Classroom Discussion Questions College Level

Visibility and Value of Labor: The article underscores the essential yet often invisible role of farm workers in sustaining the food system. How does society's disconnection from agricultural labor reflect broader issues of class, privilege, and consumption?

Ethics and Accountability: Given the persistent issues of low wages, unsafe conditions, and limited rights in farm labor, what ethical obligations do consumers, corporations, and governments have in addressing systemic exploitation within the agricultural industry?

Immigration, Policy, and Power: Much of America's agricultural workforce consists of immigrant laborers. How do current immigration and labor policies shape the economic vulnerability of these workers, and what policy reforms could create a more equitable and sustainable agricultural labor system?

Classroom Discussion Questions Grades 9-12

Essential Labor and Recognition: The article highlights the hard work and challenges faced by farm workers. Why do you think this kind of essential labor often goes unnoticed or underappreciated, even though it plays a vital role in our food system?

Working Conditions and Fairness: Many farm workers face difficult conditions for low pay. What responsibilities do consumers, companies, or governments have to ensure fair treatment and safe working environments for them?

Immigration and Opportunity: The piece touches on the connection between immigration and agricultural labor. How do immigration policies affect the lives and opportunities of farm workers, and what changes—if any—do you think could improve their circumstances?

Classroom Discussion Questions Grades 6-8

Important Work: Farm workers help grow and pick the food we eat every day. Why do you think their jobs are so important but not always recognized or appreciated?

Fair Treatment: Some farm workers work long hours in tough conditions. What do you think would make their jobs safer and fairer?

People and Opportunity: Many farm workers come from other countries to find jobs. How can we make sure everyone who helps feed our communities is treated with respect and given good opportunities?

Growing Our Food: Farm workers help plant and pick the food we eat. Why is their work important?

Fairness and Kindness: Farm work can be very hard. How can we make sure the people who grow our food are treated kindly and fairly?
