Kootenai County, Idaho – The Kootenai County Sheriff's Office is continuing to partner with the Idaho Transportation Department – Office of Highway Safety to reduce the number of deaths on Idaho roadways through traffic enforcement.

From August 26 to September 5, 2016, the Sheriff's Office participated in an Impaired Driving Campaign – focused on drivers impaired by alcohol and/or drugs. The following are the results from the eleven day enforcement campaign:
