Classroom Discussion Questions College Level

Different Paths to Success: The article features students who found purpose through sports, clubs, or the arts—and others who chose not to participate in those activities. How can schools support both types of students? What does this tell us about the different ways students define success and connection?

Getting Involved After the Pandemic: Why do you think joining clubs, sports, or other activities has helped students feel more connected to school after the pandemic? Do you think being involved in something outside of class is important? Why or why not?

Sharing Who You Are: One student in the article talked about how joining clubs helped her share her culture with others. Why is it important to have places at school where students can show who they are and where they come from?

Different Ways to Be Successful: Some students in the article joined lots of activities, while others focused mostly on schoolwork. What are some ways schools can help all students feel supported, no matter how they choose to be involved?
