davis, other regional law enforcement Officials from Washington and Idaho, and Mental Health Professionals from Spokane County Mental Health. Detective Ricketts was informed of many previous reports regarding Roy Murray and his delusional and paranoid behavior. Detective Ricketts also learned that Murray had been in combat in Iraq and was injured during it, that he was treated by the VA and subsequently became addicted to opiates. During one of the investigations in Bonner County in April 2015 that Deputy Jason Davis conducted, a citizen of Bonner County had become romantically involved with Murry and had broken off the relationship. That same citizen did not want to have face to face contact with Murry anymore and turned Murry's personal property over to Deputy Davis who put it on police property for safekeeping. Deputy Davis told Detective Ricketts that he has training in the identification of materials and devices used to make improvised explosive devices, and some of the property he collected and placed on property during this incident could be used to make pressure switches and remote triggers for explosive devices. Some of Murry's property included several prepaid cell phones (remote triggers), several laptops, motel keys with aluminum foil and wires wrapped around them (pressure switches), body armour, ammunition of assorted calibers to include a large amount of .22 caliber rim fire ammunition. Deputy Davis reported that he had to return the property to Murry on May 19, 2015.

Det. Keyser reviewed the Facebook.com profile for Roy Murry and found that on 05/25/15 at about 0743 hours Roy Murry had posted three songs to his profile. One song was a Spanish song called "Gasolina" which Keyser knows to be Spanish for gasoline, these songs lyrics were reviewed after translation and contained lyrics such as "They have to be prepared because what is coming will be to beat them" and "...I already know that you won't quit, What I like is that you allow to be controlled, All the weekends she goes out to have fun, My cat doesn't stop" and "She likes the gasoline, give me more gasoline." The second song posted near the same time was titled "Face Everything and Rise." The last of the three songs posted was titled "Revolution; Revolution contained lyrics such as " Can you see it? The worst is over, the monsters in my head are scared of love, fallen people listen up, it's never too late to change our luck"

As of the time of this Facebook posting no information had been released to the family, media or outside agency, that accelerants were used, located, or identified as possible gasoline.

On 05/28/2015, at 2240 hours, a male wearing dark clothes was seen within the boundaries secured by police on the premises of the crime scene at 20 E. Chattaroy, which for the evening was devoid of Detectives who were responding the next morning to continue search efforts at the scene. The residence at 20 E. Chattaroy was still condoned off and designated a police crime scene. When spotted, the male fled the scene on foot. Deputies gave chase but lost the suspect in the wooded area South of the residence. The Deputy who gave chase described the male as about 6-02" and 130-140 pounds, this description is accurate for the size of Murry.as he was described and photographed by Detectives on 05-27-15. The subject was not located. Upon Detective Keyser's arrival after to the scene after responding from his residence he requested GPS location of Roy Murry's Phone from the cellular provider. Keyser learned that Murry's phone had a GPS location in the area of Haven at Grace Street in Spokane Washington

Detective Keyser contacted Lewiston Police Department and had them check the residence of Roy Murry at 727 9th Ave, apartment number two. Roy Murry's vehicle was not located in the area and they Lewiston Police received no answer at his door after repeated attempts.

On 05/30/15 Detective Drapeau located a residence directly South of the victim residence that was vacant and listed for sale. This residence would allow access to the south side of the victim residence with raw land between the two. Drapeau found a strand of barbed wire strung across the drive to the home. The wire appeared to have been cut and hooked together. Drapeau spoke with the listing relator who indicated the location had been secured with a lock and chain/cable preventing access. Drapeau spoke to neighbors in the area who had noted that on Saturday, 05/23/15, the chain/cable was no longer preventing access and was replaced with a strand of barbed wire.

On 05/30/15 Detective Keyser called Roy Murry and spoke with him and explained he had further questions for him. He asked Murry if he would be willing to talk to him for a 2<sup>nd</sup> interview. Murry said he was in Lewiston Idaho and would travel to Spokane to be interviewed. Roy Murry contacted Detective Keyser at the Spokane Public Safety Building. A recorded interview was completed with Roy Murry. Murry was told he was free to leave, and did not have to answer any questions and it was confirmed that he came to the PSB on his own accord during this interview. Murry's first objective was to tell Detective

Keyser about a female that he had dated/worked with, he identified her as Hailey Gentry was in danger as a possible "loose end" for the suspects who had committed the murders of Terri Canfield, Lisa Canfield and John Constable. He went on to explain that he believed the Russian secret police, FSB, was involved in the murders. He told Keyser he believed Hailey Gentry to be a DEA agent or operative. Murry went on to explain that he believed the Russian FSB was involved and would be targeting Gentry. Murry said he had information obtained from a police scanner that a black Dodge Caliber with Idaho license plate had been seen near the crime scene. He said that Amanda Murry may have targeted him and indicated she or Lisa Canfield was involved in this intelligence and his recruitment he believed. Murry indicated he had worked for the CIA.

During the interview Murry was asked how this crime would have occurred. Murry used a map and drew two circles around the victim residence he indicated the suspects would have entered from about these locations and had a "safe house" and would have approached the victim residence from the South. Keyser noted that these circles encompassed the vacant home for sale South of the residence that Detective Drapeau had located and found the gate removed from. When Murry was asked why the suspects would have burned the home he indicated that it would be done to destroy evidence or for intimidation purposes. He went on to explain the killers would not have handled their brass cartridges due to fingerprints and would have used gloves. He said the killers would have brought gasoline with them and not depended on gas being present at the home.

During the interview Murry continued to claim he was camping on the evening of 05/25/15 through the morning of 05/26/15 with persons he refused to identify. Murray was asked to show Detective Keyser his routes to and from his campsite in the Wawawai area near Pullman Washington. Murry first said a total of four others plus he went camping together. His first statement was he went out later than the others to the camping location and arrived last. During continued conversation he said he traveled from Lewiston up the river to the camping location. As the interview continued he then said he drove from Moscow Idaho to Palouse Washington where a friend joined him and they traveled to Pullman Washington and were joined by others prior to going to the camp site. He did not correct any of these statements and appeared to have inadvertently changed his travel during his recollection to Detective Keyser. During this interview he indicated he had been drinking alcohol during this camping trip, this was in direct contrast to his interview on 05/27/15 with Detective Keyser. During that interview he indicated he did not drink alcohol

Murry said that during the time the Dodge Caliber was seen near the crime scene, referring to the police radio traffic, that he was with his friend "Bobby". Keyser was aware that this information was broadcast on 05/28/15 at about 2240 hours when a suspect had breached the crime scene. Murry provided information to locate "Bobby" but indicated he would not verify his alibi as he was involved in the intelligence community as well.

Detective Simmons was requested to locate and speak with "Bobby" where Murry claimed he was located during the crime scene breach. Simmons did locate this subject and interview him. He indicated that he did know Murry and had not seen him for months prior to 05/26/15 at about 6:30pm. He said Murry stopped by his home but stayed in his car. He said Murry told him on 05/26/15 that 3 persons had been




killed in a fire and police believed he was involved. He denied seeing Murry since that time. This was prior to any law enforcement contact with Roy Murry.

Detective Drapeau had previously written a search warrant to search the person of Roy Murry and Murry's 2010 Dodge Caliber which he drove to the Spokane PSB. This warrant was signed by a Spokane Superior Court Judge. The warrant was executed on both. During the search of the vehicle Detective Rickets located a Walther P22 semi-automatic handgun inside the car. This firearm had no magazine with it. The gun had a "threaded barrel" that is commonly used to attach a silencer to suppress the report of the firearm when firing. Detectives also found a box of .22 caliber Remington brand cartridges in the vehicle. This ammunition was similar to those casings at the crime scene. Forensic Personnel were utilized to search for trace blood within the car. Stains which presumptively tested positive as blood were located on the driver's side floor mat as well as in the passenger area of the vehicle.

Roy Murry was arrested for 3 counts of 1st Degree Murder with a firearm and booked into Spokane County Jail on 05/30/15 for those charges.
